6-4-2013 Board Action Highlights

Below are excerpts from the **June 4, 2013 Board of Supervisors** meeting that may be of interest to you, as a Hunter Mill District constituent. For additional details, please go to the County's [Board Agenda and Meeting Schedule](#) section on the County's webpage.

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 3: The Board authorized a public hearing on September 24th, to amend the County Code to allow **temporary family health care structures**, (also known as “granny pods”.)

Admin 5: The Board authorized advertising for a public hearing to change the Fairfax County Code, extending **real estate tax exemption for solar energy equipment** to 10 years.

Admin 7: The Board authorized the Department of Family Services to apply for and accept grant funding from the Virginia Department of Social Services, for the implementation of the **Quality Rating and Improvement System** for early care and education programs.

Admin 8: The Board authorized advertising for a public hearing on July 9th regarding changes to the County Code covering **titling and registration of mopeds and low-speed vehicles**. The changes also make all-terrain vehicles, off-road motorcycles and mopeds subject to the motor vehicle sales and use tax.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 1: The Board approved **revisions to the Fairfax Connector Service** supporting Phase 1 of the Metrorail Silver Line. Changes include discontinuation of routes 595 and 597, which will be replaced by a new Route 599 that provides express bus service to the Pentagon and Crystal City. A decision, on Route 432 serving the north Vienna/Old Courthouse area, will be considered by the Board at the end of July.

Action 2: The Board approved the **Northern Virginia Law Enforcement Mutual Aid Agreement of 2013** between Fairfax County Police Department and other law enforcement agencies in the Northern Virginia area. The agreement provides police aid across jurisdictional boundaries in certain emergencies, increasing the ability of locals governments to promote public safety and protect the general welfare of the citizens.

Action 4: The Board approved a letter transmitting its recommendations and concerns regarding the proposed allocations to the interstate, primary and urban highway systems and public transportation projects, facilities and services in the state’s **Six-Year Improvement Program for FY2014-2019**. The County focused on funding of the Route 7 widening, Dulles Rail Phase II and the Soapstone connector bridge over the Dulles Toll Road.
