Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****ASSAULT ON FIREFIGHTER/ARREST**

Belcher Farm Drive

Police and rescue personnel were called to a home in the 5800 block of Belcher Farm Drive at 9:49 a.m. on Sunday, July 27 for an intoxicated man requesting medical assistance. The 53-year-old Centreville man requested transport to the hospital for a medical concern. At the scene, the man became belligerent and phoned 911 again requesting the medical services already at his home. However, as medical personnel attempted to assist him, he physically assaulted a firefighter. The suspect complied with police and was transported to Inova Fair Oaks Hospital for his medical needs. Charges are forthcoming.

BURGLARY/LARCENY/ARREST

Petitions are pending on a 17-year-old Clifton-area boy for a burglary at the Clifton General Store, located at 7140 Clifton Road. Police responded to the store for an alarm activation at 1:35 a.m. on Thursday, July 24. Officers discovered the store had been burglarized. While investigating the burglary, officers were asked to respond to a home in the Clifton area; the suspect wished to turn himself in to police. After further investigation, the suspect was turned over to his parents and petitions will be sought.

Police apprehended three juveniles who allegedly entered an open garage early Friday morning. Officers were called to the 6400 block of Rock Hollow Lane at 2:48 a.m. on July 25 for a burglary. An investigation determined the homeowner, a 43-year-old Clifton-area man, was alerted by an alarm sounding in his garage. He encountered the teens and chased them outside. The victim was able to catch one suspect, a 15-year-old Clifton-area girl, and brought her back to his home to call police. Further investigation led to the apprehension of two teenage boys who were also involved. Juvenile petitions will be sought against the three juveniles. Nothing was taken.

*An 11-year-old Centreville-area girl was with friends at the Centreville Square Shopping Center near the intersection of Saint Germain Drive and Centrewood Drive on Sunday, July 27. An unknown man walked by them in the parking lot about 3:30 p.m. The man grabbed her buttocks and walked away. There were no injuries. The suspect was described as Hispanic, in his 30s. He was approximately 5 feet 5 inches tall and 160 pounds. He was wearing a red ball cap, a yellow and orange Polo-style shirt and blue jeans.

*Detectives arrested Richard Hiner late Thursday evening during an investigation into a series of rental home scams. Between Sunday, July 13 and Friday, July 18, police were notified of four separate incidents where potential renters were defrauded of money after signing contracts on rental homes. In each case the victims found the rental homes advertised on Craigslist. After reportedly contacting Richard Hiner, the person in the ad, they toured the home, signed a rental contract and provided payment toward the rental. They later learned that Hiner was not affiliated with the properties and the homes were actually bank-owned and in foreclosure. Detectives acted quickly, posing as potential renters and responding to an online ad for a rental home. Hiner was arrested when he arrived for the meeting after detectives determined he had no affiliation with that property. Richard K. Hiner, 31, of 1585 Kacy Court in Catlett, Virginia, was arrested and charged with four counts of grand larceny by false pretense and three counts of burglary. This investigation is ongoing and detectives would like to hear from anyone who may have additional information on these rental home scams.

ROBBERY/ARREST

Sparrow Court

*A 30-year-old Alexandria-area man was robbed at gunpoint on Thursday, July 24. The victim was walking in the 3300 block of Sparrow Court around 9:30 p.m. when he was approached by a man who produced a hand gun and demanded money. The victim did not have any money to give. The suspect slapped the victim and fled with nothing. The victim was not injured. Officers searched the area and found the suspect. Wilfredo Rodriguez-Quinteros, 31, of no fixed address, was arrested and charged with robbery. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

Richmond Highway

*Police are seeking information regarding two suspects in a robbery that occurred Friday, July 25 at 12:30 a.m. at 8010 Richmond Highway. Two men entered the convenience store, displayed a handgun and demanded money. One of the suspects walked around the counter and assaulted the clerk, a 52-year-old Lorton man. The suspects then fled the area. The victim was transported to Inova Mount Vernon Hospital and treated for non life-threatening injuries. The suspects wore black T-shirts and blue jeans, were black and between 18 and 20 years old. One of the suspects was between 5 feet 6 inches and 5 feet 8 inches tall with an average build. He was armed with a handgun. The other suspect was between 5 feet 10 inches and 6 feet tall with an average build.

