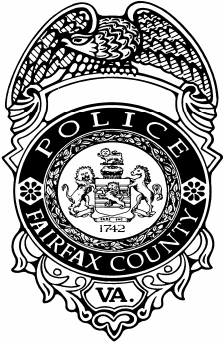

There are three sections in this report: Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS; Section II: PROPERTY CRIMES; and, Section III: ANIMAL RELATED INCIDENTS. Sections are appropriately identified. Within the sections, incidents are organized by station, then by type of offense. They are listed alphabetically by street address.

Addresses shown indicate blocks and not specific locations. Thus an entry showing Chain Bridge Road 4100 would mean the 4100 *block* of Chain Bridge Road, not the address 4100 Chain Bridge Road.

An asterisk (*) before an item indicates that an incident report was distributed on that offense.

Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****BURGLARY OF OCCUPIED DWELLING**

Deerwatch Drive

4600

The residents of a home in the 4600 block of Deerwatch Drive awoke to their alarm sounding on Thursday, August 7 at 2:50 a.m. The 46-year-old man went downstairs to investigate and discovered a window and sliding glass door standing open. Officers responded and determined that entry was made through the unlocked window. Items in the home were disturbed but nothing was taken. No one was injured.

ROBBERY

Chantilly Shopping Center

4300

Officers responded to a reported robbery at the Prime Mart at 4300 Chantilly Shopping Center just before 10 p.m. on Thursday, August 7. The clerk was behind the counter when a suspect entered the store. He pointed a handgun at the clerk and demanded money as two other suspects entered the store. The clerk handed over an undisclosed amount of money and the suspects fled. There were no injuries. All three suspects were described as black, with their faces covered. Two were wearing ball caps and one wore a knit cap.

UNLAWFUL ENTRY

Clubsides Lane

5400

A 19-year-old woman was startled by an unknown man inside a home in the 5400 block of Clubsides Lane. On Thursday, August 7 at 1:40 p.m. police responded to the home for an intruder. An investigation determined that the victim was in the kitchen when she heard the front door open. She went to investigate and found an unknown man in the hallway. The suspect ran and hid in a bathroom; the victim called police and fled the house. The suspect fled out the rear door of the home prior to the arrival of police. The suspect was described as white, in his 20s. He was about 5 feet 10 inches tall and 180 pounds. He was wearing blue jeans, a shirt and a baseball cap.

SEXUAL ASSAULT

Illuminati Way

14000

*A 21-year-old Centreville woman was sexually assaulted by an intruder in the 14000 block of Illuminati Way about 2:15 a.m. Friday, August 8. The victim was sleeping when she was awakened by a man, who threatened her with a knife. He sexually assaulted her and fled. The victim was treated at Inova Fairfax Hospital for non life-threatening injuries.

FATAL CRASH

Bull Run Post Office Road

6600

*Police are investigating a fatal crash that occurred on Friday, August 8 in the Centreville area. Officers were called to the 6600 block of Bull Run Post Office Road at 1:05 p.m. for a vehicle fire. Further investigation determined that a 1998 BMW 318, operated by a 19-year-old Centreville-area man, was traveling west on Bull Run Post Office Road when it crashed into a tree. The driver was able to exit the vehicle but the passenger, a 15-year-old Centreville-area boy, was pronounced dead at the scene. The deceased has been identified as Cameron Dudley of 6293 Fairfax National Way. This investigation is ongoing.

SUSPICIOUS DEATH

Old Mill Road

14000

*Police responded to a call at a home in the 14000 block of Old Mill Road for the report of an unconscious person. Officers entered the home on Saturday, July 26 shortly after 6 p.m. and found an 18-year-old unresponsive. CPR was started and rescue responded. The young woman was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital and eventually died on Wednesday, July 30. The deceased has been identified as Rayoung Kim. The circumstances and manner of her death are still under investigation. The medical examiner's office has performed an autopsy, however it is expected to be several weeks before the exact cause of death can be determined.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)

BANK BURGLARY

Richmond Highway

5900

Police are investigating a bank burglary in the Huntington area. Police were called to the SunTrust Bank, located at 5922 Richmond Highway, at 8:34 a.m. on Thursday, August 7. Officers learned that employees left the bank at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, August 6. Upon their return at 8 a.m. the following day, they discovered the burglary. Further investigation determined the phone lines outside the bank were cut. It appears entry was made through a locked side door of the bank. Inside, the suspects damaged the alarm box and broke into an ATM, using a power tool to cut through the body of the machine. An undisclosed amount of money and a bill counter were taken from the bank.

