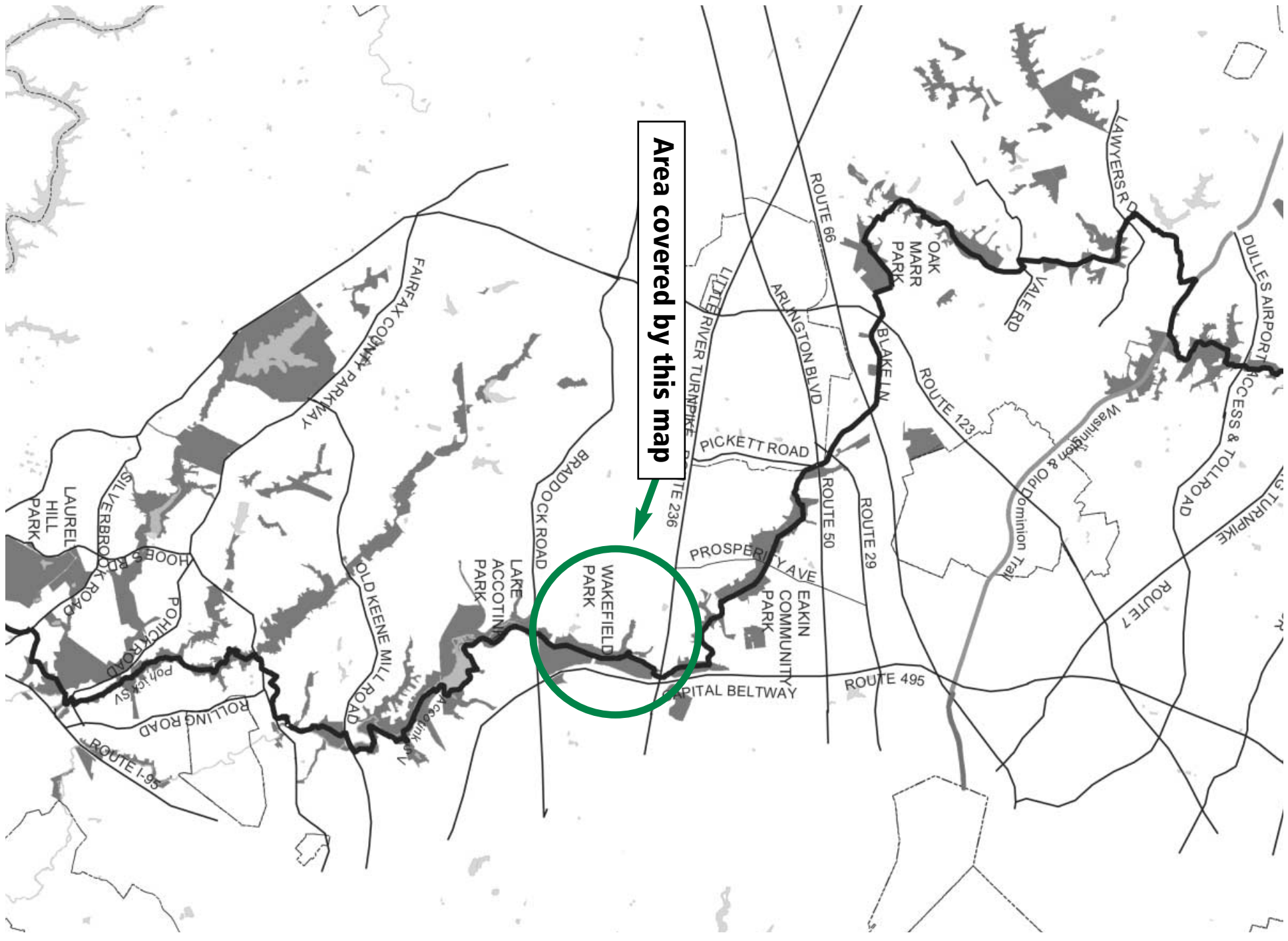


Wakefield Park Trails

Location Map

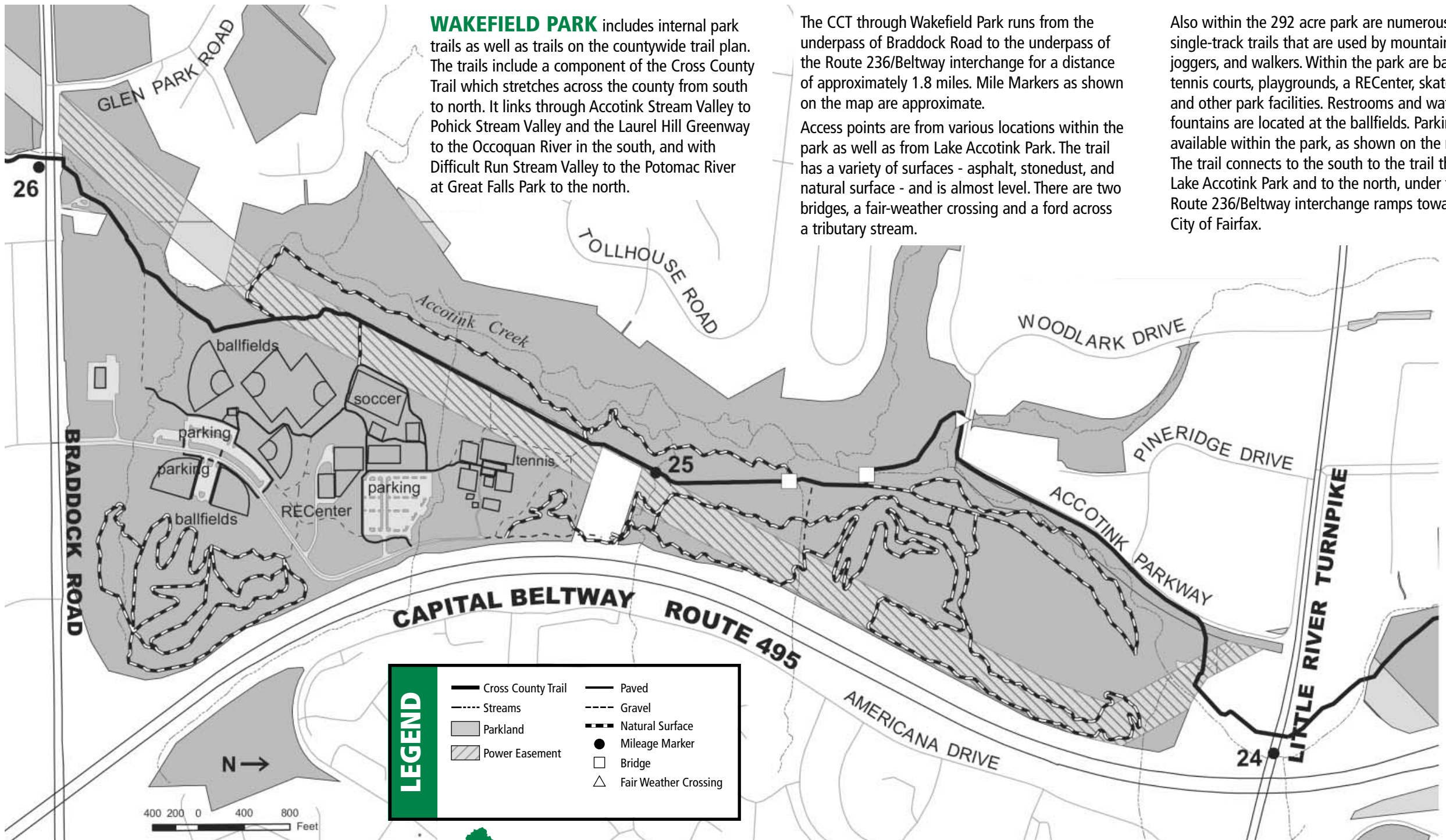


WAKEFIELD PARK includes internal park trails as well as trails on the countywide trail plan. The trails include a component of the Cross County Trail which stretches across the county from south to north. It links through Accotink Stream Valley to Pohick Stream Valley and the Laurel Hill Greenway to the Occoquan River in the south, and with Difficult Run Stream Valley to the Potomac River at Great Falls Park to the north.

The CCT through Wakefield Park runs from the underpass of Braddock Road to the underpass of the Route 236/Beltway interchange for a distance of approximately 1.8 miles. Mile Markers as shown on the map are approximate.

Access points are from various locations within the park as well as from Lake Accotink Park. The trail has a variety of surfaces - asphalt, stonedust, and natural surface - and is almost level. There are two bridges, a fair-weather crossing and a ford across a tributary stream.

Also within the 292 acre park are numerous single-track trails that are used by mountain bikers, joggers, and walkers. Within the park are ballfields, tennis courts, playgrounds, a RECenter, skate park, and other park facilities. Restrooms and water fountains are located at the ballfields. Parking is available within the park, as shown on the map. The trail connects to the south to the trail through Lake Accotink Park and to the north, under the Route 236/Beltway interchange ramps toward the City of Fairfax.