SEXUAL ASSAULT/ARREST

Richmond Highway

Police charged a 30-year-old Alexandria-area man after he allegedly sexually assaulted a woman Friday evening. Officers were called to a store in the 7600 block of Richmond Highway at 9 p.m. on July 25. An investigation determined a 19-year-old Alexandria-area woman accepted a ride from an unknown man while at a bus stop located on Fairhaven Avenue. She requested he drop her off at the store and as she exited the car he touched her inappropriately. The victim ran inside the store and the suspect followed her. The victim sought help from an employee who confronted the suspect. The suspect fled in the car. Police located the suspect, Juan M. Risco, of 3837 Miramonte Place. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with sexual battery.

ASSAULT ON POLICE OFFICER/POSSESSION OF COCAINE/ARREST

Sonora Place

Two police officers were assaulted during an arrest on Thursday evening. The officers were walking in the 3900 block of Sonora Drive around 9:30 p.m. on July 24. They made contact with two men and determined that one was apparently intoxicated. The officers attempted to arrest the man but he resisted and began to fight them. He was taken into custody after a short foot pursuit. Alphonso Olds, 42, of 2705 Arlington Drive #303 in Alexandria, was treated at the scene for minor injuries. He was then transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with two counts of assault on a police officer, possession of cocaine, resisting arrest, trespassing and drunk in public. One officer was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital and treated for non life-threatening injuries.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ARREST

Napper Road

3200

Petitions were obtained charging a 14-year-old Alexandria-area boy with malicious wounding after police responded for a stabbing Tuesday evening. Officers were called to the 2700 block of Mennifield Court at 9:40 p.m. on July 29. An investigation determined the victim, an 18-year-old Alexandria-area man, was involved in an argument with the suspect in the 3200 block of Napper Road. During the argument, the suspect produced a knife and stabbed the victim in the upper body. The victim fled nearby for help. Police located the suspect a short time later. He was transported to the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center where the petitions were obtained.

SEXUAL ASSAULT/ARREST

Engleside area

*Detectives arrested Timothy L. Champion, 30, of the Engleside area for sexually assaulting a 12-year-old girl. The victim, who lives in Woodbridge, was playing with a friend and Champion at an Engleside-area home. At some point in the early hours of Tuesday, July 29, he held the girl down, kissed her and touched her inappropriately. The victim and the other child immediately

left the house and called other family members for assistance. There were no injuries. Champion was taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with abduction with intent to defile, aggravated sexual battery and french kissing a child under the age of 13.

ROBBERY

Jefferson Avenue/Madison Place

Police are investigating a robbery that occurred around 11:20 p.m. on Sunday, July 27. The three victims, a 26-year-old Falls Church-area man, a 17-year-old Falls Church-area boy and a 16-year-old Annandale-area girl, were walking in the area of Jefferson Avenue and Madison Place when they were approached by a group of five or six males. The group asked for money and when the victims declined, the suspects produced a bat and knives. The two male victims immediately fled, leaving the female victim alone with the suspects. The suspects demanded her cellular phone and she complied. All the suspects fled on foot. No one was injured. All the suspects were described as Hispanic, in their late teens.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

Annandale Road

Two men visiting from California were the victims of a robbery on Sunday, July 27 at 11:35 p.m. The two men, 32 and 20 years old, were walking north on Annandale Road near Jefferson Avenue when three men approached them and demanded money. The suspects displayed knives when the victims did not comply. All three suspects ran north on Annandale Road. No one was injured. The suspects were described as Hispanic, in their late teens to early 20s.

BURGLARY

Cedar Lane

Police are investigating a burglary that occurred at Thoreau Middle School on Monday, July 28. School security responded to the school, located at 2505 Cedar lane, at 10:30 p.m. for an alarm. Inside the school, the guard encountered three teenage boys in the gymnasium. The suspects fled out the gym doors and left in two vehicles. The suspects could only be described as white. The vehicles were burgundy and silver sedans. Nothing appeared to be taken from the school.

