Highlights from the Board of Supervisors Meeting

June 7, 2016



The following are highlights from the Board of Supervisors meeting held on **June 7, 2016**. ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 4: The Board authorized Fairfax-Falls Church Community Services Board to apply for and accept funding of \$631,681 from the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services for the **Merrifield Crisis Response Center**. The grant will support the County's Diversion First initiative aimed at reducing the number of people with mental illness in the County jail.

Admin 5: The Board authorized the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department to apply for the U.S. Department of Homeland Security **Port Security Grant Program**. The funding will be used to purchase a Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, and Explosives/Improvised Explosive Device All-Hazard Rapid Response Vessel for marine operations team to augment homeland security, law enforcement and public safety capabilities.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 1: The Board approved the changes to the **Head Start/Early Head Start Policy Council bylaws** and self-assessment report.

Action 2: The Board approved a letter of agreement between the Fairfax County Department of Transportation and the Park Authority for the design management of the **Ashgrove Trail Extension**.

Action 4: The Board approved the fall **2016 Meals Tax Referendum**. The referendum will appear on the general election ballot on November 8th.

Action 6: The Board endorsed the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority's **SafeTrack program** to rebuild Metrorail as well as associated Metrobus and Fairfax Connector service mitigations.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Board held a public hearing and approve plans for **Akridge and RTC Partnership LLC** for design modifications at 17660 Reston Parkway, Reston, with a focus on building entry and pedestrian plaza, pedestrian plaza landscaping, redesign of the rooftop terraces, and an increase in parking spaces and garage height.
