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Geographies, Sources & Neighbors

Geographies

The area under consideration is Reston Census Designated Place (CDP), with a focus on the three ZIP Codes, 20190, 20191, and 20194, that are neatly contained within its borders.

The western part 20190 (census tract 4822) is an area of relatively low population comprised largely of commercial and retail activity, including Reston Town Center and significant community resources such as Reston Hospital Center, an Inova emergency care center, Hunter Mill District Supervisor's office, a police station, Reston Regional Library and the Embry Rucker Shelter. There is some housing, including expensive condominiums.

The remaining area of ZIP Code 20190 (three separate census tracts) to the east also has a relatively low population because the land area is dominated by features such as Hidden Creek Country Club, Lake Anne and Lake Fairfax. However, a greater number of families live in this area and two elementary schools, Forest Edge and Lake Anne, are located here. Sunset Valley Elementary is not physically located in 20190 but approximately half its attendance area extends into 20190, so its students are described here.

The population in ZIP Code 20194 is among the most affluent in Reston with high median income and a high rate of homeownership.

The Glade Drive area in ZIP Code 20191 was the subject of a Community View report in November 2014 and that information is not repeated here other than in aggregation with Reston CDP statistics.

Sources

Most of the maps in this report were generated from [TRF PolicyMap](#), an online, fully web-based GIS mapping application. The maps were selected on topics designed to illuminate the realities of families and individuals facing vulnerabilities while living in Reston, an area of relative affluence. Additionally, a community view report generated from PolicyMap is attached as Appendix II.

Other sources include [FCPS](#) school data and [Virginia Dept. of Education](#) information on testing scores. Fairfax County's [Coordinated Services Planning](#) service call data and [Human Services Resource Guide](#) listings of services offered in Reston (and Herndon) are also included. Demographics data were collected from the [US Census Bureau](#).

A Note About Neighbors

In assessing the state of service delivery in Reston, particularly in the western part of the community, it must be acknowledged that the needs of Herndon residents should be taken into account for planning and decision-making. There are a greater number of families and individuals in Herndon that face challenges than reside in Reston. The immediate area under consideration for redevelopment is near the Reston-Herndon boundary and it is logical to expect that Herndon residents in need will avail themselves of services in the area.






Estimated percent of the population age 65 years and older between 2009-2013,






Demographics: Population with Disabilities



Count of the civilian noninstitutionalized population age 18 to 64 years old with a disability who were unemployed and not in the labor force between 2009-2013.


Unemployment by ZIP Code





Median Household Income

Estimated percent of population age 5 and older for whom Spanish is the language spoken most often at home between 2009-2013.








Head Start Centers located in FCPS Elementary Schools in 2013.









SOL Pass Rate – 6th Graders





Lake Anne Elementary School SY 2014-15





Sunrise Valley Elementary School SY 2014-15





The Fairfax County 6th Grade Youth Survey School Year 2014-2015 is a comprehensive, anonymous, and voluntary survey that examines behaviors, experiences and other factors that influence the health and well-being of the county's youth, which in turn, affect their performance in school. The statistics presented here are selected from 6th grade survey responses at all elementary schools that comprise the South Lakes High School Pyramid.









Percent Families Receiving SNAP Benefits Overlaid with Retail Outlets and Farmers' Markets that Accept SNAP EBT Payment




Number of People Without Health Insurance





Estimated percent of homeowners whose housing costs (mortgage, taxes, insurance and utilities) exceeded 30% of income between 2009-2013.




Current and Projected Growth of Housing Units by Census Tract






Housing Unit Growth




Vehicles Per Household

Estimated percent of workers age 16 years or older who commuted to work using public transit in 2009-2013.



Of the people living in this area in between 2009-2013, **72.51%** are White, **10.15%** are African American, **14.41%** are Hispanic, **10.73%** are Asian, **0%** are either Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander, **0.32%** are American Indian or Alaskan Native, **2.96%** are of "some other race" and **3.33%** are of two or more races.
