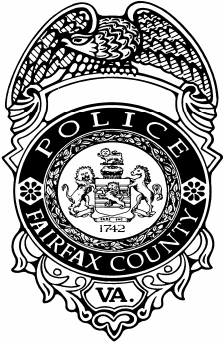

Within the sections, incidents are organized by station, then by type of offense. They are listed alphabetically by street address.

Addresses shown indicate blocks and not specific locations. Thus an entry showing Chain Bridge Road 4100 would mean the 4100 *block* of Chain Bridge Road, not the address 4100 Chain Bridge Road.

An asterisk (*) before an item indicates that an incident report was distributed on that offense.

Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****HOME INVASION ROBBERY**

Sheals Court

5600

*Four adults were inside a home on Sheals Court in Centreville when three armed, masked men forced their way into the house, on Wednesday, February 6 shortly before 1 a.m. The victims were threatened with handguns and possibly a hammer. The suspects demanded money and fled after receiving an undisclosed amount of cash. None of the victims was injured. All three suspects were described as black, about 6 feet tall, weighing between 185 and 200 pounds. All suspects were dressed in black.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)

No major incidents were reported.

MCLEAN DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 3)**SEXUAL ASSAULT**

Lee Highway/George Mason Road

*On Tuesday, February 5 at 7:45 p.m. a 29-year-old Falls Church-area woman was abducted and assaulted near Lee Highway and George Mason Road. The victim was walking on Lee Highway on the sidewalk and talking on her cell phone when she was attacked. The suspect grabbed her and touched her inappropriately. He fled the scene and she was not injured. The suspect was described as unknown race, approximately 5 feet 8 inches tall and 200 pounds. He was wearing a black mask, black long sleeve shirt, dark pants and tennis shoes. Detectives are working this case with the possibility that it is connected to a series of attacks with similar characteristics and suspect description. The public is asked to keep personal safety in mind at all times. Be alert. Someone not paying attention to their surroundings makes an easier target. Be confident. Walk with a purpose. ARMED COMMERCIAL ROBBERY

Graham Road

2800

*On Saturday, February 2 around 9:30 p.m., two men robbed a 39-year-old Annandale employee of the Dollar Store at 2802 Graham Road. One suspect pointed a handgun at the victim and demanded money. He also threatened two patrons of the business with the gun and ordered them to the floor. The second suspect stood by the door. The victim handed over an undisclosed amount of money and the suspects fled. There were no injuries. The armed suspect was described as Hispanic, about 5 feet 11 inches to 6 feet tall. He weighed about 170 pounds and wore a black pea coat, khaki pants, black sneakers and a black ski mask. The second suspect was

described as white, also 5 feet 11 inches to 6 feet tall and 170 pounds. He wore a gray, hooded sweat shirt, blue jeans, a black bandana and black sandals with white socks. Both suspects were between 20 and 30 years old.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING

Graham Road/Graham Court

A 29-year-old Falls Church-area man was assaulted on Tuesday, February 5 near Graham Road and Graham Court. The victim watched his wife walk to a nearby store and saw the suspect put his arm around her. The victim confronted him and the suspect hit him with a broken bottle. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The suspect was described as Hispanic, about 30 to 32 years old. He was about 5 feet 6 inches tall and weighed 140 pounds. He wore a gray sweater, white T-shirt and dark pants.

ROBBERY

Nutley Street

3000

A 20-year-old Fairfax-area man was robbed as he walked in the 3000 block of Nutley Street on Saturday, February 2. The victim walked past three men around noon and one of them brandished a knife. The suspects demanded his wallet and cell phone. The victim complied and was not injured. The suspects fled with the victim's belongings. They were described as Hispanic, in their 20s. One suspect was about 5 feet 6 inches tall and weighed about 250 pounds. He had long hair and wore a black, long sleeve T-shirt and blue shoes. The armed suspect was bald and had a tattoo on his neck. He wore a blue jersey and blue and white shoes. The third suspect wore a light blue sweat shirt and jeans. All of them had blue and white bandanas.

BURGLARY/ASSAULT/ARREST

Virginia Lane

7600

Two men went to check on an unoccupied property on Sunday, February 3 around 7 p.m., in the 7600 block of Virginia Lane. When they arrived, they discovered a man had allegedly broken in and was staying in the house. The men confronted the suspect and detained him until police arrived. The suspect punched the two Clifton men, 44 and 38 years old, but remained on the scene for questioning. The victims were not injured. Jamaar Sumter, 28, of no fixed address, was arrested and taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with burglary, destruction of property and two counts of assault.

