

**2016 HISTORICAL INTERPRETATION INTERNSHIP AT  
HISTORIC HUNTLEY/HUNTLEY MEADOWS PARK,  
FAIRFAX COUNTY PARK AUTHORITY**

This internship is accompanied by an award from the park's Friend's group and is designed to give an interested college student or recent graduate the opportunity to work with professional park staff at Historic Huntley, a restored Federal period villa. Historic Huntley is part of Huntley Meadows Park, a 1554-acre wetland preserve. The house, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, was built by Thomson F. Mason, grandson of George Mason. Huntley Meadows Park occupies land used by Mason for agriculture. The intern will specifically focus on developing and presenting education programs and conducting a research project relevant to Historic Huntley. Significant amount of time working with children and volunteers.

**PERIOD:** 12 weeks / 40 hours a week; May or June through August 2016

Assist with development and expansion of interpretative programs for Historic Huntley and related history programs for the historic house and park.

### Research

Conduct digital, oral, and archival research related to the history of the Historic Huntley house, park, and surrounding communities.

Assist with history camps, history tours, and other summer programs.
