After four years of work, the Reston Master Plan Special Study (Phase 1) Plan Amendment is official. On Tuesday, the Board of Supervisors approved the plan which will guide transit-oriented development in the areas within a half mile of the Silver Line Metro Stations at Wiehle-Reston East, Reston Town Center, and Herndon. On to Phase 2....

In other business, we increased our fleet of taxicabs servicing the County with an addition of 78 operator certificates. Thanks to the efforts of the Long Term Care Coordinating Council, the County recognized the need for additional wheelchair-accessible taxis to provide needed transportation service for our elderly and disabled residents. Also, the Board appointed Tony Castrilli as the new director of the Office of Public Affairs. He will take over the reins from Merni Fitzgerald, the current chief County spokesperson, who is soon to retire. We wish her all the best!

Information Meeting: Fairfax County Parkway Trail Repair Project

On **Tuesday, February 18**, 7 p.m., the Virginia Department of Transportation will hold a “pardon our dust” meeting on a project to repair the pedestrian/bicycle trail adjacent to Fairfax County Parkway between Leesburg Pike (Route 7) and Lee Highway (Route 29). The repairs will improve safety and durability of the trail along with improved signage. The meeting will be held at the Virginia Department of Transportation, 4975 Alliance Drive, Fairfax 22030.

Sekas Homes, LTD and Land Design Consultants rezoning and final development plan applications (RZ/FDP 2013-HM-012 – Spring Lake 3 (previously called Summer Hill Estates) have been accepted. The area is currently zoned R-1, with approximately 5.4 acres – Fairfax County Tax Map #28-4((8)) Parcels 3-7 and 28-4 ((9)) Parcel A. The proposed rezoning is from R-1 to PDH-2 and is proposing nine (9) single-family detached houses. **The Planning Commission voted to recommend approval at their January 23, 2014 meeting. The Board of Supervisors public hearing is scheduled for Tuesday, March 4, 2014 at 3:30 p.m.**

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 3: The Board approved **Department of Homeland Security Urban Areas Security Initiative grand funds** of \$320,000, to support the National Capital Region's Emergency Alerting system.

Admin 4: The Board approved “**\$200 Additional Fine for Speeding**” signs on Viking Drive from Lawyers Road to Pinecrest Road, and Pinecrest Road from Fox Mill Road to the end of the road.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 1: The Board authorized execution of a **pretreatment agreement** between Fairfax County and Prince William County Service Authority for the portion of the County's wastewater that is conveyed and treated at the Service Authority's treatment plant.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

3:30 p.m. The Board approved proposed **Reston Master Plan Special Study (Phase 1) Plan Amendment** Item ST09-III-UP1(A), that will guide development around the Silver Line transit stations.

4:00 p.m. Decision on amendment to SEA 2009-DR-008 for **Oakcrest School** was deferred until the Board's February 25, 2014 meeting, at 3:30 p.m.

4:00 p.m. The Board held a public hearing and approved zoning ordinance amendment on **home child care facilities and child care centers for occasional care**.

4:00 p.m. The Board held a public hearing and approved an additional 78 **taxicab operator certificates** to meet demand for taxicab service and increase wheelchair-accessible vehicles available for service in the County.
