February 16, 2016



The following are highlights from the Board of Supervisors meeting held on **February 16, 2016**. PRESENTATIONS

The Board received the County Executive's presentation of the Proposed FY2017 and FY2018 Multi-Year Budget Plan. The proposed General Fund budget is \$3.99 billion, a \$168.7 million, or 4.4 percent increase over the FY2016 Budget. The County Executive also proposed a 4 cent tax rate increase that would generate an estimated \$93 million in revenue, and recommended a \$1.88 billion transfer to Fairfax County Public Schools – a 3 percent increase over last year.
