

Fairfax Connector to Change 31 Bus Routes Beginning January 2015



Fairfax Connector will change 31 bus routes starting January 24, 2015. These changes will help improve on-time performance for routes serving the Silver Line, as well as help connect service between routes and serve new development in the Merrifield and Springfield areas. The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors approved these changes at their Dec. 2, 2014, meeting.

All of the routes below have new schedules which reflect current traffic conditions. Route changes in the Hunter Mill District are:

Routes 505, 981, 983 – Reston Town Center: Departures on routes 505, 981, and 983 will be timed to provide an even spacing of buses between Reston Town Center and the Wiehle Metro station.

Routes 551, 557, 559 – Reston South: An additional morning rush hour trip will be added on Route 557 departing Reston South Park and Ride at approximately 5:40 a.m.

Routes 552, 554, 558 – Reston North: An additional morning rush hour trip will be added on Routes 552 and 554. The schedule will be revised to improve connections with Route 599.

Route 574 – Reston-Tysons: Buses will serve the Tysons Westpark transit station via Spring Hill Road providing new connections to Route 401/402, making a trip between Springfield, Tysons, Merrifield, Annandale, and Reston possible by bus.

Route 599 – Pentagon-Crystal City: To address vehicle crowding at Reston North Park and Ride and passenger requests, all morning service will begin and end 30 minutes earlier than the current schedule. To improve connectivity with the Wiehle Metro station and facilitate transfers to and from other local Reston area bus service, morning and afternoon buses will serve stops along Sunset Hills Road between Metro Center Drive/Isaac Newton Square and Wiehle Avenue.

Route 605 – Fair Oaks-Reston: The time between buses will change from every 60 minutes to every 45 minutes on weekdays and from every 60 minutes to every 70 minutes on Saturdays and Sundays.

- Buses will travel to and from Fair Oaks Mall via West Ox Road, Post Forest Drive, Government Center Parkway, the Fairfax County Government Center, and Monument Drive.
- Buses will serve Fair Lakes Promenade and Pender Creek via bus stops on Monument Drive at Fair Lakes Parkway.

Routes 950, 980 – Herndon-Reston: Departures on routes 950 and 980 will be timed to provide an even spacing of buses between Herndon-Monroe Park & Ride and the Wiehle Metro station. An additional evening trip will be added in both directions to improve connectivity between Herndon and Reston.

Routes 951, 952 – Sunrise Valley Drive-Sunset Hills Road: Route 951 buses will serve the US Geological Survey campus on all morning rush hour, midday, and afternoon rush hour trips via Sunrise Valley Drive.

Routes 980, 950 – Herndon-Monroe: Departures on routes 950 and 980 will be timed to provide an even spacing of buses between Herndon-Monroe Park & Ride and the Wiehle Metro station. Trips will be added during the busiest rush hour travel times to reduce passenger crowding between the Wiehle Metro station and Herndon-Monroe Park & Ride.



Status of Hunter Mill District Land Use Projects

APPROVED: Mary Beth Swicord /d/b/a/ **First Marks Art Studio** has filed Special Exception (SE 2014-HM-024) to allow a School of Special Education (Art School) at 1398 Concord Point Lane, Reston - Tax Map 011-4 ((6)), Parcel 12. First Marks provides an imaginative and enriching learning environment where students can express themselves and excel in the arts. First Marks Art Studio operates as a home business today, but is seeking to increase the enrollment that requires a Special Exception. The current schedule provides for eight (8) students per day with hours from 4:00-7:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The proposed schedule will include eighteen (18) students on Monday and twelve (12) students Tuesday – Friday, with hours from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., during the Fairfax County school year. Also being proposed is a Summer Camp, Monday – Friday from 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. daily, with an enrollment of twelve (12) students. The Planning Commission voted to recommend approval on Thursday, October 9, 2014. **The Board of Supervisors approved this application on December 2, 2014.**

