Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****ARMED ROBBERY**

Winding Oak Circle

13700

A 26-year-old Herndon man was robbed at knifepoint on Wednesday, May 28 around 9:30 p.m. The victim delivered a pizza to a home in the 13700 block of Winding Oak Circle and was walking back to his car when he was approached by two men, one displaying a small knife. The suspects demanded money. The victim handed over an undisclosed amount of cash and was not injured. The suspects fled toward Bent Tree Circle. The suspects were both described as black, in their late teens to early 20s. One suspect was approximately 5 feet 5 inches tall and weighed about 150 pounds. He had short, dark hair and a mustache. He was wearing a white shirt, dark pants and a white ball cap. The second suspect was approximately 6 feet 2 inches tall and weighed about 160 pounds. He also had short, dark hair. He was wearing a black shirt, black shorts, white socks and black sneakers.

ROBBERY/ASSAULT BY MOB/ARREST

Hamlin Court

4100

Two teenage boys allegedly assaulted a 33-year-old Chantilly man on Saturday, May 24. The victim was riding a bicycle in the 4100 block of Hamlin Court around 3:45 p.m. and encountered the teens. They knocked the victim off the bicycle and began assaulting him. The suspects stole his cell phone and money then fled. The victim was not seriously injured. Officers located a 16-year-old Chantilly boy and a 15-year-old Ashburn boy and determined them to be involved. Both were taken to the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center and detained on charges of robbery and assault by mob.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)**MALICIOUS WOUNDING**

Russell Road

8200

Police responded to a report of a stabbing in the 8200 block of Russell Road on Saturday, May 24 around 2:20 a.m. A 23-year-old man was reportedly walking in front of his apartment building when four men tried to rob him then stabbed him. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The suspects were only described as black.

RECKLESS DISCHARGE OF FIREARM/ARREST

Rolling Hills Avenue

3700

Officers from the Mount Vernon District Station Bike Team were patrolling the area near the 3700 block of Rolling Hills Avenue when they heard several possible gunshots. This occurred on Friday, May 23 just after midnight. During a search of the area, six shell casings were located. An investigation led officers to question Brandon Carter, 28, who lived in the area, and

determine the shots were not directed and anyone. He subsequently was arrested and taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Carter, of 3709 Rolling Hills Avenue #B3, was charged with reckless discharge of a firearm.

DROWNING

Fairchild Drive

*On Saturday, May 24, police were called to the pool at the Meadow Woods apartment complex, located at 7111 Fairchild Drive, for a drowning. The first officer to arrive located a 19-year-old lifeguard performing CPR on a 23-year-old man. The officer took over CPR until medic units arrived. Joseph Lansana, of 7204 Fairchild Drive #202 in Alexandria, was transported to Inova Mount Vernon Hospital and pronounced dead. Police determined that Lansana jumped in the deep end of the pool. A short time later, he went under water and did not come up. The lifeguard and Lansana's friend jumped in and pulled him to the surface but Lansana was unable to be revived.

DEATH

Richmond Highway

*An unattended body was found at approximately 8:10 p.m. Thursday, May 22 in a patch of shrubbery near 8743 Richmond Highway. An autopsy revealed no obvious signs of foul play or trauma and toxicology tests are pending. He apparently died of natural causes. The deceased has been identified as William Alton McVaney, 50 of no fixed address.

ARMED ROBBERY

Lee Highway

*A 38-year-old, Vienna woman, working as a clerk at the Rite Aid, at 7395 Lee Highway, was robbed at gunpoint. A man entered the store on Saturday, May 24 shortly after 8 p.m. He approached the clerk, pointed a gun at her and demanded money. The victim handed over an undisclosed amount of cash and was not injured. The suspect fled on foot, headed west on Lee Highway. The police helicopter and a K-9 team responded to search the area. The suspect was described as white or Hispanic, in his 20s. He was approximately 5 feet 8 inches tall and weighed about 165 pounds. He was wearing a black jacket, khaki pants, a black hat and a blue bandana partially covering his face.

