#### **ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS**

**Admin 2:** The Board authorized advertisement of a **public hearing on the proposed noise ordinance amendment** for May 12, 2015. The proposed noise amendment prohibits noises during specific hours and set maximum decibel levels. The ordinance also sets hours at Park Authority dog parks to 7 a.m. to dusk on weekdays, and 8 a.m. to dusk on weekends and federal holidays. **Action 1:** The Board approved filing reply comments with the Federal Communications Commission in response to a notice of proposed rulemaking relating to **911 governance and accountability**, and improving 911 reliability.

The Board held a public hearing on the **FY2016 effective tax rate** increase.

The Board held a public hearing on a **sewer ordinance amendment** to revise the sewer service charges and base charges.

The Board held a public hearing on the County Executive's proposed **FY2016 advertised budget plan**, the Capital Improvement program for FY2016-2020, and the current appropriation in the FY2016 revised budget plan. Public hearings on this item will continue on April 8th and 9th.
