Dear Hunter Mill Friends,

As always, the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November is Election Day. And November is just around so I thought it might be useful to remind you of some significant legal changes and where to find the necessary information.

While Absentee Voting by mail does not require a photo ID, for in person voting on Election Day or at absentee voting locations, Virginia now mandates everyone to provide an acceptable photo ID. Acceptable ID includes a valid Virginia Driver's License, Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) ID card, U.S. Passport, Military ID or other government-issued ID.

If you have a family member or loved one who needs a new ID, like every person, they may apply for a free card from the Office of Elections at the Fairfax County Government Center or at several locations countywide. Call the Fairfax County Office of Elections at 703-222-0776 (TTY 711), or check online at [www.fairfaxcounty.gov/elections](http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/elections).

Get straightforward, easy-to-find information, as well as the latest news and updates on voting and the election process in Fairfax County online at [www.fairfaxcounty.gov/elections](http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/elections).

Also, please consider serving as an Election Officers. This fall election alone necessitates Fairfax County 2,700 election officers volunteer; bilingual citizens are particularly needed. You may choose to accept the \$175 payment for a full day, or volunteer your time. Qualifications are few:

- be a registered voter in Virginia
- attend the required training
- complete the necessary forms.

PS: The mobile app includes other useful county tools such as paying car taxes and researching permits too.

## Bilingual Election Officers Needed

More than 500 election officers are still needed for the November 4 Election Day in Fairfax County. There is a particular need for bilingual Spanish, Korean and Vietnamese speakers countywide. Qualifications include being a registered voter in Virginia and available to work on Election Day. Each election officer is required to complete documentation for employment eligibility in-person at the Fairfax County Office of Elections, and attend a training class prior to Election Day. The compensation to work the full day is \$175 and half-day shifts may be available. The November 4 General Election will include elections for member of the U. S. Senate, U.S. House of Representatives for 8th, 10th, and 11th Congressional Districts, as well as a proposed Virginia Constitutional Amendment and a Transportation Bond. ## Reston Master Plan Phase II Community Meetings

## Regional Ebola Update

The U.S. and the National Capital Region (NCR) have a strong health care system and experienced public health professionals who work to ensure an Ebola outbreak will not threaten our communities or region.

**NCR Public Health Preparedness:** Health departments and the medical system in the NCR have invested significant resources in planning, training, and systems to prepare for the public health response to regional emergencies.

- The NCR has extensive regional partnerships through hospital alliances, the Laboratory Response Network, health departments, public safety agencies, and health care providers for sharing information, detecting illness, and responding to confirmed cases.
- The region's experience with previous infectious disease outbreaks and planning for events, such as pandemic influenza, has strengthened regional response capability.
- Media reports of suspected cases of Ebola in the regional demonstrate that the region is able to respond, detect, and investigate suspected cases.

**Surveillance and Monitoring:** The NCR public health systems knows how to stop Ebola by: increasing surveillance, identifying, and confirming cases, isolating ill individuals, implementing infection controls, contact tracing and monitoring for exposed individuals, and isolation of symptomatic contacts.

**Communication and Notification:** Health departments disseminate guidance and updated information to the CDC to health care facilities, providers, and public health partnerships using established protocols and the Health Advisory Network (HAN). Health departments have protocols for informing officials and citizens in their jurisdictions regarding public health issues. There is regional protocol for coordinating public health communication and information sharing.

## Volunteering For Fairfax County

Fairfax County introduces its new volunteer management system - paving the way for much easier navigation of county volunteer opportunities. Now as a volunteer, you can manage all your county "jobs" with the click of a mouse. It's one-stop-shop for volunteering.

Now you can visit [volunteer.fairfaxcounty.gov](http://volunteer.fairfaxcounty.gov), fill out one application and search for opportunities that meet your interest by geographic location, dates, type of people or program type. This system allows for family volunteering, group volunteering, opportunities for students needing service hours, and even court-mandated volunteering. It also allows user to view positions from a variety of agencies (from Animals to Zombie Disaster Preparedness), track their hours, and review upcoming and past volunteer jobs. And, when needed, volunteers who indicate their willingness to serve in times of emergency can be called upon and placed quickly through an automated alert system.

