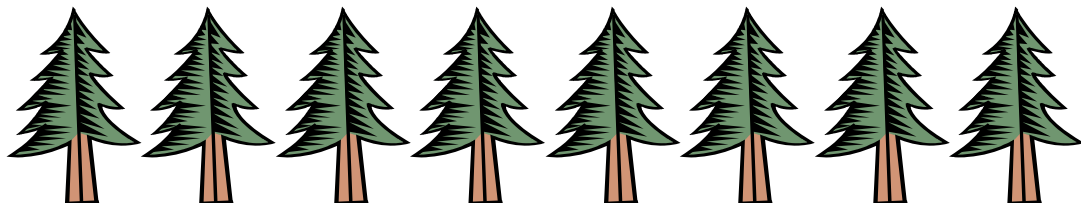

We have enjoyed many changes at Pinecrest over the past few months. You may have noticed our new sign in the clubhouse. This is where all the daily information can be found—daily fees, cart fees, hours of operation, twilight hours, etc. We will also provide information on current events on the board—tournaments, course maintenance, etc.

Another new item is our power carts. We received 22 brand new power carts in the middle of April. These carts operate the same as the old ones but have a canopy on the back to cover your clubs from rain, are embossed with the Pinecrest logo and seem to have a little more 'get up & go'!!

We have also made tons of improvements on the course. Probably the most noticeable are our new fences between 7 and 8 and the one next to the dam. These were designed, cut & built by hand by Frank Northrop. He did an outstanding job and worked outside on the coldest days of the winter. Thanks Frank, they're gorgeous. Frank also built the new steps at 6 and 7 tees. We had asphalt put down at 6 to make the path a little wider and to channel the rain water away from the tee. Fran, Ernie & Mary Ellen will be planting flowers around the steps as soon as the flowers come in.

All the ball washers have been upgraded not only for aesthetic value but also to make them a little more user friendly. The irrigation system is an on-going process but is now fully functional. With all the rain we've had lately, we may not need to use it!!

Bunker restorations will begin in the near future. We're starting with the bunker at 9 green. It'll be cleared of old sand, the filtration system will be upgraded and then replaced with nice, new white sand.

## Summer Tournaments

### June

Father's Day Tournament, 15 Sunday, 9am. Prizes awarded in each division and for closest-to-the-pin. Advance reservation required. \$50/team (excludes riding cart). Rain date, June 22.

### July

Summer Skills Shootout, 26 Saturday, 6:30am - shotgun **start**. 9-hole individual stroke play tournament (13 yrs. & up). The top 10 low gross scores will enter a 9-hole shootout afterwards. Prizes awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place and for closest-to-the pin contests. Tournament entry fee is \$30 (excludes riding cart). Registration deadline, July 19. Limited to the first 48 players. Rain date, August 2.

### August

Arnie's Army Battles Prostate Cancer Fundraiser, 27 Wednesday, All day. Individuals participate in a closet-to-the-pin contest. Proceeds go to the Prostate Cancer Foundation. This day only, golfers have the option to enter the contest for \$20, which includes a one-year subscription or renewal to Golf Digest, a Lamkin grip, a logo hat and information about the fight against prostate cancer. Prizes awarded to the closest 3 golfers. Reservations and tee times are not required.

### September

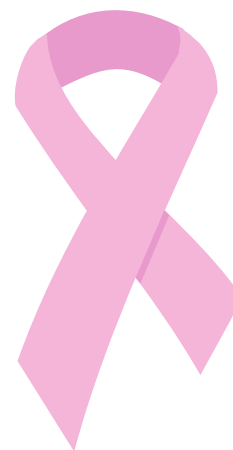

Tournament entry fee is \$50 (excludes riding cart). Advance registration required. Rain date, October 5.
