The following are highlights from the Board of Supervisors meeting held on **October 7, 2014**. #### **PRESENTATIONS**

The Board recognized this year's honorees of the **Volunteer Fire and Rescue Service Awards**. Two volunteers from the Vienna Volunteer Fire Department were honored: **Donna Greg** and **Vera Lloyd**.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

**Action 2:** The Board approved an agreement with the Town of Vienna to design and construct a stream restoration project on Hunters Branch. Approximately 2,067 feet in the Accotink watershed will be improved in this joint venture. The cost of the project is shared with both the County and Town contributing.

**Action 4:** The Board approved a resolution authorizing an agreement with the County's Department of Transportation and the Virginia Department of Transportation for engineering, design and construction of intersection improvements at nine locations. Included in the projects are:

- Baron Cameron Avenue and Lake Fairfax Drive
- Chain Bridge Road and Boone Boulevard
- Leesburg Pike at Utterback Store Road.

#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

**4:00** The Board conducted a public hearing and approved the proposed zoning ordinance amendment allowing **food trucks** to operate in commercial and industrial areas and County owned properties.

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS**

**Virginia Sales Tax Holiday: October 10-13, 2014: Energy Star and WaterSense Qualified Products.** During this four-day holiday, purchases of products meeting the Energy Star and WaterSense qualifications, such as certain energy-efficient appliances, will be exempt from the Virginia sales tax. Eligible products must be priced at \$2,500 or less for each item, and be purchased for noncommercial home or personal use.
