## Help Fairfax Families This Holiday Season

The holidays are a time for sharing, and there is no better way to celebrate the spirit of the season than by helping your neighbors in need. **Consider sponsoring a family for the holidays.** More than 73,000 people in the Fairfax County area—including about 34,000 children—do not know where their next meal is coming from. As the holidays approach, many parents worry that they will not be able to provide gifts for their children or a holiday meal to celebrate the season.

Through a grant from Fairfax County, local non-profit Our Daily Bread (ODB) administers a Holiday Program that matches local families with community members who provide Thanksgiving and December holiday meals, as well as gifts for the children in the family.

Families in need are referred to the program by Fairfax County Public Schools social workers and counselors, as well as local social services agencies. When you sponsor a family, you will feel the true spirit of the season. Participating in the Holiday Program is a wonderful group or family activity. And it's a great way to give back to the community, because your help goes directly to a local family in need. In 2013, ODB's Holiday Program assisted more than 3,000 families. The need is expected to be even greater this year.

**How Can I Help?** There are three ways to participate:

**Sponsor a family:** Purchase food for a holiday meal and arrange to deliver it to the family. For December holidays, you may also opt to purchase gifts or gift cards for the children in the family.

**Be a virtual sponsor:** Donate funds that will be used to purchase a gift card to help a specific family. We'll notify you when we have sent your gift card.

**Provide a donation:** Our Daily Bread also welcomes contributions of money or gift cards to assist families who are not sponsored.

## Hypothermia Programs Begin

**The 2014-2015 Hypothermia Prevention Program** is an integral part of the Fairfax County program to prevent and end homelessness that incorporates the collaborative work of area faith communities, civic organizations, businesses and individual volunteers. The Hypothermia Prevention Program represents a shining example of collaborative effectiveness serving the critical needs of the chronically homeless and vulnerable persons when they are in most danger of exposure to cold and adverse weather.

In the Winter Season of 2013-2014, the collaborative effort of the Winter Seasonal Programs was able to serve 1,056 unduplicated guests at all of the sites. In addition, many clients moved directly into permanent housing. There were no hypothermia-related deaths reported during the 2013-2014 Winter. This year, the partners opened their shelters to “no turn-away” status on November 1<sup>st</sup>. The sites are operated by the following providers with their volunteer faith communities:

**Cornerstones’ Embry Rucker Community Shelter (ERCS)** operates two separate winter seasonal programs. The first is hosted at the main shelter. Individuals are welcome to enter the shelter for dinner. Beginning December 1, a second program starts at the North County Human Services Building. Also, on December 1, additional spaces are made available at the main shelter. Last season, the winter seasonal programs **served 419 clients**. A hot dinner, breakfast, bagged lunches, showers, laundry, bus tokens and basic self-care supplies are made available to all clients who participate in the programs. Outreach staff provides case management support to provide links to resources and opportunities for housing. **FACETS’** Hypothermia prevention season begins on Sunday, November 23, 2014 and goes through March 15, 2015. Doors open at 5:30 p.m. each evening and close at 7:00 a.m. each morning, seven days a week. FACETS **served 261 clients last season throughout the course of the 16 weeks**. Currently, all weeks are filled for faith partners to participate as hosting sites. **Volunteers of America, Chesapeake (VOAC)** Hypothermia Program is operated under the management of Bailey’s Crossroads Community Shelter (BCCS) staff and operates from Dec. 1, 2014 through March 31, 2015. Last year **BCCS’ hypothermia and winter seasonal program served 349 clients**. Hypothermia guests assemble at the Bailey’s Crossroads Community Shelter each evening at 4:00p.m. Guests are afforded a hot shower, dinner, life skills, clothing, laundry, and case management while at the facility. **Friends of Falls Church Homeless Shelter in partnership with New Hope Housing** operates the Falls Church Winter Shelter. From November 15, 2014 to March 31, 2015, they providing a warm bed, meals, life skills classes, and case management services to the guests. The shelter is located at 217 Gordon Road in the City of Falls Church. Last season, the Falls Church Winter Shelter **served 46 guests last season**. The case management services have had a significant impact on the program. As a result, residents transitioned into market-rate and transitional housing by the end of the season. Fairfax County continues to operate the six year-round emergency shelters for individuals and families who are homeless. These shelters are operated by community nonprofit organizations under contract with the county. ### Deer Management Program Underway

The County's Deer Management program has begun at selected parks throughout the County. The program is implemented each year to manage the abundant local deer population. The primary objective of this comprehensive and integrated wildlife management program is deer population control at selected park sites.

