




## LAUREL HILL GREENWAY

is part of the countywide trail plan. It is also a component of the Cross County Trail which stretches across the county from south to north. It links the Occoquan River in the south with Pohick Stream Valley, Accotink Stream Valley, and Difficult Run Stream Valley to the Potomac River at Great Falls Park in the north.

This section of the CCT runs between the Occoquan River and Pohick Road for a distance of approximately 4.5 miles. Mile Markers as shown on the map are approximate. There are numerous access points for this section of trail from various park sites throughout Laurel Hill parkland, at the Occoquan Park marina, and from neighborhoods along the trail as shown on the map. The trail surface varies – parts are asphalt, parts are asphalt with parallel stonedust, and a few sections are natural surface or stonedust. The trail varies in steepness, with a few sections in the north being quite steep.

There is a large steel frame bridge across Giles Run and a fairweather crossing of South Run. The trail goes under the historic, brick barrel bridge at Furnace Road. There are at-grade crossings of Lorton Road, Silverbrook Road, Pohick Road, and several subdivision streets and interior park roads.

As of winter 2009, there is a temporary detour around the Lorton Arts Center to the trail paralleling Route 123 and then back into parkland.

At the northern end, the trail connects to the sidewalk on Creekside View Lane. A crosswalk at Pohick Road leads to the asphalt trail along the road, across the highway bridge, and to a natural surface path down into the Pohick Stream Valley.

There is parking at various locations through the Laurel Hill parkland and parking as well as restrooms and water at Occoquan Park and the Lorton Arts Center.
