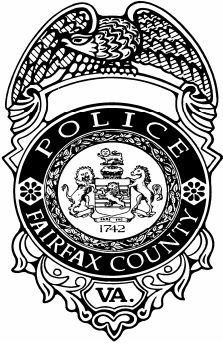

There are three sections in this report: Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS; Section II: PROPERTY CRIMES; and, Section III: ANIMAL RELATED INCIDENTS. Sections are appropriately identified. Within the sections, incidents are organized by station, then by type of offense. They are listed alphabetically by street address.

Addresses shown indicate blocks and not specific locations. Thus an entry showing Chain Bridge Road 4100 would mean the 4100 *block* of Chain Bridge Road, not the address 4100 Chain Bridge Road.

An asterisk (*) before an item indicates that an incident report was distributed on that offense.

Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****COMMERCIAL BURGLARY**

Brookfield Corporate Drive

4400

Police were called to 4449 Brookfield Corporate Drive at 9:33 p.m. on Friday, August 15 for an alarm activation. Officers checking the warehouse located a door slightly ajar and learned that a man had been seen running from the business moments earlier. The suspect was described as black, in his 20s. He was 5 feet 9 inches to 5 feet 11 inches tall and 155 pounds. Nothing was taken from the business.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ ARREST

Winding Ridge Lane

13000

*At 2:15 on the morning of Sunday, August 17, officers responded to the area of Federation Way and Singleton's Way in Centreville. They discovered four to five men allegedly had vandalized a car in the 13000 block of Winding Ridge Lane. Several people came out of the house to scare the vandals away. A fight ensued and a 39-year-old woman and 34-year-old man from the home were struck with BBs fired from a BB gun; the woman was additionally struck with a machete. These injuries were non life-threatening. Several others received minor injuries in the altercation. Officers and detectives made several arrests. Luis Jonathan Merino, 21, of 14141 Honey Hill Court and Josue Ernersto Palacios, 23, of 14145 Honey Hill Court were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with malicious wounding by mob and gang participation. Two male juveniles, both 17, were returned home. Additional charges are pending. Gang prevention, intervention and suppression continue to be a coordinated priority in Fairfax County. ROBBERY

Centreville Road

14200

A 24-year-old Chantilly-area woman was the victim of a robbery on Sunday, August 17. Police were called to the 14200 block of Centreville Road at 2:49 a.m. and located the victim outside a bank. Further investigation determined the victim used an ATM inside the bank lobby. When she exited, she was approached by a man who demanded money. The suspect grabbed the victim and knocked her to the ground. The two struggled until a passerby pulled up and scared the suspect away with the victim's cash. A police K-9 located the suspect nearby. Boris Nelson Salmeron, 23, of 14452 Rustling Leaves Lane in Centreville, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with robbery.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)**ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/ ASSAULT**

Fairview Terrace

2300

*A 20-year-old Alexandria-area woman was attacked in the 2300 block of Fairview Terrace on Thursday, August 14 shortly before midnight. The young woman left the Huntington Metro station and went to the nearby 7-Eleven store. She left and took a short-cut behind the store. She came out on Fairview Terrace where a man approached her. The suspect threatened her with a screwdriver and demanded money. The suspect grabbed the victim and attempted to pull her shorts down. The victim struggled and broke free without injury; the suspect fled toward Biscayne Drive. The suspect was described as being of unknown race, in his 20s to 30s, approximately 6 feet tall with a slender build. He was wearing a white T-shirt, jeans, gloves and a mask.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ ARREST

Audubon Avenue

7800

*Police were called to the 7800 block of Audubon Avenue just before noon on Sunday, August 17, for a stabbing. Officers located a 45-year-old woman and her seven-year-old son with apparent stab wounds. Both victims were transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital. The boy was treated and released; the woman was hospitalized for her serious injuries. Further investigation determined the incident was domestic in nature. The suspect fled the scene prior to the arrival of officers. However, around 1:30 a.m. on Monday, August 18 a passing motorist spotted the suspect near the intersection of Patrick and Duke Streets in the City of Alexandria. Alexandria City police responded and located Hinton on a park bench next to the ball field of George Washington Middle School. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with malicious wounding.

