INTERNSHIPS AT GREEN SPRING GARDENS



Green Spring Gardens is a 31-acre public garden with 1784 Historic House that offers themed gardens for enjoyment, education and inspiration.

Requirements: Applicants must be enrolled in a two year, four year or graduate horticulture, botany, environmental education, history, museum education or similar degree program, as appropriate. Internship responsibilities may include developing a project proposal, conducting project activities and presenting a written and oral project report.

Compensation: Interns will be temporary, part-time employees of the Fairfax County Park Authority. Compensation is \$10.95/ hour for up to 300 hours. Start and end dates are negotiable.

INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Horticulture Internship

The intern will work in a variety of gardens including the edible, swale and waterwise gardens as well as the shrub and perennial borders.

VA Native Plant Internship

The intern will focus on the Virginia Native Plant Garden and the adjacent riparian woodland. Potential projects include invasive plant management and native plantings in the natural areas.

Horticulture/Plant Shop Internship

The intern will assist with maintenance of garden areas, including a large rock garden and conservatory, and assist the propagation/plant shop team.

Farmers Market SNAP Outreach Internship

The intern will act as a liaison between the SNAP at Market Program and the Farmers Markets and will implement SNAP at Market outreach strategy.

Children's Education Internship

The intern will assist with planning and conducting plant-based nature programs, including summer camps, for children and families.

Historic Resources Internship

The intern will research and document aspects of the site's history and local history and use the information to develop historical interpretive programs and exhibits for the public.