ANIMAL CRUELTY/GRAND LARCENY/ARRESTS

Vale Street

*Fairfax County Police Animal Control Officers charged two women with two counts of grand larceny and six counts of animal cruelty on Thursday, July 24. Brenda Dodson, 30, of 7605 Centreville Road, Manassas and Sandra Cortes, 44, of 4004 Rose Lane, Annandale are being held at the Prince William Adult Detention Center in connection with previous charges filed by Prince William County Police. Fairfax County officers received a complaint on Friday, July 18

of several dogs kept in a vacant home at 6413 Vale Street, in the Alexandria area. The responding officers found six dogs, without food or water and the floors covered in animal urine and feces. After immediately providing water to the dogs, police began an investigation to determine who was storing dogs in the abandoned house. There was no power, ventilation or water service and the property was scheduled to be demolished. The six dogs were taken to the animal shelter, where some of the owners eventually showed up to claim them. Several owners claimed they had posted notices on Craig's List, in search of temporary pet care. Others were seeking good homes for dogs they could no longer keep. The suspects allegedly responded to these advertisements and took possession of the dogs under their company's name, Assisi Animal Rescue Organization. It is not known how long some of the animals had been under the care of the two suspects. The investigation is ongoing. There are still three dogs have not been claimed. The investigation has revealed that a white pitbull puppy, named Patches, is missing. Officers fear Patches may be in need of care and are seeking information on his whereabouts. Animal Control Services Supervisor Sergeant Andy Sanderson suggests pet owners looking for extended boarding or care consider the following tips:

- Know who you are leaving your pet with: family, close friends or close neighbors may be wise choices
- Ensure pet sitting service or kennel is bonded and insured
- Read ratings and reviews of pet sitting service companies that you are considering.
- Conduct tours of facilities.
- Check for a business license.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING

Vista Drive

A 28-year-old Falls Church-area man was injured during an altercation with a roommate on Saturday morning at 12:55 a.m. The victim and the suspect were drinking alcohol in their apartment, located in the 6000 block of Vista Drive on July 26. The man was walking along the 6000 block of Argyle Drive at 12:57 a.m. A red sport utility vehicle pulled up next to him and one man exited. He demanded property from the victim then grabbed him and threatened him with a knife. The suspect took property from the victim and pushed him to the ground. The suspect fled in the waiting car. The victim was not injured. The first suspect was described as black, in his 30s. He was about 6 feet tall and 200 pounds. He was wearing a black, short sleeve shirt and black pants. A 29-year-old Reston woman was the victim of a robbery and assault at 12:30 p.m., on Monday, July 28. The woman was walking her dogs along a path to the rear of the 11900 block of Winterthur Lane. She was approached by two men who initiated a conversation with her. One of the men produced a knife and demanded the victim's property. As she began to comply, the second man then grabbed the victim and assaulted her, pushing her to the ground. The suspects fled down the path on foot. The victim returned home and called police. She was transported to Inova Reston Hospital for treatment of non-life-threatening injuries. The suspects were both in their 20s. One was black, about 6 feet 2 inches tall and 170 pounds. He was wearing black pants, a black shirt and a black bandana. The second suspect was Hispanic, about 5 feet 11 inches tall and 190 pounds. He was wearing an orange shirt, blue jeans and white shoes.

NARCOTICS/ARRESTS

Columbine Street/Lunenburg Road

Two men were arrested after police responded for an overdose. Officers were called to Columbine Street and Lunenburg Road at 5:15 p.m. on Tuesday, July 29. Rescue personnel were evaluating a patient in need of medical attention. That patient refused further medical assistance and was released by medic units. Further investigation by officers led to the arrest of the two men. Amith J. *Police are investigating a convenience store robbery that occurred Thursday July 24. A 38-year-old Woodbridge man and a 41-year-old Lorton man were working in the Super High Mini-Mart, located at 7708 Gunston Plaza, at 10:32 p.m., when a man entered the store with a hand gun. The suspect pointed the weapon at one employee and demanded money. The victim complied and relinquished cash. The suspect then walked to the rear of the store. He found the second employee and forced him to unlock the rear door of the business. The victim complied and the suspect fled on foot. The suspect was described as white, in his 20s. He was about 5 feet 7 inches tall and 165 pounds. He was wearing dark-colored jeans, a royal blue jacket and a black mask.