According to the most recent estimate, more than 12,000 volunteers contribute more than 500,000 hours annually, valued at nearly \$10 million. The implementation of the new system is projected to improve efficiency and coordination of recruiting and management of volunteers. ### Vesper Trail Informational Meeting

Vesper Trail is an important link between the Tysons transit area and northern Vienna neighborhoods. FCDOT staff will discuss the project background, current progress, and timeline to completion. ### Virginia Department of Transportation Six Year Transportation Plan Public Meeting

The Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) is visiting localities throughout Virginia to share information and listen to what residents think about transportation projects. On **Thursday, October 16**, the CTB will be hosting a meeting at the VDOT Northern Virginia District office (4975 Alliance Drive, Fairfax, VA, 22030). The meeting begins with an open house at 5:30, followed by public hearing starting at 6 p.m.

The current transportation program (FY 2015-2020) is being adjusted to transition to a new prioritization process. This process will determine critical transportation priorities through a fair and objective analysis. Following the public comment period, the final revised program will be presented to the CTB for its adoption in November.

Comments are also encouraged on projects and programs to be considered for the next fiscal year's version (FY 2016-2021) of the Six Year Improvement Plan (SYIP), which will be updated for the CTB's approval next June. A communitywide speed perception survey indicated that over 80% of the people responding felt that speed is a problem in their neighborhood, 77% felt people are driving too fast, and 80% were worried about speeding cars striking neighborhood children. ### Transportation Planning Board Community Leadership Institute

How are transportation decisions made in this region? How can community leaders make a difference? The Transportation Planning Board's Community Leadership Institute (CLI) is designed to help community leaders figure out those questions. Over the course of three interrelated modules, the CLI aims to empower individuals to get involved in transportation decision-making whenever and wherever it occurs. CLI uses interactive group exercises and discussions to help participants better understand regional challenges, as well as opportunities for successful public involvement. At each step of the way, participants discuss ways in which the interests of their local communities connect with the planning issues facing the entire region. By providing this big-picture context, the CLI encourages participants to "think regionally and act locally."

The CLI is a free program. Interested candidates must commit to attending all three sessions: November 6 from 6 to 9 p.m. in College Park, MD; November 12 from 6 to 9 p.m. in Alexandria, VA, and; November 15 from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in Washington, DC. ### Status of Hunter Mill District Land Use Projects

**Mary Beth Swicord /d/b/a/ First Marks Art Studio** has filed Special Exception (SE 2014-HM-024) to allow a School of Special Education (Art School) at 1398 Concord Point Lane, Reston - Tax Map 011-4 ((6)), Parcel 12. First Marks provides an imaginative and enriching learning environment where students can express themselves and excel in the arts. First Marks Art Studio operates as a home business today, but is seeking to increase the enrollment that requires a Special Exception. The current schedule provides for eight (8) students per day with hours from 4:00-7:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. The proposed schedule will include eighteen (18) students on Monday and twelve (12) students Tuesday – Friday, with hours from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., during the Fairfax County school year. Also being proposed is a Summer Camp, Monday – Friday from 8:30 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. daily, with an enrollment of twelve (12) students. **The Planning Commission voted to recommend approval on Thursday, October 9, 2014.**

**Elaine M. Whitehurst /d/b/a Whitehurst Family Daycare** has filed Special Exception 2014-HM-036 for a Home Childcare Facility at 13174 Diamond Mill Drive, Herndon, Virginia. Ms. Whitehurst has been a licensed provider for over twenty years, thirteen at the current location. A special exception is required for home day care to serve nine (9) children. The hours of operation are from 7:00 am to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, with varying arrival times. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for November 19, 2014, at 8:15 p.m. The Board of Supervisors public hearing is scheduled for December 2, 2014, at 3:30 p.m.**

**Lake Anne Development Partners LLC** have filed a Development Plan Amendment (DPA A502-07), Proffer Condition Amendment (PCA A-502) and Planned Residential Community (PRC A-502-03) plan for the redevelopment of the Crescent Apartments and the Lake Anne Village Center. Consolidation of a number of properties (Fairfax County Tax Map 017-2((8)) 6C, 017-2((1))7, 017-2 Parcels 6B2, 017-2((7))6B3, common elements of parcels 017-2((31))1645 and 017-2((31))), and a portion of Village Road, are to be vacated/abandoned (collectively referred to as with Parcels 1A and 2G). The proposed development will include a combination of multi-family buildings and single-family attached dwelling units in a crescent pattern, affordable housing, active adult and age-restricted housing, and a proposed boutique grocery store. Approximately 135,000 gross square feet of new non-residential development is proposed. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for December 10, 2013 at 8:15 p.m. The Board of Supervisors public hearing is scheduled for February 17, 2015.**