APPROVED: Elaine M. Whitehurst /d/b/a **Whitehurst Family Daycare** has filed Special Exception 2014-HM-036 for a Home Childcare Facility at 13174 Diamond Mill Drive, Herndon, Virginia. Ms. Whitehurst has been a licensed provider for over twenty years, thirteen at the current location. A special exception is required for home day care to serve nine (9) children. The hours of operation are from 7:00 am to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, with varying arrival times. **The Planning Commission voted to recommend approval on November 19, 2014. The Board of Supervisors approved this application on December 2, 2014.**

APPROVED: **Proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment 2013-III-UP1** to consider changes to recommendations regarding the Millennium Bank building, heritage resources, the Full Consolidation Option and transportation. UP-5 Reston Community Planning Sector, Lake Anne Village Center at general location: South of Baron Cameron Avenue, west of Wiehle Avenue, north of Lake Anne and east of North Shore Drive. Additional information is available at <http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/dpz/comprehensiveplan/planamendments.htm>. **The Planning Commission voted to recommend approval on November 12, 2014. The Board of Supervisors approved this amendment on Tuesday, December 2, 2014.**



SCHEDULED:

Lake Anne Development Partners LLC have filed a Development Plan Amendment (DPA A502-07), Proffer Condition Amendment (PCA A-502) and Planned Residential Community (PRC A-502-03) plan for the redevelopment of the Crescent Apartments and the Lake Anne Village Center. Consolidation of a number of properties (Fairfax County Tax Map 017-2((8)) 6C, 017-2((1))7, 017-2 Parcels 6B2, 017-2((7))6B3, common elements of parcels 017-2((31))1645 and 017-2((31))), and a portion of Village Road, are to be vacated/abandoned (collectively referred to as with Parcels 1A and 2G). The proposed development will include a combination of multi-family buildings and single-family attached dwelling units in a crescent pattern, affordable housing, active adult and age-restricted housing, and a proposed boutique grocery store. Approximately 135,000 gross square feet of new non-residential development is proposed. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for January 8, 2015, at 8:15 p.m. The Board of Supervisors public hearing will be held on January 27, 2015.**

JBG/Reston Executive Center, L.L.C. has filed a Special Exception (SE 2013-HM-016) to allow for the establishment of 65,000 square feet of development including retail sales, eating establishment, fast food restaurant and quick service food stores, located at 12000-12120 Sunset Hills Road - Fairfax County Tax Map 17-3((1)) Parcels 28A, 28B and 28C - zoned I-5. The Applicant is proposing to convert 27,850 square feet of existing office use and constructing 37, 150 square feet of building additions to the existing office buildings. **The Planning Commission public hearing is now scheduled for January 21, 2015 at 8:15 p.m., but is subject to change.**

RSQ9 Owner, LLC has filed a Comprehensive Sign Plan Amendment (CSPA B-846-02) for Fairfax County Tax Map 017-4((31) Parcel 01, at 11790 Sunrise Valley Drive, to increase the flexibility in the number and location of signs, without increasing the overall size of signage. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for January 14, 2015, 8:15 p.m.**

Sports Authority, Inc. located at 8355 Leesburg Pike, Tax Map 29-3 ((01)) Parcel 32, has filed Special Exception SE 2014-HM-066 seeking a waiver of certain sign regulations in accordance with Section 9-620 of the Fairfax County Zoning Ordinance to provide relief from Section 12-20493 of the Zoning Ordinance to provide identification on an existing multi-tenant freestanding sign. There will be no additional changes to the use. **The tentative date for the Planning Commission public hearing is February 4, 2015, at 8:15 p.m.**

Comstock Reston Station Holdings, LC, has filed Comprehensive Sign Plan (CSP 2009-HM-019) for 1860 Wiehle Avenue and 1886 Metro Center Drive in Reston, Fairfax County Tax Map 017-4((01)) Parcel 17A and 017-4((24)) Parcels 3 and 4B, to allow for a coordinated and comprehensive plan of signage for the mixed used development at Reston Station. The signage is to ensure convenience and appropriate way finding for visitors, users and occupants of Reston Station. **The tentative Planning Commission public hearing is February 25, 2014, 8:15 p.m.**