STOLEN VEHICLE/ARREST

Bridle Path Lane/Old Bridge Road

On Wednesday, May 28 shortly after 3:30 a.m., an officer attempted to stop a car on Bridle Path Lane near Old Bridge Road. The occupants bailed out and fled on foot into the neighborhood. One of the suspects was apprehended a short distance away by a K-9 team. The vehicle had been reported as stolen in Prince William County. The suspect who was apprehended is a 17-year-old juvenile and petitions are pending. Police are still investigating.

MALICIOUS SHOOTING/ARRESTS

South George Mason Drive 3800
 Police arrested two men for allegedly shooting at a 31-year-old Alexandria-area man and his car. Concerned citizens called police shortly after 3:30 a.m., on Friday, May 16 after hearing gun shots near the 3800 block of South George Mason Drive. The victim met one of the suspects at a restaurant nearby and struck up a conversation. The two walked to the rear of a building when Mohamoud Hassan, 24, allegedly pulled out a gun a fired it into the air. The victim ran to his car and heard more shots, one striking his car. He drove away uninjured. An investigation revealed Hassan was joined by Sultan Ahmed, 22, who reportedly stored the gun in his car. Hassan, of 9242 Okla Drive in Fairfax, and Ahmed, of 3127 Antrim Circle in Dumfries, were both arrested on Sunday, May 25 at the Mason District Police Station, where they turned themselves in. They were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Hassan was charged with attempted malicious wounding, shooting a missile at an occupied vehicle and use of a firearm in the commission of a felony. Ahmed was charged with being an accessory to an attempted malicious wounding.

VEHICLE TAMPERING

Montrose Street 6500
 Fifteen school buses parked at Holmes Middle School, 6525 Montrose Street, were vandalized some time between Saturday, May 24 and Tuesday, May 27. Most of the damage consisted of broken windows and stolen fire extinguishers. Police are still investigating the case.

ARMED ROBBERY

John Eppes Road 2500
 William Short Circle 2500
 *Fairfax County Police are investigating two armed robberies in the Reston area which occurred within minutes of each other on Friday, May 23 around 12:30 a.m. The first occurred in the 2500 block of John Eppes Road and the second occurred in the 2500 block of William Short Circle. A 25-year-old Herndon-area man parked his car and began walking to his apartment on John Eppes Road. A man walked toward him, pointed a gun at him and demanded money. The victim relinquished an undisclosed amount of money and the suspect fled. Moments later, a 27-year-old Herndon-area woman was sitting inside her car with a 25-year-old man, also from the Herndon area. They were parked on William Short Circle when a man approached and tapped on the window. The occupants did not acknowledge the man so he opened the door and pointed a gun at them. The suspect ordered them to hand over their money. The victims did not comply and the suspect fled. There were no injuries in either of the robberies. The suspect was described similarly in both incidents. He was white or Hispanic, about 25 years old. He was about 5 feet 10 inches tall and weighed 130 to 150 pounds. He wore a red, hooded sweat shirt, dark baseball cap and a black mask in the second robbery.

Stratford House Place

11700

*A Maryland man was robbed at gunpoint in the 11700 block of Stratford House Place on Friday, May 23. The 47-year-old victim exited his car and was walking across the parking lot with a friend around 9:45 p.m., when the suspect pointed a gun at him. The suspect ordered the victim to relinquish his wallet. The victim handed the suspect an undisclosed amount of money. The suspect then walked away. There were no injuries. The suspect was described as white, approximately 16 to 18 years old. He was about 5 feet 10 inches tall and weighed 170 pounds. He was wearing baggy jeans, a dark, multicolored, hooded jacket and a dark baseball cap.

South Lakes Drive/Soapstone Drive

*A 32-year-old Reston woman reported being robbed while walking on South Lakes Drive. The victim was on the sidewalk near Soapstone Drive on Thursday, May 29 at 3:45 a.m. when the suspect appeared. The victim was pushed to the ground and the suspect demanded money, while implying he had a gun. He took property and cash. The suspect fled and the victim was not injured. The suspect was described as black, in his 20s. He was approximately 6 feet tall and 175 pounds. He was wearing a black sweater and dark jeans.

