July 25, 2017

From the County Executive

The Board appointment of Park Authority Executive Director Kirk Kincannon as **acting County Executive**, effective September 16, 2017. County Executive Ed Long retires on September 15, 2017.

APPOINTMENTS

ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Admin 1: The Board approved advertisement of a public hearing on the County and Schools' **FY2017 Carryover Review** to amend the appropriation levels in the FY2018 revised budget plan. The carryover balance is \$59.68 million. The [County Executive's recommendations for use of the carryover funds](#) includes \$35.81 million to reserves, \$15.4 million for the Massey Building demolition, and other items.

Admin 3: The Board approved the installation of "Watch for Children" signs on Pinecrest Road near Southgate Community Center.

Admin 9: The Board authorized the Department of Family Services to apply and accept grant funding for support of the Head Start, Early Head Start, and Early Head Start Child Care Partnership programs.

Admin 10: The Board authorized the Police Department to apply and accept grant funding for new police positions that will be assigned to the Computer Forensics Unit of the Investigative Support Division.

ACTION ITEMS

Action 1: The Board authorized issuing revenue bonds by the Economic Development Authority for Madeira School, Inc.

Action 3: The Board approved a joint funding agreement between Fairfax County and the United States Geological Survey for continuation of the existing **water resources monitoring network**.

Action 5: The Board approved the proposed **Consolidated Plan One-Year Action Plan** as issued by the Consolidated Community Funding Advisory Committee. The annual action plan is required by Housing and

Urban Development (HUD) for three federal programs: Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME), and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG).

Action 6: The Board approved a Memorandum of Understanding between the County and Schools regarding the implementation of a **joint municipal separate storm sewer system** that will improve program efficiency and simplify permit compliance.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Board held public hearings and approved the proposed plan amendment governing **Mobile and Land-Based Telecommunications Policy Plan**.

Collect for Kids: Your Donations Needed!

Collect for Kids provides a backpack and appropriate school supplies for kids who qualify for free/reduced meals. Your donation of backpacks (no wheels or logos, please) and funds to purchase supplies are vital. Backpacks can be dropped off at the Hunter Mill Office – 1801 Cameron Glen Drive. Here’s the basic scoop and [links for information](#):

- Collect for Kids is a consortium of local nonprofit, government and businesses partnering to collect school supplies and backpacks for Fairfax County students who need them.

- In Fairfax County more than 50,000 kids qualify for free and reduced meals— and the number is rising. Last year Collect for Kids outfitted more than 37,000 students, an incredible number, but we still weren't able to reach all that needed it.
- With Collect for Kids buying power, each \$1 donated is turned into \$3 of supplies
- Drop off dates for the BOS offices is the month of August. The entire program runs from July 1 through September 1.
- Our goal is to reach every kid that needs help!

SURVEY on Short-Term Rentals

Fairfax County is working to create proposed zoning rules for what are called short-term rentals. These are homes, condos and apartments rented out for less than 30 days on websites like Airbnb, Homeaway, VRBO, FlipKey, or Roomarama.