GRAND LARCENY AUTO/ ARREST

Richmond Highway

6300

Two people were arrested after they allegedly stole a car. A 43-year-old Alexandria-area woman was in a restaurant in the 6300 block of Richmond Highway at 8:20 p.m. on Monday, August 18. The woman left her keys on the table for a moment and when she returned she discovered they were gone. She saw a male and female get into her car and drive away. An acquaintance of the victim saw the vehicle leaving and followed it to the 2400 block of Fort Drive, where the suspects fled from the vehicle. Police responded and recovered the car, a 2005 Toyota Rav 4. A short time later, officers located the two suspects. Juan A. Leonard, 20, of 921 19th Street NE in Washington, D.C., was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with grand larceny auto. The female, a 17-year-old from Washington, D.C., was not charged.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING

Old Mill Road/Old Colony Way

A 27-year-old Fort Belvoir-area man was assaulted by an acquaintance, a 49-year-old man, around 9:40 p.m. on Tuesday, August 19. They had just dropped off a mutual friend in the 8800 block of Old Colony Way when the suspect attacked. The victim was stabbed once with a knife and punched repeatedly. The suspect fled the scene and was later located in the 9100 block of Richmond Highway. James Ray Stanley, of no fixed address, was arrested and taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where he was charged with malicious wounding. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital and treated for non life-threatening injuries.

ATTEMPT ROBBERY/ ASSAULT

Russell Road/ Main Street

Police were called to the area of Russell Road and Main Street at 1:30 a.m. on Wednesday, August 20 for an attempted robbery. The victim, a 48-year-old Alexandria-area man, was standing outside his car when three men approached and demanded his money and personal items. The victim attempted to defend himself as the three suspects physically assaulted him. The victim was able to run to a nearby business and the suspects fled without getting anything. The victim did not require medical treatment. The suspects were described as black, in their late teens.

ROBBERY

Colony Court

4500

At approximately 1:20 a.m. on Wednesday, August 20, a 26-year-old Lorton-area man was assaulted and robbed in the 4500 block of Colony Court. The victim was walking to a friend's apartment when he was approached by five to six men. They chased the victim, knocked him to the ground and began kicking him. One suspect went through the victim's pockets and removed his cellular phone and an undisclosed amount of cash. The suspects fled on foot. The victim sustained minor injuries. The victim could not provide a description of the suspects.

MCLEAN DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 3)

BANK ROBBERY

Dolly Madison Boulevard

1300

*Employees of the Cardinal Bank, at 1313 Dolly Madison Boulevard were robbed on Friday, August 15 shortly after 10:30 a.m. A man displayed a handgun, demanded money from one or more of the tellers and left the bank with an undisclosed amount of cash. There were no injuries. The suspect was described as black, in his mid 30s, approximately 5 feet 8 inches tall. He was wearing a dark blue jogging suit with white stripes, white sneakers, a white hat and a mask covering his face.

UNLAWFUL ENTRY/ DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY/ ARREST

Leesburg Pike

7400

Two men were arrested after they allegedly broke into a vacant home in the 7400 block of Leesburg Pike. A neighbor called police on Sunday, August 17, at 3:09 a.m. Officers learned that two men broke out a rear window and entered the home, which is currently unoccupied and under renovation. Police and a police K-9 made entry inside and located the two suspects hiding upstairs. Wilfredo Fernandez-Reyes, 35, of no fixed address, was arrested and transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital for treatment of a dog bite. Jose Nelson Cruz, 22, of 2227 Cedar Lane #104 in Vienna, was also arrested. Both suspects were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and both were charged with unlawful entry and destruction of property. An outstanding capias warrant for malicious wounding was also served on Fernandez-Reyes.