**Novus Residences, LLC** has filed Proffered Condition Amendment (PCA A-502-02), Development Plan Amendment (DPA 502-A-08), and a Planned Residential Community (PRC 502-A-04) plan applications for the Lake Anne Fellowship House at 11448 and 11450 North Shore Drive, Reston - Fairfax County Tax Map 017-2((1)) Parcels 2 and 3 - to redevelop its approximately six (6) acre site. It will provide 425 dwelling units (510,000 square feet), that will include a building with 140 independent living affordable units and a second building with 285 market rate multi-family dwelling units. **The Planning Commission public hearing has been indefinitely deferred.**

**JBG/Reston Executive Center, L.L.C.** has filed a Special Exception (SE 2013-HM-016) to allow for the establishment of 65,000 square feet of development including retail sales, eating establishment, fast food restaurant and quick service food stores, located at 12000-12120 Sunset Hills Road - Fairfax County Tax Map 17-3((1)) Parcels 28A, 28B and 28C - zoned I-5. The Applicant is proposing to convert 27,850 square feet of existing office use and constructing 37,150 square feet of building additions to the existing office buildings. **The Planning Commission public hearing is currently scheduled for November 19, 2014 at 8:15 p.m., but is subject to change.**

**RSQ9 Owner, LLC** has filed a Comprehensive Sign Plan Amendment (CSPA B-846-02) for Fairfax County Tax Map 017-4((31)) Parcel 01, to increase the flexibility in the number and location of signs, without increasing the approved overall size of signage. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for December 11, 2014, at 8:15 p.m.**

**Comstock Reston Station Holdings, LC**, has filed Comprehensive Sign Plan (CSP 2009-HM-019) for 1860 Wiehle Avenue and 1886 Metro Center Drive in Reston, Fairfax County Tax Map 017-4((01)) Parcel 17A and 017-4((24)) Parcels 3 and 4B, to allow for a coordinated and comprehensive plan of signage for the mixed used development at Reston Station. The signage is to ensure convenience and appropriate way finding for visitors, users and occupants of Reston Station. **The tentative Planning Commission public hearing is February 5, 2014 at 8:15 p.m.**

**Sports Authority, Inc.** located at 8355 Leesburg Pike, Tax Map 29-3 ((01)) Parcel 32, has filed Special Exception SE 2014-HM-066 seeking a waiver of certain sign regulations in accordance with Section 9-620 of the Fairfax County Zoning Ordinance to provide relief from Section 12-20493 of the Zoning Ordinance to provide identification on an existing multi-tenant freestanding sign. There will be no additional changes to the use. **The Planning Commission public hearing is scheduled for March 4, 2015, at 8:15 p.m.**

**Q-R Spring Hill, LLC, Perseus Realty,** has filed a Rezoning and Conceptual Development Plan (CDP) application for 1577 Spring Hill Road - Tax Map 029-3 ((1)) Parcel 2F. The Conceptual Development Plan, to rezone the property from Regional Retail - C-7, Highway Corridor Overlay (HC) and Sign Control Overlay (SC) Districts to Planned Tysons Corner (PTC), HC and SC Districts (RZ 2011-HM-026). The proposed mixed-use development is near the Tysons West Metro Station and will consist of office, hotel, residential, and retail development. **The Planning Commission public hearing is indefinitely deferred.**

**JBG Reston Retail, LLC,** has filed a proposed Development Plan Amendment (DPA-B-846-04), Proffer Condition Amendment (PCA-B-846-02), and Planned Residential Community Plan (PRC-B-846-03) to allow the construction of a drive-in bank at 11810 Sunrise Valley Drive, Tax Map 17-4 ((31)) Parcel p (part), 17-3 ((3))-IE (Part) and 17-3 ((3))-IE3. **Planning Commission public hearing has been indefinitely deferred.**

The substation will convert electric power from the existing 230kV transmission line to a 34.5kV that is usable by commercial, residential, utility, and retail consumers.

A program in Fairfax County would potentially provide a fiscally responsible means to put many of the county's historic properties back into use. Resident curator programs have been used to preserve and protect historically significant building in jurisdictions across the country.


