### **CHAIRMAN'S MATTERS**

- Mr. Bouie thanked Mr. Plattenberg for reaching out to the Board to explain the process and the rationale for the later start times for high school students. There is still quite a bit of work to do because this has an impact on Parks and there are things that Parks needs to work through. Bill noted that he looks forward to working with the School Board on a common cause.
- Mr. Bouie thanked everyone for coming out to the Lake Fairfax Water Mine expansion groundbreaking ceremony on Saturday, July 19.
- This week marks the celebration of the opening of the Silver Line. It is a major deal for the county and for Parks because it will move a lot of citizens around the county into the west side of the county. It will at some point increase demand on our parks on that side of the county. Mr. Bouie congratulated everyone that made the Silver Line happen and invited everyone to come out and enjoy the festivities on Saturday, July 26.
- Mr. Bouie congratulated Mr. Sullivan on his Democratic Party primary victory for delegate in the 48th district of Virginia and wished him the best of luck in the election on August 19. When the Board meets on August 20 it will be able to congratulate him as he makes his way to Richmond.

### **DIRECTOR'S MATTERS**

- Mr. Kincannon reported that prior to the Board and Committee meetings he, Mr. Quincy, and staff met with Ms. Evans, School Board Liaison to the Park Authority Board, related to the smoke-free effort. FCPS is going to jump onboard and will work toward smoke-free fields and playgrounds at its facilities. He thanked Ms. Baldwin and Mr. Quincy for their effort. This is a great collaboration and an easy win for the kids and users of our facilities.
- The Park Authority is well-represented in the summer 2014 edition of Virginia Parks & Recreation magazine. The glossy magazine contains not one but two FCPA stories under the headings "News From Fairfax County" and "News From Fairfax County Park Authority." Inclusion in this edition is particularly important because it has information about the 60th

Annual Conference slated for December in Hot Springs, Virginia, which is of interest to VRPS members.

Deputy Public Information Officer Matthew Kaiser's story about a park supervisor, Rebecca Boone, who trains puppies to assist disabled adults can be found on pages 10-11.

Stewardship Communications Manager David Ochs' story about Belvedere Elementary School students working with our Invasive Management Area program can be found on pages 12-13. Both stories dig beneath the surface to look at the people and partnerships that make our park system so special.

- Cox Conserves Heroes is an awards program created by Cox Enterprises and The Trust for Public Land (TPL) that honors volunteers who create, preserve, or enhance the shared outdoor places in our communities. Clint Fields, Vice President for the Friends of Green Spring (FROGS) was nominated to represent the Northern Virginia region. He has been an active board member of Friends of Green Spring (FROGS) for nearly a decade; he has been a key player in creating community connections and strengthening the organization's long-term financial sustainability; and he volunteers weekly to teach students visiting FROGS on school trips and also trains other volunteers to expand the program's reach. As a finalist for the region he won \$2,500 to benefit his environmental nonprofit of choice, Friends of Green Spring.

## **BOARD MATTERS**

- Mr. Khan left the meeting at 8:30 p.m.
- Mr. Gorham thanked Ms. Baldwin, Mr. Kincannon for attending and Ms. Pedersen for planning a really wonderful ribbon cutting ceremony at Collingwood Park. This event was really special for him and reminded him what really motivates him and why he is here. The sight of a little boy who before the festivities began jumping on the little yellow-spring rider and the smile on his face was absolutely priceless. It made the entire event for him absolutely delightful. He thanked staff and Judy for the wonderful remarks and coordination.
- Mr. Batten was absent.
- Ms. Cortina was absent.
- Mr. Strickland reported that he met on Friday, July 18, with Supervisor Frey. Supervisor Frey would like to take a motion to the Board of Supervisors asking that the Park Authority investigate the feasibility of having a west county trail. Mr. Bowden and Ms. Cronauer were at the meeting, as well as a representative from Transportation and Mr. Niedringhaus. While this is something Parks has been working on, Mr. Strickland didn't want the Park Board to be surprised when it came up in the Board of Supervisors' meeting. The trail would tie into the Cross County Trail.

- Mr. Thompson had nothing to report.
- Mr. Vajda reminded everyone to get out to the Spotlight by Starlight Summer Concert series at Mason District Park. While he hasn't seen everyone out there yet he hopes that as we approach the vacation season the Board members will look at the schedule and see what's remaining. There are concerts at Mason District Park every Sunday, Wednesday, and Friday and Saturday morning there are concerts for the children. The biggest event of the season was recently held. Capital Steps performed to a group of about 800.
- Ms. Leggett Quintana announced that she too will be at the opening of the Silver Line and will be one of the first people to ride on the train. As her day job is working with transportation issues she has worked for the better part of 12 years with elected officials to bring this project home. It is a very exciting time and she agrees with Mr. Bouie that this is going to be a game changer for the region. A project like this can really be a benefit economically and for the quality of life.

She visited Our Special Harbor and everyone was waiting in line under the shade canopy. The canopy is beautiful, colorful, and gives one a nice feeling as one walks into the facility. It's amazing what a simple thing like that can do not only for the appearance but for practical coverage for disabled children who are waiting to get into the park. She thanked Mr. Bowden for getting the canopy installed.

Ms. Quintana visited the Water Mine for the first time, however, not for the groundbreaking. She sent a nice note to staff and the leadership team thanking them for such a great experience. The professionalism, the cleanliness, and the overall experience is something that Parks should try to achieve at all of its facilities. She was very impressed with the professionalism and vigilance with regard to safety. It really sets the bar for everything Parks does. It seemed that the young people working there were having a good time. The facility is obviously well-loved and she had a great experience.

Ms. Pedersen and her team have done a great job publicizing the Pirate Fest at Lake Fairfax Park which will be held on Saturday, July 26. Her circle of friends is all talking about it on Facebook and is planning to participate. This is going to be a very popular event.

- Mr. Quincy reminded everyone about the 66th Annual Fairfax County 4-H Fair and Carnival at Frying Pan Farm Park July 31 through August 3. The ceremony is going to take place on Saturday, August 2, at 10 a.m. He encouraged everyone to take the time to go to the fair. It's a worthwhile event. Everyone reads about the negative things that kids do, but this overshadows it all. This is very inspiring to see what these kids do and to see how enthusiastic they are.

- Mr. Bouie encouraged everyone to get out to enjoy the summer concerts and added that this is the greatest season at Wolftrap. Everyone should also take the opportunity to get out to Wolftrap.
- Mr. Bouie called attention to the scouts in the gallery and asked them to introduce themselves. Two Boy Scouts from Troop 1346 in Burke were there for a badge requirement, adding that they were in favor of the later start times for schools.

A scout from Troop 673 was also attending for a badge requirement. He noted that he is not in favor of a later start time.

Mr. Bouie asked their mothers if they would like to introduce themselves. Mr. Bouie thanked the boys and their moms for coming and told them they were welcome to come back any time.
