





The Board of Supervisors is the governing body of Fairfax County. It consists of nine members elected by district, with each district of approximate equal population, plus a chairman elected at-large. Board members are elected to four-year terms.

The Board establishes county government policy, approves resolutions and ordinances (within limits of its authority established by the Virginia General Assembly), approves the budget, sets local tax rates, approves land use plans, and makes appointments to various non-elected positions. The Board appoints a county executive, who is the administrative head of the county government and is responsible for the administration of all the affairs of the county, which the Board has authority to control. The Board meets on Tuesdays in the Board Room at the Fairfax Government Center, 12000 Government Center Parkway in Fairfax. Meetings are open to the public and are broadcast live on cable Channel 16.

Penny Gross was first elected to the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors from the Mason District in November 1995, and is currently serving her fourth term. Ms. Gross is vice-chair of the Board, and chairs the Board's Personnel Policy and Reorganization Committee, and the Board's Environment Committee.

Regionally, Supervisor Gross represents Fairfax County on the Board of Directors of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments. She also represents Fairfax County on the Northern Virginia Regional Commission, and she represents Region III (VA, MD, DC, WV) on the National Association of Regional Councils Board of Directors. Following 12 years of county representation on the INOVA Health Care Services Board, she was appointed to the INOVA Health System Board of Trustees in 2008. She also chairs the Potomac Watershed Roundtable.

On the state and national level, Supervisor Gross serves on the Board of Directors of the Virginia Association of Counties. She is vice-chair of the National Association of Counties' Energy, Environment, and Land Use Committee. Supervisor Gross was appointed by Governor Warner to the Local Government Advisory Committee (LGAC) for the Chesapeake Bay Program, which she chaired from March 2006 until August 2008. She was appointed to the U.S. EPA LGAC in 2007. In 2008, Governor Kaine appointed her to the Governor's Commission on Climate Change.

Supervisor Gross spent more than 20 years devoted to civic activities and Parent-Teacher Associations. She served on the Board of the Lincolnia Park Civic Association (1985 to 1997), and on the Executive Board of the Mason District Council of Civic Associations (1988 to 1995). She has held numerous offices with PTAs from the local and state level. Supervisor Gross has two daughters and one stepson, and resides with her husband Hal, in the Lincolnia section of Mason District.

Fairfax County uses the Community Emergency Alert Network, or **CEAN**, to deliver important emergency alerts, notifications and updates during a major crisis or emergency. Register to Vote – To be eligible to vote in Fairfax County, citizens must be registered 29 days prior to any primary or general election, and 12 days prior to a special election. To register, you must be a U.S. citizen, a resident of Fairfax County, and 18 years of age or older by the next November general election. You may register in person at the Office of the General Registrar at the Fairfax County Government Center, Suite 323, or call 703-324-4700 for other registration sites. You may also apply by mail. Pick up registration forms at Department of Motor Vehicles offices, public libraries, public schools, or in the Supervisor's office at the Mason District Governmental Center, located at 6507 Columbia Pike in Annandale. Call 703-222-0776 for voter registration assistance.

Pet Owner Responsibilities – All dogs four months and older must be licensed each year. Dog licenses, which go on sale in November for the coming year, may be purchased by mail or in person at the Department of Tax Administration in the Fairfax County Government Center, 12000 Government Center Parkway, or the Fairfax County Animal Shelter, 4500 West Ox Road in Fairfax. The fee is \$10 for all dogs, whether spayed or neutered. A current rabies vaccination certificate must be shown. Please remember to keep your dog on a leash when walking, and clean up after your pet.

Enroll Children in School – Newcomers should call 703-246-2111 to find out which schools serve their new address. Parents should bring a birth certificate, Social Security number, proof of Fairfax County residency, and a transfer slip and report card from the previous school to the school office when enrolling a child. Evidence of immunization is required of all students, and a certificate of physical exam is required for elementary students.

Recycle – All county residents with curbside refuse collection are required to recycle newspaper, metal, food, and beverage cans, glass bottles and jars, scrap metal, and yard debris. Apartment/condominium complexes of 100 units or more are required to recycle newspaper only. In addition, commercial recycling is mandatory for certain businesses. Other programs include yard debris and recycling drop-off centers located throughout Fairfax County. For more information, call the 24-hour Automated Recycling InfoLine at 703-324-5052.

Revitalization is a key issue in Mason District. We all want to shop in an attractive and vibrant downtown.