MASON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 4)

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ASSAULT BY MOB

Patrick Henry Drive

2900

Police responded to the Virginia Hospital Center for a 22-year-old Falls Church-area man who had been stabbed. The victim and a female friend were walking up the stairs in a building in the 2900 block of Patrick Henry Drive on Sunday, February 3 around 2:30 a.m. They were approached by five Hispanic men, one with a machete. The suspects demanded the victim's

wallet and when he did not comply, they attacked him. The victim was stabbed and sustained non life-threatening injuries. His friend drove him to the hospital after the suspects fled. They were described as being 25 to 30 years old with shaved heads. The armed suspect was about 5 feet 11 inches tall and wore a white T-shirt and gray pants.

ARMED ROBBERY

North Rosser Street

3700

*A 32-year-old man was robbed at gunpoint on Wednesday, January 30 at around 11:30 p.m. He was walking in the 3700 block of North Rosser Street when he was approached by a man with a gun. The suspect demanded money. The victim gave the suspect his wallet, and the man fled. There were no injuries. The suspect is described as a black male in his early 30's. He was wearing a black knit cap, a black and white checkered bandana, a black jogging jacket, and a pair of long, dark shorts.

BRANDISHING

Leesburg Pike

5100

A man walked in to the Cash Advanced store at 5100 Leesburg Pike on Saturday, February 2 at 9 a.m. He gave the clerk his name and while the 21-year-old Alexandria-area woman was checking the computer, the suspect pulled out a handgun and pointed it at her. She ran out the back door of the business and called the police. The suspect was gone when officers arrived. Nothing was taken and no one was injured. The suspect was described as black, about 45 years old. He was about 5 feet 6 inches tall and weighed 190 pounds. He wore a black baseball hat, black jacket and black pants.

IMPERSONATING POLICE/PETIT LARCENY/ARREST

Leesburg Pike

5700

On Friday, February 1 at 3:45 p.m., a woman was seen leaving the Best Buy store at 5799 Leesburg Pike allegedly with a stolen portable DVD player in her bag. The loss prevention officer approached her to inquire why she activated the exit alarm. The suspect flashed some sort of badge and left the store. Officers responded to take the report and also viewed the surveillance footage. The next day, the suspect was seen by those same officers soliciting for money at the corner of Route 7 and Route 50. They approached her and Bambi Coates, 38, of no fixed address, handed over a fraudulent FBI badge and claimed to be employed there. Coates was arrested and the investigation led to charges of impersonating a police officer, petit larceny and soliciting without a license. She was taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

RESTON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 5)

ARMED ROBBERY

Gingell Place

2200

*A 42-year-old Herndon woman was robbed at gunpoint in the 2200 block of Gingell Place as she was walked towards her home. The robbery occurred Friday, February 1 around 10:30 p.m.

Two men approached the victim, one displayed a handgun and the victim surrendered her purse and ran. There were no injuries. Both suspects were described as Hispanic and between 18 and 20 years old. The armed suspect was approximately 6 feet tall and wore a light-colored jacket. The other suspect was approximately 5 feet 7 inches tall and wore a dark jacket.

SERIAL BURGLAR ARRESTS

Reston area

*Six houses in the Reston area of Fairfax County were broken into during a three week period beginning December 23, 2007 and ending on January 16, 2008. Personal property including electronics, computer equipment and guns were stolen from the homes. This was an apparent organized, coordinated effort on the part of all suspects involved. A joint investigation with officers and detectives from the Reston District Criminal Investigation Section, the Reston District Selective Enforcement Team, the Gang Unit, the Criminal Investigation Bureau and the Tactical Unit, resulted in the apprehension of seven suspects. A considerable amount of stolen property, including firearms, was recovered. Jerome Sheppard, 21, of Manassas was charged with three counts of burglary and two counts of grand larceny. Jesse Terry, 18, of Reston, was charged with two counts of burglary and two counts of grand larceny. Jivon Bryant, 22, of Herndon, was charged with one count of burglary. Michael Green, 22, Jose Veloso, 22, and Nechelle Wooten, 22, all of Reston, were each charged with one count of receiving stolen firearms. One juvenile was charged with two counts of burglary.

FRANCONIA DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 6)

SHOOTINGS/ARREST

Franconia Road

6100

Franconia Road/Frontier Drive

*Shortly before 3:30 a.m. on Saturday, February 2, Fairfax County police officers responded to a call for a shot person in the area of the Franconia District Police Station located at 6121 Franconia Road. Officers found two Hispanic men in the front parking lot with apparent gunshot wounds. They were transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. Both sustained gunshot wounds to the upper body. At about the same time, a trooper with the Virginia State Police attempted to initiate a traffic stop on a vehicle traveling westbound on Franconia Road near the intersection of Fleet Drive. The vehicle failed to stop and a pursuit ensued. The suspect vehicle crashed a short time later at the intersection of Franconia Road and Frontier Drive. By this time, Fairfax County officers as well as officers from The Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Police had responded to assist the trooper. When the suspect vehicle came to rest, the driver exited and pointed a gun at the officers. There was a brief exchange of gunfire and the suspect was shot. No Fairfax County officers sustained injuries. The suspect sustained one gunshot wound to the midsection, was taken into custody and transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with life-threatening injuries. Three Fairfax County police officers, one Virginia State trooper and two Metro Transit officers fired their weapons during the subsequent exchange of gunfire. The Fairfax County police officers involved in the shooting have been placed on routine leave while parallel administrative and criminal investigations are conducted. During the early morning hours of Sunday, February 3, Fairfax County police executed an arrest

