Highlights from the Board of Supervisors Meeting

April 26, 2016



The following are highlights from the Board of Supervisors meeting held on **April 26, 2016**. Budget Adoption

The Board approved adoption of the FY2017 Budget. The budget includes a four-cent real estate tax increase. Funding for Fairfax County Public Schools will increase more than 5 percent over FY2016.

APPOINTMENTS

Elizabeth Teare was appointed as the new County Attorney. Elizabeth has worked in the office since 2000, including a tenure as deputy county attorney since 2012.

Jessica Hudson was appointed to serve as the new library director. Jessica was previously employed as the county librarian for Contra Costa County in Pleasant Hill, California.

Nicole Foster was appointed to the Civil Service Commission.



ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 9: The Board authorized the Department of Family Services to apply and accept grant funding of \$405,911 from the state to expand paraprofessional support services for families of children with behavioral health issues to navigate the System of Care program.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 2: The Board approved the proposed **Consolidated Plan One-Year Action Plan**. The annual action plan is required by the Department of Housing and Urban Development for three federal programs: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG). The total entitlement funding anticipated from these programs is \$6,863,769.

Action 4: The Board approved the **Consolidated Community Funding Pool** recommendations for FY2017 and FY2018, granting awards totaling \$12,008,105 to nonprofit organizations.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Board held public hearings on applications for **2222 Colts Neck Road, L.L.C.**, and approved the project.

The Board held a public hearing on and approved the application for a **Chick-Fil-A, Inc.** at North Point Village Center in Reston.

The Board deferred the public hearing on RZ 2015-HM-010, property owned by Christopher and Mary Warner. The public hearing will be held on May 17, 2016, at 4 p.m.

Roadway Alert: On Saturday, April 30, there will be no access, for most of the day, to Wiehle Avenue from eastbound Reston Station Blvd. The construction crew is placing a large steel beam for the office building currently under construction at Reston Station.