BIAS INCIDENT

Kirby Road

1700

*Police are searching for suspects in several cases of graffiti that were discovered in the McLean area on Sunday, August 17. Police were notified of the incidents by congregants of the First Baptist Church of Chesterbrook, 1740 Kirby Road at around 8:30 a.m. Officers responded to the church and observed that a racially inflammatory word had been spray painted in large block letters next to the front door of the church. Police canvassed the area, spoke with neighbors and discovered additional graffiti on surfaces at Chesterbrook Elementary School. Officers believe that the markings were made by the same person or groups of people at some time during the evening or early morning hours of August 16 or 17. Destruction of property is a Class I misdemeanor. Penalties include up to a \$2,500.00 fine and/or one year in jail. The Fairfax County Police Department recognizes the potential harm that bias crimes and incidents can have in a community, and consequently encourages people to report them. All bias crimes and incidents are investigated thoroughly.

MASON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 4)ASSAULT/ RESISTING ARREST/ ARREST

Leesburg Pike/South Jefferson Street

Police were called to the area of Leesburg Pike and South Jefferson Street for a fight on Thursday, August 14, at 8:25 p.m. Officers learned a woman was speaking with a cab driver about a ride when the suspect approached and began yelling profanities at her. The suspect then assaulted the cab driver, a 25-year-old Alexandria-area man. The second man, a 38-year-old from the Springfield area, attempted to help the first victim but was assaulted by the suspect as well. Police apprehended the suspect after a brief foot pursuit. Robert M. Williams-Dixon, 23, of 500 South Courthouse Road in Arlington, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with two counts of assault and resisting arrest. No one required medical treatment.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/ GANG PARTICIPATION/ ARREST

Glen Carlyn Drive/ Vista Drive

An alert patrol officer interrupted an attempted robbery on Saturday, August 16. The officer was patrolling the area of Glen Carlyn Drive and Vista Drive at 10:47 p.m. when he noticed a group of people gathered near the intersection. The officer determined two men were fighting and upon exiting his vehicle the crowd dispersed. The two men involved in the fight were detained by the officer. Further investigation determined that the victim, a 22-year-old Falls Church-area man, was walking near the intersection when he was approached by a large group of males. They reportedly demanded money from the victim but he declined. The primary suspect assaulted the victim and was interrupted by the officer. Edis Alvarado Gomez, 18, of 3401 Glen Carlyn Drive #9 in Falls Church, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with attempted robbery and gang participation. The victim did not require medical treatment.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

Wadsworth Court

4100

Police were called to the 4100 block of Wadsworth Court at 11 p.m. on Saturday, August 16, for a reported robbery. The victim, a 38-year-old Arlington man, was sitting outside on a patio talking on the phone. He was approached by a man who brandished a handgun and demanded money. The victim refused and the suspect fled on foot. No one was injured. The suspect was described as black, about 6 feet tall and 180 pounds. He was wearing a black ski mask, black long-sleeve shirt and black pants.

ROBBERY/ MALICIOUS WOUNDING

Patrick Henry Drive

3000

A 29-year-old Falls Church-area man was the victim of a robbery on Monday, August 18. Police were called to the 6100 block of Greenwood Drive for an assault. Officers located the victim with minor injuries to his upper body. Further investigation determined the victim was walking in the 3000 block of Patrick Henry Drive when he stopped to examine an abandoned bicycle. Two men appeared and struck the victim in the upper body with a baseball bat. The suspects reportedly took money from the victim and fled. The victim returned home and called police. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital and treated for his non life-threatening injuries. The first suspect was described as Hispanic, 5 feet 8 inches tall and 170 pounds. He was wearing jean shorts, a white Polo-type shirt and white sneakers. The victim could not describe the second suspect.

RESTON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 5)ROBBERY/ ABDUCTION

William Short Drive

2600

Police were called to the 2600 block of William Short Drive on Friday, August 15 at 2:53 a.m. Officers learned the victim, a 21-year-old Bristow, Virginia woman, ran into two acquaintances

at a Chantilly-area restaurant. Later in the night, she left with the two men to visit someone else. They were parked in the 2600 block of William Short Drive when one of the men demanded the victim's purse and cellular phone. The suspect covered the victim's mouth and held her down as he took money and personal items from her purse. He then returned the purse and forced her out of the car. The suspects fled and the victim called police about 30 minutes later to report the incident. She did not require medical treatment.

