Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****OBSTRUCTION OF JUSTICE/ARREST**

Popes Head Road

11100

On Wednesday, May 21, a detective received information that a private school official did not report an alleged abuse of a student by a family member to law enforcement authorities about the alleged abuse of student by a family member. An investigation revealed the suspect was reportedly notified of the allegation on Monday, May 12 at the Islamic Saudi Academy, in the 11100 block of Popes Head Road, and did not contact police. Abdulla Al-Shabnan, 52, of the 7300 block of Old Dominion Drive in McLean, was charged on Monday, June 9 at the Mount Vernon District Police Station, after turning himself in. He was charged with failing to report an alleged child abuse and obstruction of justice.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)**ARMED ROBBERY**

North Kings Highway

6200

*A 38-year-old Manassas man, working as an employee of Colortyme Rent To Own, 6230-F North Kings Highway, was robbed at gunpoint on Saturday, June 7. Shortly after 8 p.m., a man displayed a handgun and demanded money from the employee. The victim handed over an undisclosed amount of cash and was not injured. The suspect fled on foot out the rear of the business. The suspect was described as black, approximately 5 feet 10 inches tall, weighing about 200 pounds. He had dark hair, brown eyes and was wearing all dark clothing.

ROBBERY/ARREST

Fairchild Drive

7200

Police arrested a 20-year-old Woodbridge man for stealing the cell phone of an acquaintance, a 28-year-old Alexandria-area woman. They were in her apartment in the 7200 block of Fairchild Drive on Thursday, June 5 just after midnight when he allegedly grabbed the cell phone out of the victim's hand. She was not injured. Joell Ramirez Peveria, of 1906 Warren Drive, was arrested and taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where he was charged with robbery.

ROBBERY

Richmond Highway/Russell Road

On Thursday, June 5 just before midnight, police responded to Inova Mount Vernon Hospital for a 31-year-old Washington, D.C. man who was being treated for minor injuries sustained during a reported robbery. The victim was driving a car with a 19-year-old Alexandria-area woman in the passenger seat. Two men approached the car as it was at a stop light on Richmond Highway at Russell Road. One suspect reached in the passenger side and stole the woman's purse while the

second suspect went to the driver's side and pulled the man out of the car. Both suspects assaulted him and stole his wallet then fled. The victim drove himself to the hospital. The suspects were described as black, both wearing black jackets and black masks.

North Kings Highway

5800

A 48-year-old Herndon-area man was assaulted and robbed Monday morning after giving another man a ride home. The victim drove the suspect to the 5800 block of North Kings Highway around 3:45 a.m. on June 9. The two men exited the car and walked down a path where the suspect struck the victim, knocking him to the ground. The suspect demanded money and after a brief struggle the victim complied. The suspect fled in an unknown direction. The victim had minor injuries. The suspect was described as white, 30 to 35 years old. He was about 5 feet 11 inches tall and 140 pounds with short blond hair. He was wearing a white shirt and blue jeans.

Lockheed Boulevard

3100

On Monday, June 9 around 11 p.m., a 28-year-old Alexandria-area man was assaulted and robbed near the intersection of Lockheed Boulevard and Fordson Road. The victim exited the 7-Eleven store and headed west on Lockheed when he was approached by approximately eight black men. One of the men knocked the victim to the ground, then kicked and punched him. The suspect went through the victim's pockets and removed an undisclosed amount of cash. The victim sustained minor injuries. The suspect and the additional men fled on foot. The suspect was described as approximately 5 feet 6 inches tall, weighing about 160 pounds. He had dark hair and a mustache. He wore a gray T-shirt and blue jeans. There was no description of the other men.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING

Huntington Avenue

2300

A 27-year-old Kingstowne-area man was injured during a fight on Sunday, June 8. Police were called to the 2300 block of Huntington Avenue at 5:40 p.m. for a fight. Officers located the victim outside and determined he had a wound on the back of his head. An investigation determined the victim had an argument with two men at the shopping center. The suspects assaulted the victim and one suspect cut the victim with a box cutter. Both victims fled when a passerby came to the victim's aid. The victim was transported to Inova Mount Vernon Hospital and treated for minor injuries. The investigation continues.

