The following are highlights from the Board of Supervisors meeting held on **October 20, 2015**. ### PRESENTATIONS

The Board recognized **Northern Virginia Community College** for its 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

The **History Commission** presented their annual report, outlining their efforts on the annual History Conference, development of the Resident Curator program, and commemorations of the Sesquicentennial of the Civil War and the Bicentennial of the War of 1812.

The **Ad Hoc Police Practices Review Commission** presented their final report and recommendations in the areas of communications, recruitment, diversity, mental health, use of force, and independent oversight and investigations. The committee reports and final recommendations are available [online](#). The Board directed staff to begin to develop a work plan for implementation of the recommendations. The final report will be discussed at the Board's Public Safety Committee meeting on October 27, 3 p.m. at the Government Center.

### APPOINTMENTS: Hunter Mill District

### ACTION ITEMS

**Action 3:** The Board approved resolutions endorsing projects for submission to the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) for consideration under the **Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)**. Projects proposed for FY2017 program include:

- Vienna Metrorail Bicycle Access Improvements
- Reston Bike Share Capital Equipment.

**Action 4:** The Board approved a funding agreement between the County and the Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) for operation of five **Connector Stores**. The stores provide information to potential riders of the Fairfax Connector bus system and Metrobus, along with distributing schedules and helping plan trips using public transportation.

### PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Board held a public hearing and approved the proposed changes to the **Hunter Mill Country Day School**, 2021 Hunter Mill Road. The maximum number of students can increase from 80 to 99.

The Board held a public hearing and approved a permit for an **addition and site improvements for South Lakes High School** in Reston. The addition will add approximately 40,000 square feet of classroom space and 120 new parking spaces.

The Board hearing on the proposed amendment to the County Code regarding **dog tethering regulations** was deferred. A new hearing date has not yet been determined.