INDECENT EXPOSURE

Olde Crafts Drive/South Lakes Drive

*A man exposed himself to a 37-year-old Reston woman on Sunday, May 25. The victim was walking on Olde Crafts Drive near South Lakes Drive around 5:30 a.m. A man rode up on his bicycle and offered to carry her bag. She declined and continued walking to a bus stop. The man followed and parked across the street. He exposed himself and began masturbating. The victim called police and he fled. The suspect was described as Hispanic, between 20 to 25 years old. He was approximately 5 feet 3 inches tall and 130 to 150 pounds. He wore a blue and white, striped shirt and faded blue jeans.

ASSAULT ON POLICE/ARREST

Old Keene Mill Road

Officers were called to the Starbucks coffee shop at 7110 Old Keene Mill Road on Monday, May 26 for a report of a man with four tomahawks. The officers arrived around 2:45 p.m. and encountered the man. When they asked to speak with him, he reportedly raised his weapons and walked toward the officers. One officer deployed the conductive energy device (CED), causing the man to drop the tomahawks. The suspect, William Lusby, Jr., reached for his waistband and the second officer deployed another CED. Lusby continued to disregard commands and was subsequently struck by an officer's baton. He was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was not injured. Lusby, 64, of 6212 Hanover Avenue in Springfield, was charged with assault on a police officer.

BRANDISH FIREARM/UNLAWFUL ENTRY/ARREST

Cannon Lane

Police were called to the 5800 block of Cannon Lane on Monday, May 26 around 11 p.m. for a 22-year-old man who was allegedly threatening family members with a shotgun. The man was later identified as Gregory Festa, of no fixed address. He was apparently asked to leave the home by his 47-year-old mother and then pointed a gun at her. Festa saw the police helicopter monitoring overhead and pointed the shotgun at the aircraft. He then broke into an apparently vacant home in the 3700 block of Towanda Road. A short time later, an officer spotted Festa walking on Sunbury Drive and apprehended him. He was charged with two counts of brandishing a firearm, unlawful entry and drunk in public. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

ARMED ROBBERY

Loisdale Road

6700

*An 18-year-old Manassas man, working at the Central Newstand at Springfield Mall Square, 6701 Loisdale Road, was robbed at gunpoint. A man entered the store shortly after 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, May 24. He approached the clerk and displayed what appeared to be the handle of a gun. The suspect demanded money and the victim handed over an undisclosed amount of cash; he was not injured. The suspect fled on foot, running east on Spring Mall Road in the direction of Frontier Drive. The police helicopter and a K-9 team responded to search the area. The suspect was described as black, in his 30s. He was approximately 6 feet tall and weighed about 170 pounds. He had black hair, brown eyes and was clean shaven. He wore a burgundy T-shirt and blue jeans.

Backlick Road

*Two men from the Springfield area, one 26 years old, the other 30, were robbed at gunpoint on Monday, May 26 shortly after 3 a.m. The victims were walking in the 5700 block of Backlick Road when they were approached by two men, one displaying a handgun. The suspects demanded money; the victims handed over an undisclosed amount of cash and were not injured. The suspects fled in a white Buick Riviera with Virginia license plates. An investigation led police to the 4700 block of Care Dr in the Franconia area. Two suspects were located, identified and arrested. Christopher Quander, 22, of 4403 Groombridge Way in Alexandria, and George Jones, 20, of 6150 Old Brentford Court in Alexandria, were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Quander was charged with robbery, use of a firearm in the commission of a felony and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Jones was charged with robbery.

*A "Click it or Ticket it" traffic stop led to the arrests of two men after an alert officer detected drugs. Around 4:35 p.m. on Monday, May 26, a patrol officer stopped a vehicle at Fair Lakes Parkway and Oak Creek Lane in the Fair Lakes area. While talking to the sole occupant, Alex Reznik, the officer noticed a strong odor, believed to be marijuana, emanating from his car. Further investigation led the officer to Reznik's residence. Officers spoke with Reznik's roommates and further investigation led to the arrests of Reznik and one roommate, Adam Graham. Both men were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Alex Reznick, 23, of 12152 Monument Drive #490 in Fairfax, was charged with possession of marijuana, operating a vehicle with expired tags and failing to wear a seatbelt. Adam Graham, 20, of 12152 Monument Drive #490 in Fairfax, was charged with possession with the intent to distribute marijuana, possession of hashish, possession of a fictitious driver's license and three counts of possession of a schedule II controlled substance.
