APPOINTMENTS

ACTION ITEMS

Action 2: The Board deferred action on **parking reduction for Lake Anne Village Center** until their meeting on February 17, 2015.

INFORMATION ITEM

Info 1: Northern Virginia Transportation Authority approved and funded six projects for their FY2014 program requested by the County and its' towns:

- Route 28 widening 6 to 8 lanes (SB from Dulles Toll Road to Route 50)
- Route 28 widening 6 to 8 lanes (NB from McLearen Road to Dulles Toll Road)
- Innovation Centre Metrorail Station
- Herndon Parkway intersection improvements at Van Buren Street
- Herndon Parkway intersection improvements at Sterling road
- Herndon Metrorail Intermodal Access Improvements.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Board held a public hearing to consider a compensation increase for the Board of Supervisors. Decision was deferred until March 3, 2015. If ultimately approved, board salaries would be \$95,000 and \$100,000 for the Board chairman, effective January 1, 2016. Since 2008, Board members make \$75,000 per year.

The Board deferred public hearings on **Lake Anne Development Partners' redevelopment plan for Lake Anne Village Center**, including Crescent Apartments. Public hearing will be held on February 17, 2015 at 3:00 p.m.

The Board held a public hearing on the **comprehensive financial agreement for the Lake Anne Village Center redevelopment plan**, including Crescent Apartments. Decision is deferred until March 3, 2015.