Bozzuto Development Company, Inc. has submitted a Proffer Condition Amendment (PCA 86-C-023), Development Plan Amendment (DPA 86-C-023) and Planned Residential Community (PRC 86-C-023) for the proposed redevelopment of St. John's Wood apartments to convert 250 multi-family garden apartments in nine-three story buildings to 625 new apartments and thirty-four townhomes. The property is located at 11500 Olde Tiverton Circle, Reston - Tax Map 11-4 ((1)) Parcel 12. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for April 15, 2015, at 8:15 p.m.**



HEARINGS NOT SCHEDULED AT THIS TIME:

CARS-DB1, LLC has filed two rezoning applications and a special exception application for a proposed transit oriented development called Dominion Square near the Spring Hill Metro Station. The properties are identified as Tax Map 29-3 ((1)) Parcels 2C1, 2C2, 2D, 3, and part 5 (located at 1580, 1586 at 1592 Spring Hill Road), and Tax Map 29-3 ((1)) 3B and part 5 (located at 8525 Leesburg Pike.) The applications seek to rezone the property from the Regional Retail (C-7), Highway Corridor Overlay (HC) and Sign Control Overlay (SC) Districts to Planned Tysons Corner (PTC), HC and SC Districts. The two rezoning applications, RZ 2011-HM-012 concurrent with RZ 2011-HM-013, propose to redevelop multiple car dealerships into a vibrant, transit oriented mixed-use neighborhood with office, hotel, retail and residential uses. Included in the development will be five (5) office buildings, six (6) residential buildings, a hotel, ground floor retail uses, and a large public park/facility near the stream valley area to the south. The low-rise retail structures and multiple surface parking lots will be replaced with high-rise buildings and structured parking. **The Planning Commission hearing has not been scheduled.**

1587 Springhill Holdings, Inc. - Tax Map 029-3 ((1)) 2G - has filed a rezoning and Conceptual Development Plan (CDP) application to rezone the property from Regional Retail (C-7), Highway Corridor Overlay (HC) and Sign Control Overlay (SC) Districts to Planned Tysons Corner (PTC), HC and SC Districts (RZ 2011-HM-027). The property is currently developed with a motel and restaurant that were constructed in 1982. The proposed mixed-use development is near the Spring Hill Metro Station and will consist of either two residential buildings and one office building or three residential buildings, with ground floor retail uses located along Spring Hill Road. **The Planning Commission public hearing has not been scheduled.**

JBG Reston Retail, LLC, has filed a proposed Development Plan Amendment (DPA-B-846-04), Proffer Condition Amendment (PCA-B-846-02), and Planned Residential Community Plan (PRC-B-846-03) to allow the construction of a drive-in bank at 11810 Sunrise Valley Drive, Tax Map 17-4 ((31)) Parcel p (part), 17-3 ((3))-IE (Part) and 17-3 ((3))-IE3. **Planning Commission public hearing has been indefinitely deferred.**

Land Use continued:

Novus Residences, LLC has filed Proffered Condition Amendment (PCA A-502-02), Development Plan Amendment (DPA 502-A-08), and a Planned Residential Community (PRC 502-A-04) plan applications for the Lake Anne Fellowship House at 11448 and 11450 North Shore Drive, Reston - Fairfax County Tax Map 017-2((1)) Parcels 2 and 3 - to redevelop its approximately six (6) acre site. It will provide 425 dwelling units (510,000 square feet), that will include a building with 140 independent living affordable units and a second building with 285 market rate multi-family dwelling units. **The Planning Commission public hearing has been indefinitely deferred.**

Q-R Spring Hill, LLC, Perseus Realty, has filed a Rezoning and Conceptual Development Plan (CDP) application for 1577 Spring Hill Road - Tax Map 029-3 ((1)) Parcel 2F. The Conceptual Development Plan proposes to rezone the property from Regional Retail - C-7, Highway Corridor Over-lay (HC) and Sign Control Overlay (SC) Districts to Planned Tysons Corner (PTC), HC and SC Districts (RZ 2011-HM-026). The proposed mixed-use development is near the Tysons West Metro Station and will consist of office, hotel, residential, and retail development. **The Planning Commission public hearing is indefinitely deferred.**

Proposed Comprehensive Plan Amendment 2014-III-UP1 has been filed to consider a senior housing facility for 150 independent living facilities and up to 100 assisted living/memory care units, exclusive of any affordable dwelling units at 10819 Leesburg Pike (Tax Map 12-3((1)), Parcel 4. No public hearing dates have been scheduled.

