Pre-Disaster Recovery Planning

Fairfax County, led by the Office of Emergency Management (OEM), began work on a countywide initiative to develop a Pre-Disaster Recovery Plan (PDRP) in December 2009. This project is to identify gaps, break down barriers and build community partnerships that will allow for a smoother recovery should Fairfax County ever face a catastrophic disaster.

Fairfax County is committed to ensuring not only that stakeholder interests are considered throughout the Pre-Disaster Recovery Planning process, but that nonprofit and private sector partners help drive and define the outcomes. One way we are working toward fulfilling that commitment is to hold periodic public working group sessions, along with topic-based focus groups, workshops and steering committee meetings.