BURGLARY OF OCCUPIED DWELLING

Chatham Colony Court

Police were called to a home in the 1500 block of Chatham Colony Court on Sunday, August 17, at 12:56 p.m. for a reported burglary. Officers learned that two men, 24 and 28 years old, were asleep in different areas of the home. The 28-year-old awoke when an unknown female opened his bedroom door. The female fled downstairs and damaged items in the home before fleeing with a laptop computer. No one was injured. The suspect was described as black, with braids or dreadlocks. She was wearing an orange shirt and blue jeans.

GRAND LARCENY/ ASSAULT/ ARREST

Frontier Drive

Two men were arrested after they allegedly attempted to steal an iPod. On Thursday, August 14 at 1:30 p.m., the two men were inside the Best Buy store, located at 6555 Frontier Drive. Security employees watched the two men as they worked together to cut the alarm sensor off an iPod and conceal it. When the employees confronted the suspects they attempted to run. One suspect was apprehended but the other assaulted the employee and fled the store. Responding officers located the second suspect nearby a short time later. Marvin Mauricio Martinez, 21, of no fixed address, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with aiding and abetting the concealment of merchandise valued at more than \$200. Carlos Rodriguez, 22, of no fixed address, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with grand larceny, possession of burglarious tools and assault. The employee was not injured.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING

Commerce Street

7200

On Sunday, August 17 at around 5 p.m., police were called to an apartment in the 7200 block of Commerce Street for the report of a shot person. The investigation determined there had been a group of men in the apartment who began to argue over a business transaction. One person displayed a knife, another pulled out a gun and fired one round, striking an 18-year-old Springfield-area man in the upper body. The group fled as police responded. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The three suspects were all described as black, 20 to 30 years old. The investigation is ongoing. Detectives believe the victim and suspects are known to each other.

WEST SPRINGFIELD DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 7)**GRAND LARCENY/ NARCOTICS/ ARREST**

Middle Ruddings Drive/ Fifth Place

Police were called to the area of Middle Ruddings Drive and Fifth Place at 1:53 a.m. on Tuesday, August 19, for a vehicle tampering. Officers learned that an alert citizen watched as two males exited a waiting car and attempted to break into other cars in a neighborhood by pulling door handles. When the two suspects entered a parked car, the witness approached them and they fled. A female in the suspects' car drove away. Officers located the two suspects in the vehicle and the third suspect walking nearby. Further investigation determined the suspects were reportedly in possession of items stolen from other vehicles. In addition, one was in possession of drug paraphernalia. All three suspects were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Yusuf Benghuzzi, 18, of 6113 Lynley Terrace in Alexandria, was charged with grand larceny and possession of drug paraphernalia. Patrick Hayward, 18, of 5112 Celtic Drive #1 in Alexandria, was charged with grand larceny. Natasha Black, 19, of 6509 Walso Court in Alexandria, was charged with grand larceny. An outstanding warrant for an unrelated case was also served on Black.

Officers found three teenage boys in a car attempting to leave the pool. Further investigation determined the three suspects allegedly climbed a fence and entered the pool property. Rectory Lane/Heritage Drive

On Wednesday, August 20 around 2:30 p.m., a 23-year-old Montgomery Village-area man was assaulted and robbed near the intersection of Rectory Lane and Heritage Drive. The victim was

waiting in his vehicle at the intersection when two men approached him and demanded money. One suspect punched the victim while the second suspect brandished a black handgun. They took an undisclosed amount of cash and fled on foot. The victim received minor injuries. Both suspects were described as Hispanic, approximately 20-years-old with black hair. One suspect was about 5 feet 10 inches tall, weighing 130 pounds. He was wearing a light-colored hat, blue t-shirt and white jeans and had a mustache. The second suspect was about 5 feet 7 inches tall, weighing 200 pounds. He was wearing a black t-shirt with blue jeans.