OPERATION GRADUATION/DWI

Mount Vernon District

*Graduating seniors, their friends and all others are encouraged to celebrate safely in Fairfax County this weekend. Beginning Friday, June 13 through Saturday June 21, officers from the Mount Vernon Police District will be taking additional steps to ensure that the roads are as safe as possible during this "celebratory" time period. During Operation Graduation DWI, there will be additional patrols assigned to deter and apprehend intoxicated drivers. There will be sobriety checkpoints and mobile signs posted with DWI messages throughout the Mount Vernon Police District. Motorists stopped for suspicion of driving while intoxicated will undergo a field interview to assure that their abilities to drive have not been impaired by alcohol or drugs. The

Fairfax County Police Department takes the issue of impaired driving very seriously. This effort combined with ongoing DWI enforcement initiatives throughout the year, are designed to prevent alcohol-related crashes and keep the roadways safe.

ARMED ROBBERY

Arlington Boulevard

*A 24-year-old Falls Church-area woman was robbed at gunpoint Tuesday, June 10 around 1 p.m. at her place of business. The robbery occurred at a cellular phone business, E Z Cell, 6708 Arlington Boulevard. The suspect displayed a handgun and demanded money. The victim complied and the suspect fled the scene with an undisclosed amount of cash. There were no injuries. The suspect is described as approximately 6 feet 1 inch tall and 180 pounds. He was wearing a blue cap, a black ski mask, a white shirt, jeans, and a blue, hooded sweatshirt.

ROBBERY

Lee Highway/Regents Tower Street

On Saturday, June 7 shortly after midnight, two 20-year-old Fairfax women were robbed at Lee Highway near the intersection of Regents Tower Street. The victims were walking away from the Vienna Metro stop when they were approached by three women. One of the suspects punched one of the victims in the stomach and demanded money from both victims. An undisclosed amount of money, a cell phone, an mp3 player and other personal items were taken from the victims. They were not injured. The suspects fled on foot toward Nutley Street. The suspects were all described as black, 16 to 18 years old. One suspect was approximately 5 feet 8 inches tall with a medium build. She was wearing a yellow T-shirt, blue jeans and big, gold hoop earrings. The second suspect was about 5 feet 7 inches tall and was wearing a dark jacket and jeans. The last suspect was about 5 feet tall and was also wearing big, gold earrings.

ATTEMPTED ARMED ROBBERY

Barcroft View Terrace

3600

Two Falls Church-area men, ages 26 and 20, were the victims of an attempted robbery on Saturday, June 7. The two men walked into the Barcroft View Terrace apartment complex, located in the 3600 block of Barcroft View Terrace. The victims passed two men standing outside a parked car. The two men approached the victims from behind and demanded money. They punched them in the upper body. Both suspects produced knives when one of the victims fought back with a soda bottle. The victims escaped uninjured and the suspects fled in the car. The first suspect was described as Hispanic, 24 years old with short, spiky hair. He was about 5 feet 2 inches tall and 160 pounds. He was wearing a blue and white striped shirt and jeans. The second suspect was Hispanic, about 30 years old. He was 5 feet 6 inches tall and 200 pounds. He had a muscular build and his right arm had numerous tattoos. He was wearing a gray and white shirt and shorts.

FRANCONIA DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 6)**ARMED ROBBERY/SHOOTING**

Dakine Circle/Seatrend Way

*A husband and wife were robbed and the wife was shot once in the hand, shortly after 2 a.m. on the morning of Saturday, June 7. The victims arrived home in separate cars. The wife pulled into the garage on Dakine Circle while the husband pulled into the driveway and got out of his car. Three suspects, one armed with a handgun, knocked the husband to the ground and demanded money. The suspect with the gun went to the wife's car and knocked on the window. The victim refused to get out of the car and locked herself in. The suspect fired one round through the driver's window, striking the victim in the hand. The suspect reached into the car and grabbed the victim's purse. All three suspects fled toward Seatrend Way. The woman was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The three suspects were described as men of unknown race, wearing dark clothing.

ROBBERY/MALICIOUS WOUNDING

Rhoden Court

7000

On Saturday, June 7 at around 2:30 in the morning, a 34-year-old Springfield-area man was robbed and cut. The incident took place in the 7000 block of Rhoden Court. A man grabbed the victim by the shirt and stabbed him once in the upper body. The suspect ripped a gold chain from the victim's neck and fled on foot. The victim sustained non life-threatening injuries. The suspect was described as white, in his mid 30s, 5 feet tall and 180 pounds. He was wearing a white shirt and dark pants.

ROBBERY/ARRESTS

Cliff Drive

6700

Two teens were arrested on Friday, June 6 for allegedly robbing a 14-year-old Alexandria-area boy. The victim was in the cul-de-sac near the 6700 block of Cliff Drive when two males approached and demanded money. The victim complied then ran home to call police. He was not injured. Officers checking the area located the suspects at Lake Village Drive and Cliff Drive. A 17-year-old Springfield teen and a 13-year-old Alexandria-area boy were arrested and taken to the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center. They were both charged with robbery.

DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM

Randolph Drive

On Tuesday, June 10 around 4:30 p.m., police responded to the 4600 block of Randolph Drive for reports of shots fired. Investigating officers determined that Brian Tonsetic, 23, 4621

Randolph Drive, had allegedly discharged a .22 calibre rifle inside his home. Tonsetic was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where he was charged with discharging a firearm within a building and possession of an unregistered silencer.

BURGLARY

Pacific Lane 6900

On Monday, June 9 shortly before 2 p.m., two juveniles allegedly attempted to break into a home in the 6900 block of Pacific Lane. A 51-year-old man was home and heard a noise. When he went to investigate, he did not find anything suspicious. At about the same time, a passerby saw the suspects apparently attempting to open a window on the front of the house. The witness called 911. Police located the suspects, questioned them and eventually released them to their parents. Petitions are pending.

HOMICIDE

Paper Birch Drive 8000

*A 23-year-old man was found dead in his driveway around 10 p.m. Saturday, June 7 in the 8000 block of Paper Birch Drive. The victim, Faridullah Abbasi, had apparently come home, was confronted by someone and was subsequently shot in the upper body. Neighbors heard gunshots, saw the victim lying in his driveway and called police. The victim was flown to Inova Fairfax Hospital where he was later pronounced dead. An autopsy will be conducted this week. No suspect information has been released. This is the ninth homicide in Fairfax County in 2008.

GRAND LARCENY

Fullerton Road 7600

*Fairfax County Police are investigating a grand larceny of a catalytic converter from a vehicle. The suspect went to the C.S. Auto Service, Incorporated at 7640 Fullerton Road in the Lorton area on Monday, May 26 around 10:40 p.m. Surveillance cameras captured the suspect being dropped off as a second suspect drove off. The suspect stole the catalytic converter from a Nissan truck parked at the service station. The suspect vehicle appears to be an early 90s Ford Escort and may be blue in color. The driver's rear tire is the only one with a distinctive, small, moon hubcap. Two other catalytic converters were stolen from the same service station during the middle of April. Throughout the county, there were 78 reports of converter thefts from November 2007 until May 2008. Nine reports included multiple thefts from one location. Of the 78 reports, 135 converters were taken. Most occurred at auto repair shops. Toyota 4Runners were the most common vehicle targeted followed by Nissans.

BURGLARY

Donnybrook Court 7700

A 19-year-old Annandale-area man was arrested after allegedly burglarizing one apartment and attempting to burglarize two others. Police were called to the 7700 block of Donnybrook Court at

8 p.m. on Wednesday, June 11. Officers learned that the residents of one apartment went for a walk and left their front door unlocked. They returned a short time later and discovered items missing from inside. Further investigation led the officers to two other apartments in the same complex. The residents of those units reported that a man opened their front doors and quickly left when they confronted him. Police spotted the suspect as he exited the woods near the complex. After a short foot pursuit, the suspect was apprehended. Officers located the stolen items in the woods. Nicolas Antonio Romero, of 4343 Americana Drive #10 in Annandale, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with burglary, grand larceny and two counts of attempted burglary.

ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION

Animal Safety Information

*When the outside air temperature on Saturday, June 7 was 95 degrees Fahrenheit, Animal Control Officers rescued three dogs that had been left in cars in the extreme heat. Fortunately, all of the animals survived. A temperature test performed on Saturday by the County's Animal Services Division (ASD) revealed frightening results that could cause heat stroke and even death among pets left in cars exposed to the heat. After just 30 seconds on the 95 degree day, the

temperature in a passenger car in a parking lot rose to 107.8 degrees Fahrenheit. After 10 minutes, the temperature had approached 117.5 degrees.

“Pets in a car have no way to escape the heat,” says Michael Lucas, ASD Acting Commander.

“Even with the window cracked open, temperatures can soar leaving pets vulnerable and in a life-threatening situation.” The Fairfax County Animal Services Division asks residents to leave pets at home during hot summer months.

People who leave a pet in a car on a hot day could be charged with a class 1 misdemeanor for animal cruelty under the Code of Virginia §3.1-796.122.

Utterback Store Road

700 (Reston District)

A 1-year-old Alaskan malamute died on Monday, June 9 in the 700 block of Utterback Store Road after being left outside in 90 degree heat. Animal Control officers were notified after a concerned neighbor took it to a local vet, where it was pronounced dead. The owner, Dustin Baker, 21, of 730 Utterback Store Road, was charged with cruelty to animals. He was also petitioned for unfit owner proceedings.