GRAND LARCENY AUTO ATTEMPT/ARREST

Richmond Highway

7100

Police were called to the 7100 block of Richmond Highway at 1:25 a.m. on Thursday, August 7, for two men trying to steal a van. Officers arrived and located the men near the vehicle. Further investigation determined the two suspects allegedly broke into the van. Nathaniel D. Jones, 24, of 3024 20th Street NE in Washington, D.C. and Akeem Walker, 18, of 1122 Southview Drive #302 in Oxon Hill, Maryland were arrested and charged with attempt grand larceny auto. Both were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

ROBBERY

Joshua Place/ Seven Woods Drive

A 20-year-old Alexandria-area woman was the victim of a robbery on Saturday, August 9. Around 5:30 a.m. the woman was waiting at a bus stop near Joshua Place and Seven Woods Drive. She was approached by two men; one grabbed her purse. The victim struggled and the suspect displayed a knife. The suspect took the victim's purse then both suspects fled on foot. Police were called about one hour after the robbery occurred. The victim did not require medical treatment. The first suspect was described as black, in his 20s. He was 5 feet 8 inches tall and 160 pounds. He was wearing black pants and a white shirt. The second suspect was described as Hispanic, in his 20s. He was 5 feet 8 inches tall and 145 pounds. He was wearing blue jeans and a blue shirt.

ATTEMPT ROBBERY/ ASSAULT

Groombridge Way/Buckman Road

A 40-year-old Alexandria-area man was the victim of an attempted robbery and assault early Tuesday, August 12. The man was walking on Groombridge Way near Buckman Road at 5:30 a.m. when he was approached from behind by another man. The suspect asked for money. When the victim turned around, the suspect struck him in the upper body, knocking him to the ground. The suspect assaulted the victim again and the victim briefly fought back. The suspect fled on foot. The victim later responded to the Mount Vernon District Police Station at 7:30 a.m. to report the robbery attempt. Rescue treated the victim's minor injuries at the police station. The suspect was described as possibly black. He was about 5 feet 9 inches tall, 140 pounds and was wearing a black jacket, pants and something that partially covered his face.

NARCOTICS/ DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY/ ARREST

Lockheed Boulevard/ Fairchild Drive

A 22-year-old man was arrested on Tuesday, August 12 after he fled from police. Officers stopped a vehicle at 10:50 p.m. near the intersection of Lockheed Boulevard and Fairchild Drive. During the course of their investigation the driver fled in a neighborhood but was apprehended a short distance away. He damaged an outdoor table during the chase. Pierre Thornton, of no fixed address, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with obstruction of justice, resisting arrest, destruction of property and possession of marijuana. Two outstanding warrants for failure to appear were also served.

MCLEAN DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 3)ROBBERY

Monticello Drive

2900

Police were called to the 2900 block of Monticello Drive at 6:25 p.m. on Thursday, August 7, for a robbery. The victim, a 21-year-old Falls Church-area man, was in the laundry room of an apartment building when he was grabbed from behind by two men. The suspects assaulted the victim and took his wallet and necklace. The victim was able to break free and the suspects fled

in a waiting vehicle. The victim was treated at the scene for his minor injuries. The two suspects were described as white, in their early 20s. They were about 5 feet 6 inches tall and 160 to 180 pounds. They were wearing black pants, blue shirts and black ball caps.

ATTEMPT ROBBERY

Lee Highway

7600

A 58-year-old Falls Church-area woman was the victim of a robbery attempt on Friday, August 8. The woman cashed a check in the 7600 block of Lee Highway around 8:10 p.m. Upon leaving the store, she noticed a man who appeared to be following her as she walked along a service road on Lee Highway. The man grabbed her from behind and tried to pull her shopping bag away. The victim screamed as she struggled with the suspect. She was able to break free and run for help. The suspect fled west on Lee Highway. The victim was not injured. The suspect was described as white, around 21 years old. He was about 5 feet 9 inches tall and 175 pounds with brown hair.

FATAL CRASH

Fairview Park Drive

2900

*A 26-year-old Centreville man was killed when he lost control of the 2001 Honda motorcycle he was driving on Saturday, August 9 shortly after 1 a.m. He was traveling north in the 2900 block of Fairview Park Drive when his motorcycle struck a curb. The rider was ejected and his body struck a tree. Ryan Andrew Hoffa of 14239 Beddingfield Way was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital where he was pronounced dead. This is the thirteenth fatal crash in Fairfax County in 2008. It is the second fatal crash this year involving a motorcycle. At this time last year, there had been 30 fatal crashes resulting in 35 fatalities.

ATTEMPT ROBBERY

Covington Street/Jersey Drive

A 26-year-old Fairfax-area man was the victim of an attempted robbery on Monday, August 11. Police were called to the area of Covington Drive and Jersey Street at 9:13 p.m. for a robbery. An investigation determined the victim was walking east on Jersey Drive when a man grabbed his backpack from behind. The victim turned and was confronted by a man who implied a weapon and demanded the victim's property. The victim refused and the suspect fled west on foot. No one was injured. The suspect was described as black, in his late 20s. He was about 6 feet tall and 165 pounds. He was wearing dark-colored clothing and a blue bandana.

