

**2012 CULTURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT INTERNSHIP AT
HUNTLEY MEADOWS PARK,
FAIRFAX COUNTY PARK AUTHORITY**

This internship is designed to give interested college students and recent graduates the opportunity to work with professional park staff at Historic Huntley, a restored federal period villa and a 1500 acre wetland preserve. The house, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, was built by Thomson Mason, grandson of George Mason. The preserve occupies the land then used by Mason for farmland. The intern will specifically focus on developing education programs, writing interpretation materials, and presenting pilot programs. In addition, because this internship is funded by Friends of Historic Huntley, participants will learn how volunteer groups can work in concert with government institutions.

PERIOD: 10 weeks / 20 hours a week; June 4 through August 10, 2012

Interpretive Planning

Assist with development of interpretative programs for school and scout groups visiting Historic Huntley, focusing on matching Virginia standards of learning (SOLs)

Research

Conduct research pertaining to programs developed for Huntley through web and book searches and interviewing park historians.
