Highlights from the Board of Supervisors Meeting

April 5, 2016



The following are highlights from the Board of Supervisors meeting held on **April 5, 2016**. Items below cover Hunter Mill District programs, actions, and residents, plus items impacting all of Fairfax County. ACTION ITEMS

Action 2: The Board approved a project agreement between the County and Department of Rail and Public Transportation to provide Federal Highway Administration congestion mitigation and air quality improvement program funds for the operation of five **Connector Stores**.

Action 3: The Board authorized the Department of Transportation to apply and accept funding from the Fostering Advancements in Shipping and Transportation for Long-Term Achievement of National Efficiencies (FASTLANE) grant program, and endorsement of the Virginia Department of Transportation's Atlantic Gateway FASTLANE grant application. Funds will be used for construction of the **Route 7 widening project, extension of I-95 Express Lanes, and expand bus service**.

Action 4: The Board endorsed the design plans for **replacement of the temporary bridge** at Hunter Mill Road over Difficult Run. The new structure will be built to accommodate two 11 foot lanes and four foot shoulders on each side. Construction of the new bridge is schedule for summer of 2018.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Board held a public hearing on the **FY2017 advertised tax rate** (\$1.13). Action on the tax rate will take place at the Board's April 26 meeting.

The public hearing on land use case, **2222 Colts Neck Road, L.L.C**, was deferred and rescheduled for April 26, 2016, at 2:30 p.m.

The Board held a public hearing on the proposed **FY2017 advertised budget, the FY2017-21 Capital Improvement program, and the FY2016 revised budget plan**. The Board heard from 50 scheduled speakers.