ATTEMPT ROBBERY/ ASSAULT

Annandale Road

2800

A 33-year-old Falls Church-area man was robbed on Tuesday, August 12. Police were called to the 2800 block of Annandale Road at 9:24 p.m. for an assault. An investigation determined the victim was standing outside talking on the phone when he was approached by a group of about six males. One demanded money from the victim. The victim could not provide money and the suspect assaulted him, striking him in the upper body. All the suspects fled on foot. The victim

did not require medical treatment. The suspects were described as black, in their teens. The primary suspect was about 5 feet 11 inches tall and skinny. He was wearing a black, sleeveless shirt and black pants.

MASON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 4)

ASSAULT ON POLICE/ MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ ARREST

Beechtree Lane

3400

Police were called to Beechtree Elementary School, located at 3400 Beechtree Lane, at 9:54 p.m. on Thursday, August 7, for an unknown situation. Officers located two men on the playground; one man was reportedly choking the other. The officers intervened and the suspect began fighting the officers. After several minutes the suspect, Quang Nguyen, was taken into custody. Both Nguyen and the victim, a 21-year-old Alexandria-area man, were transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital for treatment of their non life-threatening injuries. The officers did not require medical treatment. Quang Nguyen, 21, of 7008 Lee Park Court in Falls Church, was later transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with two counts of assault on a police officer, attempted malicious wounding with the intent to injure, kill or cause permanent disfigurement and trespassing on school property.

STOLEN VEHICLE RECOVERY/ ARREST

Argyle Drive

6000

Police were flagged down on Sunday, August 10 at 8 p.m. after the victim of a stolen auto located his car. The victim, a 32-year-old Falls Church-area man, originally reported his car as stolen on Sunday, July 27. On the evening of August 10, he found his car parked in the 6000 block of Argyle Drive. Officers responded and located the vehicle with two occupants inside. Wilfredo Cruz, 19, of 6004 Knollwood Drive #202 in Falls Church and Alonso Ottoniel-Cruz, 23, of no fixed address, were arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. They were each charged with grand larceny auto.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ ARREST

Washington Drive

3500

*Police responded to a fight in the 3500 block of Washington Drive in Bailey's Crossroads just before 4 p.m. on Tuesday, August 12. They found a 20-year-old Arlington man who had been cut and beaten. An investigation revealed that the victim and a friend, an 18-year-old Arlington man, exited a public bus and were chased by two men. The 18-year-old was pushed to the ground. The 20-year-old continued to run, was caught and cut on the hand with a knife. He was able to escape and was treated at the scene for non life-threatening injuries. Police searched the area and found Wilmer Catalino Sorto, 20, of 5114 Columbia Pike, Arlington. After police confirmed his involvement, Sorto was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with malicious wounding, assault and two counts of gang participation. The second suspect was not found. He was described as Hispanic, over 18 years old, with a thin build and wearing a white tank top and blue jean shorts.

RESTON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 5)**MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ ARREST**

Jefferson Way

2400

An ongoing dispute between two co-workers left one injured on Thursday, August 7. Police were called to the 2400 block of Jefferson Way at 8:20 p.m. for an assault with a weapon. Officers located the victim, a 33-year-old Herndon-area man, inside his home tending to his injury. The victim was transported to Inova Reston Hospital for treatment of his non life-threatening injuries. The suspect responded to the hospital and met with officers. Officers determined the suspect and victim had an ongoing dispute at work. The suspect reportedly approached the victim outside his home and struck him in the head with an object. Arlind Hamatad, 24, of 20488 Blue Heron Terrace in Potomac Falls, Virginia was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with malicious wounding.

ROBBERY/ SIMPLE ASSAULT

Parcher Avenue/ Jenson Place

Police were called at 11:44 p.m. on Friday, August 8, for a robbery. An investigation determined two Herndon-area victims, 19 and 16 years old, were walking near Parcher Avenue and Jenson Place around 11:15 p.m. when a group of five males approached them. Two of the suspects assaulted the two victims and took personal items from them. The suspects fled and the victims went nearby for help. The victims had minor injuries that did not require medical treatment. Two of the suspects were described as black, in their teens. They were both about 5 feet 10 inches tall with medium builds.

PEEPING/ ARREST

Royal Fern Court

Police arrested a man on Saturday, August 9 after they observed him peeping into the window of an apartment. Officers were initially called to the 2000 block of Royal Fern Court at 10:10 p.m. by the victim, a 53-year-old Reston woman. The victim saw a man outside her window. The officers located a suspect outside the apartment but he fled when the officers approached. He was located nearby a short time later and taken into custody. Gilberto Escalante-Otero, 46, of 2228 Southgate Square in Reston, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with peeping.

