**MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)****ARMED ROBBERY**

Richmond Highway

6700

\*A man was walking southbound in the 6700 block of Richmond Highway around 1 a.m. Wednesday, June 4 when he was approached by two men. One of the men produced a gun and demanded cash. The victim complied, handed over his money and the suspects fled. There were no injuries. One of the suspects was described as approximately 5 feet 5 inches tall, black and in his 20's. He was wearing a blue shirt and tan pants. There was no description provided of the other suspect.

**ROBBERY**

Beacon Hill Road

2600

An officer was flagged down by a 20-year-old Fredericksburg man who claimed to have been robbed in the 2600 block of Beacon Hill Road. This occurred on Sunday, June 1 just after midnight. The victim and a friend were walking when about five teens yelled for them to stop. They stopped and the suspects pushed the victim down and began assaulting him. They ripped his wallet out of his pocket and fled. The victim was not seriously injured. The case is still under investigation.

Richmond Highway

Police responded to a report of a robbery in the 8700 block of Richmond Highway on Friday, May 30 around 9:30 p.m. A 39-year-old Alexandria-area man was robbed by a man who asked to use his cell phone. The request was denied and the victim walked away. He was confronted again by the suspect, who punched him in the stomach and stole his wallet. The suspect fled and the victim was not injured. The suspect was described as black, in his 20s. He was about 6 feet tall, weighing 180 pounds. He had long, braided hair and wore a white T-shirt, red hat and blue jeans.

**MCLEAN DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 3)****ARMED ROBBERY**

Arlington Boulevard

6600

\*A 26-year-old Annandale-area man was robbed on Tuesday, June 3 while working at a local hotel. The employee was sitting behind the front desk of the Governor Motor Hotel, located at 6650 Arlington Boulevard in the Falls Church area, around 10:40 p.m. A man walked in the rear door and immediately demanded money from the victim. The suspect walked behind the counter, pointed a handgun at the victim and again demanded money. The victim complied and the

suspect fled out the rear door. No one was injured during the robbery. The suspect was described as Hispanic and about 6 feet tall. He was 165 pounds with short, black hair and a light complexion. He was wearing a long sleeve, black shirt, black pants, black gloves and a blue bandana covering his face.

##### **ARMED ROBBERY**

Arlington Boulevard

\*A 44-year-old Fairfax man was robbed at gunpoint Friday, May 30 around 2:45 p.m. at his place of business. The robbery occurred at the Joseph A. Banks clothing store at 7259 Arlington Boulevard in Loehmanns Plaza Shopping Center. The suspect displayed a pistol and demanded money from the cash register. The victim complied, the suspect fled and no one was injured. The suspect is described as black with a medium build and medium height. He was wearing a blue jogging outfit with a hood and a black bandana covering his face.

##### **MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ARREST**

Carlyn Court

3300

On Saturday, May 31 around 10:20 p.m., two men allegedly assaulted a 44-year-old Falls Church-area man in the 3300 block of Carlyn Court. He was taking out his trash when one of the suspects, with a chain wrapped around his fist, allegedly hit the victim in the face. The suspects fled into a nearby apartment. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. Officers identified one of the suspects as Modesto Martinez, 37, of 5913 Leesburg Pike #8 in Falls Church. Martinez was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with malicious wounding.

##### **ATTEMPTED BURGLARY/GANG PARTICIPATION/ARREST**

Birch Lane

4800

Police responded to a report of a burglary at a home in the 4800 block of Birch Lane on Thursday, May 29. A 21-year-old man was home at 12:30 p.m., when the suspect allegedly attempted to pry open a rear window. The victim heard a noise coming from the back of the house and went to investigate. He saw a man standing outside and confronted him. The suspect ran away and the victim called police. An officer spotted the suspect at Cherokee Avenue and Patuxent Way and placed him under arrest. Efrain Valle, 20, of 4509 Duke Street in Alexandria, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with attempted burglary, possession of burglarious tools and gang participation. Valle was also served with two unrelated, outstanding warrants from another jurisdiction.

##### **FATAL CRASH**

Hummer Road/Gallows Road

\*A 57-year-old Delaware man was killed on Wednesday, June 4 when a tree fell and crushed the 1995 Toyota 4Runner he was riding in. The driver, a 62-year-old Annandale man, was driving

south on Hummer Road just past Gallows Road around 3:10 p.m. during a thunderstorm with high winds and heavy rain. The impact of the tree killed Huu Dai Pham instantly and he was pronounced dead on the scene. The driver was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries.

#### **ATTEMPTED ABDUCTION**

Welch Court/Buckhaven Court

\*A 19-year-old Hayfield-area woman was grabbed by a man as she was jogging on Friday, May 30 around 11 p.m., near Welch Court and Buckhaven Court. The victim saw a man in a dark green pick-up truck drive pass her several times and eventually park. The driver got out of the truck, ran toward her and grabbed her in a bear hug. The victim was able to fight off her attacker and run away unharmed. The suspect ran back to his truck and fled on Welch Court, toward Broadmoor Street. The victim was not able to clearly identify the suspect's race. He was between 6 feet 3 inches and 6 feet 11 inches tall. He was wearing work boots and a hooded sweat shirt. The truck was possibly a Ford with a large cab, carrying a lawnmower in the back.

#### **HOME INVASION ROBBERY**

Metropolitan Center Drive

6700

\*A 64-year-old Springfield woman and her 21-year-old live-in aid were the victims of a home invasion robbery. On Wednesday, June 4 shortly before 10 a.m. the woman was in the living room of her apartment in the 6700 block of Metropolitan Center Drive; her aid was in his bedroom. The female victim answered a knock at the door and was confronted by two men, one brandishing a handgun. Both suspects wore long-sleeved shirts with "Verizon Wireless" logos. Both victims' hands were bound. The suspects ransacked the apartment, taking an undisclosed amount of cash, jewelry and electronics. The victims were not injured and the suspects fled. The victims were discovered by a building maintenance man who then called police. The suspects were both described as Hispanic men in their early 20s. One suspect was approximately 5 feet 10 inches tall, with a medium build. He wore a white, button down shirt and blue jeans. He had dark hair and dark eyes. The second suspect was approximately 5 feet 7 inches tall, with a thin build. He wore a black, button-down shirt, dark pants, a skull cap and sunglasses.

#### **ROBBERY**

Brookfield Plaza

7000

A 45-year-old Springfield man was robbed in front of a 7-Eleven store at 7000 Brookfield Plaza, on Saturday, May 31. He was leaving the store about 11:55 p.m., when two men demanded money from him. The victim refused and called police. The suspects assaulted him and fled. The

victim was not injured. The suspects were described as black, between 17 and 21 years old. The first suspect was about 6 feet tall and wore a black T-shirt and black pants. The second suspect was approximately 5 feet 9 inches tall and wore dark clothing.

Frontier Drive

Police arrested three people for robbing a 53-year-old Alexandria-area woman in the Franconia-Springfield Metro parking garage on Tuesday, June 3. The victim was on the fifth floor of the garage about 5:30 p.m. when she noticed a male and two females standing next to her car. As she attempted to get in her car, the male demanded money. The victim refused and the suspect got a knife from one of the females and again demanded money. The victim opened her purse and handed them an undisclosed amount of money. The suspects fled and were later arrested. A 16-year-old Hyattsville, Maryland boy and a 15-year-old Chevy Chase, Maryland girl were released to guardians and are awaiting charges. Ikea Lanham, 19, of 3935 Martin Luther King, Jr. Avenue in Southwest Washington, D.C., was also arrested and taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where she was charged with robbery.