warrant charging Jeffrey Scott Koger, 38, of 3004 LeeField Drive in Oak Hill, Virginia, with attempted capital murder of a police officer. He remains in custody at Inova Fairfax Hospital. Additional charges are possible pending further investigation. Fairfax County detectives have reason to believe that Koger is responsible for the shootings at the Franconia District Police Station however; a definitive connection will not be made until evidence has been completely analyzed. It is not known if there was any prior relationship between Koger and the two victims, or if there was any relationship between the two victims themselves.

BANK ROBBERY

Lorton Station Boulevard

8900

*The employees of the Wachovia bank at 8994 Lorton Station Boulevard were robbed by two men on Thursday, January 31 at 9:51 a.m. Armed with a pistol, one suspect jumped onto the counter and demanded money. The teller handed over an undisclosed amount of cash. The suspects fled and no one was injured. The suspects were described as black, wearing all black clothing. The armed suspect was about 5 feet 8 inches tall and thin. The second suspect was about 5 feet 6 inches tall with a medium build.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ARREST

Richmond Highway

10700

Several family members were gathered at the Skini Fatz bar at 10712 Richmond Highway on Sunday, February 3. Around 1 a.m., a fight broke out and a 27-year-old Dale City woman was stabbed. A 45-year-old Dumfries man was working as a bouncer and tried to break up the fight. He was also stabbed. Both victims were transported to a local hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The suspect was identified as Lisa Cannon, 42, of 14552 Eastman Street in Woodbridge. Two warrants were obtained for malicious wounding and served later that day. Cannon was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

ATTEMPTED MALICIOUS WOUNDING/SPEED TO ELUDE/DWI/ARREST

Manchester Boulevard

7000

Police responded to a fight at Bungalow Billiards, 7003 Manchester Boulevard, on Sunday, February 3 at 11:40 p.m. Witnesses directed officers to a van that was leaving the scene because one of the occupants allegedly had a gun. Two Springfield men, ages 27 and 29, got into a physical altercation with two other men when one of the suspects pulled out a gun and threatened the victims. The suspects then fled when police arrived. Another officer stopped the van after a short pursuit at Franconia Road and South Van Dorn Street. Carlton Phenev, 39, was arrested for driving while intoxicated and speed to elude. William Moten, 41, was also in the van and was arrested for drunk in public. Moten, of 3708 Edison Street and Phenev, of 8166 Bianca Place, both in Alexandria were taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. After further investigation, Phenev was also charged with attempted malicious wounding.

BURGLARY OF OCCUPIED DWELLING

Malone Ridge Street

A 24-year-old woman was watching TV in her apartment in the 5500 block of Malone Ridge Street when she heard a noise. This occurred on Friday, February 1 at 2 a.m. She went to investigate and saw a man inside the home. The victim screamed and locked herself in a bedroom. The suspect fled out the front door. There did not appear to be any forced entry and nothing was stolen. The suspect was described as black, about 5 feet 8 inches tall. He weighed approximately 185 pounds. He wore all black clothing and a round, black fishing-type cap.

WEST SPRINGFIELD DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 7)**SHOOTING/ROBBERY**

Gilroy Drive

*A 49-year-old man was robbed at gunpoint on Sunday, February 3 at approximately 5:05 p.m. The man had parked his car and was walking in the 8100 block of Gilroy Drive when he was approached by two men with guns. The victim handed over his wallet and other personal items and the two armed men fled the scene in a large, older model, light blue vehicle. The victim notified his family, then got into a dark blue SUV and attempted to follow the suspects. When he pulled next to the suspect vehicle near the intersection of Silverbrook Road and Lorton Road, one of the suspects allegedly shot the victim in the upper body. The victim drove home and called police. He was later hospitalized for his injuries. The two armed suspects were both described as black males wearing black clothing and black masks. One of the men was between 5 feet 9 inches and 6 feet tall with a medium build. The other man was approximately 5 feet 6 inches tall with a medium build.

ROBBERY

Hopkins Court

On Wednesday, February 6 at 8 p.m., a 15-year-old Springfield teen was robbed as he walked to his mailbox in the 7200 block of Hopkins Court. Two men came up behind the victim, told him not to move and removed his wallet and cell phone from his pockets. The suspects then ordered him to hand over his coat and shoes. The suspects fled on foot and the victim was not injured. The suspects were described as Hispanic, about 18 to 20 years old. They were both about 5 feet 11 inches tall and weighed 150 to 170 pounds. Both suspects wore black jackets, dark pants and blue bandanas over their faces.