The county's program utilizes all the available population control tools allowed by the state; archery programs, managed hunts, and sharpshooting using police officers. Hunter Mill District sites included in this year's program include;


**Archery:** Vienna cluster (Difficult Run Stream Valley, Clarks Crossing, Lahey Lost Valley, Tamarack, and Eudora parks), Reston cluster (Fred Crabtree, Little Difficult Run Stream Valley, Difficult Run parks).

**Sharpshooting:** Lake Fairfax Park and Frying Pan Farm Park.

Notification letters will be sent from Chief Roessler's office by mid-December to residents who live on the properties surrounding the parks. Additional information on the County's [Deer Management Program](#) is available on the [County's website](#).

### Bruin Park Master Plan Revision Begins

The Fairfax County Park Authority is holding a Public Comment Meeting to gather public input on the draft master plan revision for Bruin Park located at 415 Van Buren Street in Herndon. The meeting will be held on **Monday, December 1, 2014 at 7 p.m.** in Herndon Middle School located at 901 Locust Street, Herndon. Bruin Park is a well-established landmark in the heart of Herndon. This park is owned by the Town of Herndon but operated by the Fairfax County Park Authority.

Herndon Environmental Network (HEN), a non-profit group based in Herndon, has proposed creating a community garden at Bruin Park. The group represents varying interests and levels of support, ranging from those who want to secure a garden plot to community garden experts who are willing to offer garden knowledge and workshops when the project is in operation. HEN has proposed building and maintaining a community garden operation at the park adjacent to the existing tennis courts. The area is currently open space. ## Transportation



### Fairfax Transportation Bond Update

On November 4th, Fairfax County voters approved the \$100 million transportation bond. The funding will be used for roadway spot improvements, pedestrian, and bicycle projects in Fairfax County. These transportation projects will help Fairfax County move towards developing a diverse transportation network for all modes and users. Project timelines and additional information is available at

The Hunter Mill District transportation projects are:

**Old Courthouse Road and Besley Road Spot Improvement:** Improve alignment of Old Courthouse Road S-curve at Besley Road. The project includes raising the road elevation to improve drainage and limit flooding, and new bicycle/pedestrian facilities. This project addresses safety issues for vehicles, pedestrians and bicycles, and reduces flooding problems.

**Reston Metrorail Access Group (RMAG) Study Recommendations (Phase II):** These projects include construction of intersection pedestrian improvements, new sidewalks, new trails, and new on-road bicycle facilities within a one-mile radius of the Reston Town Center Metrorail Station.

**South Lakes Drive Walkways:** Completes the missing links on South Lakes Drive from Greenkeepers Court to Sunrise Valley Drive.

**Sunrise Valley Drive Walkway:** Construct walkway on north side of Sunrise Valley Drive from Hitchcock Drive to Colts Brook Drive.

**Fox Mill Road Walkway:** Construct walkway on north side of Fox Mill Road from Fairfax County Parkway to Reston Parkway.

### Fire Department Receives Highest Rating in Fire Suppression

Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department underwent an initial Insurance Services Office Inc. (ISO) evaluation in 1984 resulting in a split rating, 03/09. The 03 rating corresponds to an urban/suburban environment whereas the 09 is based on the rural portion of Fairfax County. The numerical fire suppression capability rating scale ranges from 01 to 10. A lower rating correlates to a superior level or quality of fire suppression capability while a higher rating identifies a level of fire suppression capability meeting the service requirements of the area.

The Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department is proud to announce that ISO recently completed its analysis and re-evaluation of the structural fire suppression delivery system provided to the communities in Fairfax County. Effective 2015, the new Protection Classification rating for Fairfax County, VA is 01/1Y. The 01 fire suppression rating for Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department is the first fire department in the Commonwealth of Virginia to achieve the highest rating of a Class 01 for the urban and suburban areas of the county.

