PRESENTATIONS

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 2: The Board authorized the advertisement of a public hearing to lease county-owned property at 4100 Chain Bridge Road to Southwestern Bell Mobile Services.

Admin 3: The Board authorized the advertisement of a public hearing on a proposed zoning ordinance amendment that would encourage, but not require, the concurrent filing of a Final Development Plan with the Conceptual Development Plan for a rezoning to the Planned Residential Mixed Use District.

Admin 6: The Board authorized the advertisement of a public hearing on a proposed zoning ordinance amendment that would allow Fairfax County to require Zoning Administrative approval of a zoning permit for the installation of a small cell facility by a wireless services provider on an existing structure and to charge reasonable fees for processing such permits.

Admin 7: The Board authorized the advertisement of a public hearing on a proposed zoning ordinance amendment that would allow Fairfax County to charge a fee for processing the review of public facilities, such as monopoles, towers and antennas.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 2: The Board endorsed a recommended list of potential improvements for consideration for the Transform I-66 Outside the Beltway project.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

There were no public hearings on cases in the Hunter Mill District at this meeting.

Reston PRC District Community Meeting

The Department of Planning and Zoning will present proposed changes to the County Comprehensive Plan/Reston Master Plan to the Reston Planned Residential Community District (PRC). The presentation will be on Wednesday, May 24, 7:00 pm, at Lake Anne Elementary School, 11510 North Shore Drive, Reston. The proposed changes to the Zoning Ordinance is needed to accommodate implementation of the adopted Comprehensive Plan, including the persons per acre limitation on residential development. The areas previously zoned industrial within the Reston Transit Station Areas are outside of the PRC District and not affected by this amendment.