New Applications Accepted



Virginia Electric and Power Company, d/b/a Dominion Power filed a request for Final Development Plan FDP 2014-0366 to permit the development and operation of an electric substation on property identified as Fairfax County Tax Map 29-3((1)) Parcels 2G, 3B and 5, at Tysons. The substation will convert electric power from the existing 230kV transmission line to a 34.5kV that is usable by commercial, residential, utility, and retail consumers.



New Applications Filed

JBG/1831 Wiehle LLC filed a rezoning application to rezone 1831 Wiehle Avenue from the I-4 Medium Intensity Industrial District to the Planned Residential Mixed-Use (PRM) district to develop a mixed-use, transit oriented development in the Wiehle-Reston East Transit station area. The rezoning proposes 504 multi-family residential units and up to 61,000 square feet of complementary retail uses. The application also includes a conceptual and final development plan depicting the layout of the residential and retail uses for the property.

George Family Property Development LLC has filed a rezoning application for 9001 & 9005 Winding Creek Lane, 1620 and 1630 Crim Dell Land and 8915 Higdon Drive, Vienna, (Tax Map 28-4 ((1)) Parcel 19, 19A, 21, 21B, 25, 25A and 25C. The Applicant proposes to rezone from R-1 and R-C to PDH-2 for the development of nineteen (19) new single family detached homes with the retention of three (3) existing homes. The proposed density for the project is 1.10 dwelling units per acre.

New Design Guidelines for the Reston Transit Station Areas

As we all know, the Board of Supervisors approved an amendment to the Fairfax County Comprehensive Plan for the Reston Transit Station Areas (TSAs), in February of 2014. The goal was to plan for future growth in the Reston area organized around the three new Silver Line metrorail stations along the Dulles Airport Access Road. This new plan capitalizes on the walkable framework originally envisioned for Reston with a transit oriented design strategy, which will allow the area to continue to grow both economically and physically while maintaining the legacy of walkability, sustainability, and innovation. At plan approval, county staff was asked in a follow-on motion to draft Design Guidelines to support the recommendations of the Plan and provide a framework for design expectations for architecture and the public realm (sidewalks, open spaces, and plazas) in the TSAs.




The Design Guidelines will focus on supporting pedestrian-friendly development in the TSAs, areas that will feel more urban than parts of Reston, but still reflect the unique character of the community. The Guidelines will encourage design innovation, emphasize sustainability, highlight public art and weave together the natural and built environments. The Guidelines will include recommendations on site design, accommodation of unique features such as wetlands or wooded areas, building orientation, and solar orientation. Building design will be addressed with a focus on recommendations that impact the overall character of the district and improve the pedestrian environment. For example, the Guidelines may encourage quality materials and architectural building design articulation at the ground level to discourage blank, uninspiring building facades. Finally, the design guidelines will include recommendations on the streetscape design that, in conjunction with the new road design standards developed by the county and state, will transform space from curb to curb and building front to building front in the TSAs. Together, the recommendations will help to create a unique sense of place in the Reston TSAs.

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The work to draft these guidelines is underway. Preliminary recommendations will be reviewed and enhanced by an advisory committee in partnership with the Fairfax County Office of Community Revitalization in the upcoming months. 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Update from Fairfax Water

Fairfax Water will soon begin construction on its Fox Mill-Reston Transmission Improvements project. This project includes the installation of approximately 2,500 feet of 36-inch diameter water main along the northbound lanes of the Fairfax County Parkway, near the Pinecrest Road overpass. Identified in Fairfax Water's System Master Plan, this project will provide expanded transmission capacity and enhanced reliability for water services to the highest ground elevations in Fairfax County, an area stretching from Reston in the north to Fairfax Lakes in the south.

The majority of work will be within the Virginia Department of Transportation right-of-way, outside the roadway. Vehicular and pedestrian traffic will be maintained during construction. Areas impacted by this work will be restored after the water main is installed. This project is scheduled to begin this month and be completed in the fall of 2015.
