9-25-2012 Board Action Highlights

Below are excerpts from the **September 25, 2012 Board of Supervisors** meeting that may be of interest to you as a Hunter Mill District constituent. ACTION ITEMS

Action 4: Approval of the FY 2013-14 State Performance Contract between the Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board and the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services. This is the contractual mechanism used by the State to receive \$40,561,032 in state controlled funds to the CSB. This is \$2,832,636 or 7.5% greater than the FY 2012 annual contract amount of state-controlled funds, largely attributable to the estimated revenues from Medicaid State Plan Option in the CSB's FY2013 Adopted Budget.

Action 6: Approval of the distribution of plain English information statements for the November 2012 County Referenda on Issuing Bonds for Improvements to Park, Public Safety, Public Library, and Storm Drainage Facilities. Staff plans to make these explanatory statements available at County polling places for absentee voters prior to the referendum and for all other voters on Election Day.

BOARD MATTERS introduced by Supervisor Hudgins

Walk teams from South Lakes and Herndon High School will be invited to the Board for their participation in Reston Interfaith's Walk for the Homeless events to support the effort to end homelessness in the communities.

Representatives from the **Initiative for Public Art-Reston (IPAR)** and the **Reston Historic Trust** will be invited to the Board to be recognized for their efforts to celebrate the story of community through art.