ROBBERY/ARRESTS

Springfield Mall parking lot

*A 21-year-old man was beaten and robbed in the Springfield Mall parking lot on Friday, July 25 around 8:30 p.m. The Alexandria-area man was apparently followed to his car by a group of several young men. After a brief confrontation, the suspects punched the victim, produced a gun and demanded his money and belongings. The teenagers took the items and fled. The victim quickly located a police officer who coordinated an immediate search for suspects. There was a saturation of police officers in the Springfield area that night, staffing a crime prevention and gang deterrent initiative targeting criminal activity. Officers quickly apprehended several suspects. After making positive identification, police arrested four Oxon Hill, Maryland teenagers. The victim was transported to the Franconia District Police Station, where he was treated by medical personnel for non life-threatening injuries. Police charged each of the four teens with robbery and use of a firearm in commission of a felony: Askia Cuff, 19, of 1412 Fenwood Avenue, Robert Ramsey, 19, and Roderick Ramsey, 18 of 1404 Fenwood Avenue and a 14-year-old, also of Oxon Hill, Maryland. The suspects were transported to the Fairfax Adult Detention Center and the Fairfax Juvenile Detention Center. Detectives do not believe the robbery is gang related.

*Police have charged a 25-year-old Fairfax-area man for sexually assaulting a 1-year-old child. At 6:50 a.m. on Sunday, July 27, officers responded to Inova Fairfax Hospital for the assault. An investigation determined the assault occurred earlier in the morning at the banquet hall facility of the Annandale Boys and Girls Club, located at 6728 Industrial Road. The victim's parents were cleaning up after a late-night party to celebrate the victim's Christening. They left their sleeping child in the care of several family members in the same party room. One of those family members found the victim crying in the hands of an unknown man and took the child from him. The victim's mother checked on her child and discovered her injuries. The parents immediately took her to the hospital for treatment. Further investigation led to the arrest of Juan Miguel Sejas Castellon, of 3894 Bradwater Drive. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with one count of animate object penetration and one count of abducting an infant child with the intent to defile.

A 21-year-old woman was the victim of a robbery on Monday, July 28. The woman was walking north on South Van Dorn Street prior to Greendale Village Drive at 4:45 p.m. when a man in a vehicle approached her. He honked his horn and followed her briefly before he got out of the car and grabbed her purse. The suspect fled in the car. The victim was not injured. The suspect was described as Hispanic, 25 to 30 years old. He was about 6 feet tall and 150 pounds with a goatee. He was wearing black dress pants and a black button-down shirt. The vehicle was a black Ford pick up truck with chrome hubcaps.

WEST SPRINGFIELD DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 7)**FATAL CRASH**

Springfield/Franconia Parkway

*Police are investigating a fatal crash that occurred Friday, July 25 in the Springfield area. At 4:08 p.m., officers responded to the Springfield/ Franconia Parkway near Rolling Road for the crash. Preliminary investigation by Crash Reconstruction detectives determined that the driver of a Toyota Rav4 was traveling northbound on Route 7900 approaching Rolling Road. For unknown reasons, the driver crossed over the median and drove into the southbound lanes of traffic. The Rav4 collided head-on with a tractor trailer truck that was being operated southbound on Route 7900. A fire resulted from the collision. The driver of the Rav4 was pronounced dead at the scene. The driver of the truck was treated at the scene for minor injuries. The deceased driver of the Toyota Rav4 has been identified as Jessica Doubleday, 24, of 3301 Cannongate Road #103 in Fairfax. The truck driver was a 48-year-old Woodbridge-area man.

NARCOTICS/DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE/CREDIT CARD THEFT/ARRESTS

Fairfax County Parkway/I-95

An alert patrol officer arrested four people Sunday, July 27 around 3:30 a.m., after their erratic driving behavior led to a traffic stop. The officer was on routine patrol when a vehicle on Fullerton Road appeared to be suspicious. The driver appeared to have difficulty operating the vehicle.