ISO's PPC Program plays an important role in the underwriting and calculation of premiums for residential, commercial and industrial properties for insurance companies. Most U.S. insurers use PPC information as part of their decision making when deciding what business to write, coverages to offer, or premiums to charge.

## Status of Hunter Mill District Land Use Projects

**Mary Beth Swicord /d/b/a/ First Marks Art Studio** has filed Special Exception (SE 2014-HM-024) to allow a School of Special Education (Art School) at 1398 Concord Point Lane, Reston - Tax Map 011-4 ((6)), Parcel 12. First Marks provides an imaginative and enriching learning environment where students can express themselves and excel in the arts. First Marks Art Studio operates as a home business today, but is seeking to increase the enrollment that requires a Special Exception. The current schedule provides for eight (8) students per day with hours from 4:00-7:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The proposed schedule will include eighteen (18) students on Monday and twelve (12) students Tuesday – Friday, with hours from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., during the Fairfax County school year. Also being proposed is a Summer Camp, Monday – Friday from 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. daily, with an enrollment of twelve (12) students. The Planning Commission voted to recommend approval on Thursday, October 9, 2014. **The Board of Supervisors public hearing is scheduled for December 2, 2014, at 3:30 p.m.**

**Elaine M. Whitehurst /d/b/a Whitehurst Family Daycare** has filed Special Exception 2014-HM-036 for a Home Childcare Facility at 13174 Diamond Mill Drive, Herndon, Virginia. Ms. Whitehurst has been a licensed provider for over twenty years, thirteen at the current location. A special exception is required for home day care to serve nine (9) children. The hours of operation are from 7:00 am to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, with varying arrival times. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for November 19, 2014, at 8:15 p.m. The Board of Supervisors public hearing is scheduled for December 2, 2014, at 3:30 p.m.**

**Lake Anne Development Partners LLC** have filed a Development Plan Amendment (DPA A502-07), Proffer Condition Amendment (PCA A-502) and Planned Residential Community (PRC A-502-03) plan for the redevelopment of the Crescent Apartments and the Lake Anne Village Center. Consolidation of a number of properties (Fairfax County Tax Map 017-2((8)) 6C, 017-2((1))7, 017-2 Parcels 6B2, 017-2((7))6B3, common elements of parcels 017-2((31))1645 and 017-2((31))), and a portion of Village Road, are to be vacated/abandoned (collectively referred to as with Parcels 1A and 2G). The proposed development will include a combination of multi-family buildings and single-family attached dwelling units in a crescent pattern, affordable housing, active adult and age-restricted housing, and a proposed boutique grocery store. Approximately 135,000 gross square feet of new non-residential development is proposed. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for January 8, 2015, at 8:15 p.m. The Board of Supervisors public hearing will be held on January 27, 2015.**

**Novus Residences, LLC** has filed Proffered Condition Amendment (PCA A-502-02), Development Plan Amendment (DPA 502-A-08), and a Planned Residential Community (PRC 502-A-04) plan applications for the Lake Anne Fellowship House at 11448 and 11450 North Shore Drive, Reston - Fairfax County Tax Map 017-2((1)) Parcels 2 and 3 - to redevelop its approximately six (6) acre site. It will provide 425 dwelling units (510,000 square feet), that will include a building with 140 independent living affordable units and a second building with 285 market rate multi-family dwelling units. **The Planning Commission public hearing has been indefinitely deferred.**

### Corbalis to Fox Mill Water Main Project Status

The construction of approximately 11,300 feet of new 54-inch water main by Fairfax Water along Fairfax County Parkway from New Dominion Parkway to the Fox Mill Pumping Station is nearing completion. The tunnel has been mined and the installation of the water main in the tunnel is complete. Grouting around the tunnel pipe has started and should be complete in November. The open cut water main installation near New Dominion Parkway and south of Fox Mill has also been completed and the final connections to the existing system are expected to begin in early December of this year.

All of the new water main will be tested prior to being placed in-service in January of 2015. The final phase of this project is restoration of all disturbed areas. Also included is construction of a new asphalt trail section from south of Fox Mill Road to the project limit past Coronation Road.
