Open House Highlights New Facility

Stop By Wagstaff Conference Room at Sully Historic Site

Sully Historic Site’s new Visitor’s Center is having an Open House for the Eddie Wagstaff Conference Room. Stop by on Thursday, September 10, 2015 from 4:30 p.m. until 6 p.m. or on Saturday, September 12 from 3 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. to see why this recently added conference room is the perfect place for your organization’s next meeting, training, or team building event. Speak with our staff, enter to win door prizes, enjoy some light refreshments, and learn about how we can make your group’s event special or how you can host your next birthday party there.

The Wagstaff Conference Room is named in honor of Edward “Eddy” Wagstaff, Sully’s first curator and the main person that helped save Sully from destruction in the late 1950’s when Sully and several other properties were going to be destroyed to make room for nearby Dulles Airport. “Eddy” also kept the property open and toured visitors around for several years before the Park Authority could fully staff the park and restore the beautiful buildings. Find out more about the history of the property at the open house.

The private conference room is ideal for team meetings. It comfortably accommodates approximately 16 people, with flexible seating and table space. At the Open House, see some of the additional options available, like audio-visual equipment, light refreshments, or tours of the historic house and grounds.

Sully Historic Site is the 1794 home of northern Virginia’s first congressman, Richard Bland Lee. Until 1811, Sully was home to the Lee family as well as over 30 enslaved African-Americans. Sully is operated by the Fairfax County Park Authority as a historic house museum and includes extensive grounds and outbuildings.

Sully Historic Site’s Visitor’s Center is located at 3650 Historic Sully Way, Chantilly, VA 20151, off Rt. 28 (Sully Road) ¼ mile north of Rt. 50 and 5 miles south of the Dulles Toll Road.