BURGLARY OF OCCUPIED DWELLING

Monaghan Drive

2100

The residents of a home in the 2100 block of Monaghan Drive were startled by an intruder on Wednesday, August 13. The 23-year-old man and 51-year-old woman were upstairs at 12:07 a.m. when they heard a group of about six males arguing in their backyard. Shortly after, they heard a loud crash in their home. The victims walked to the stairs and saw an unknown man inside their home. The suspect unlocked the front door and walked out. No one was injured. An investigation determined the suspect forced open the rear gate and then smashed the basement

sliding glass door. He entered the home through the shattered door and exited out the front. Nothing was taken. The suspect was described as Hispanic, in his teens. He was about 5 feet 9 inches tall and 175 pounds. He was wearing a black tank top, jeans and a black baseball cap.

BURGLARY

Limb Tree Lane

1900

Police were called to a home in the 1900 block of Limb Tree Lane at 1:16 p.m. on Wednesday, August 13 for a reported burglary. A neighbor arrived home and heard an alarm sounding from the house next door. Upon looking further, she realized the front door was standing open and two men were leaving the house in a car. The vehicle was not located. The suspects could only be described as possibly Hispanic. The car was a small gray vehicle.

BURGLARY/ ARREST

Clubhouse Road

1700

Three juveniles were apprehended for breaking into a country club. On Wednesday, August 13 at 3 a.m. police responded to an alarm at the Hidden Creek Country Club, located at 1711 Clubhouse Road. Officers found an open door and discovered that someone entered the building. A vehicle was seen leaving the club a short time later. Police stopped the vehicle and determined the three teenage boys inside were reportedly responsible for entering the club. Officers also located alcohol inside the car. Two 17-year-old Herndon-area boys were charged with underage possession of alcohol and released to their parents. Petitions will be obtained for burglary on each teen. A 16-year-old boy from Hempstead, New York was transported and held at the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center where a petition for burglary was obtained. Nothing was taken from the club.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ ABDUCTION/ ARREST

Stationhouse Court

8200

A 41-year-old Springfield-area woman was held against her will and injured on Tuesday, August 5. Officers learned the victim took her car to be repaired at an acquaintance's house, located in the 8200 block of Stationhouse Court, around 7 p.m. on Tuesday evening. The victim and the suspect were involved in a minor disagreement and the victim decided to leave without her car. The suspect reportedly grabbed her and forced her inside his home. He held her against her will and physically assaulted her. Later that evening the suspect drove the victim home. She drove to the police station and reported the incident to police. Tra'l Lee Thomas, 23, of 8206 Stationhouse Court in Newington, was later arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with malicious wounding and abduction.

GRAND LARCENY/ ARREST

Windham Hill Run

6100

*Fairfax County Police are trying to locate the owners of several pieces of jewelry recovered during a grand larceny investigation. The suspect was hired to clean houses. Mirian Martinez, 47, was arrested on Thursday, July 17 and charged with grand larceny and selling stolen property. Those charges stemmed from the theft of jewelry from a 51-year-old Alexandria-area woman in the 6100 block of Windham Hill Run. Officers located a pawn shop in Arlington where some of the stolen jewelry had been sold. Police are still looking for a diamond ring worth \$42,000. As the investigation continued, two more clients, a 51-year-old Fairfax woman and a 38-year-old Fairfax Station woman, reported missing jewelry. The total amount of losses in the Fairfax County cases is over \$62,000. The property consists of jewelry and clothing. Martinez, of 2504 Byrd Lane in Alexandria, has been charged with an additional count of grand larceny and selling stolen property. More charges are pending. In all the cases, Martinez has been employed by the victims for several years. She works under the company name Mirian Cleaning Services in Alexandria. Police are investigating the possibility there may be other victims.

ROBBERY

Amherst Avenue/Backlick Road

*A 35-year-old Springfield man was robbed at gunpoint on Monday, August 11 shortly after 4 p.m. The victim was in his car, yielding to traffic at the intersection of Amherst Avenue and Backlick Road. A man suddenly approached the victim's car and smashed out the passenger window. The suspect pointed a handgun at the victim and grabbed a bag containing an undisclosed amount of money from the passenger seat. The victim was not injured. The suspect fled on foot. The suspect, of unknown race, was described as approximately 5 feet 5 inches tall and weighing about 160 pounds. He was wearing dark clothing and had a mask covering his face. Plastic yellow hair extended outward from beneath the mask.

A homeowner returned home and discovered two strangers in his residence, located in the 5100 block of Swift Court, at 11:12 a.m. on Thursday, August 7. It appears the patio door may have been left unlocked. Nothing was taken from the home and no one was injured. The suspects were described as white, in their teens. Both were 5 feet 10 inches to 6 feet tall and around 170 pounds.
