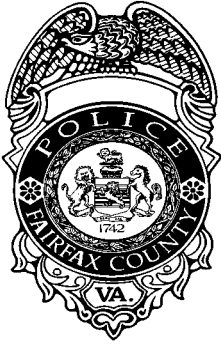

There are three sections in this report: Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS; Section II: PROPERTY CRIMES; and, Section III: ANIMAL RELATED INCIDENTS. Sections are appropriately identified. Within the sections, incidents are organized by station, then by type of offense. They are listed alphabetically by street address.

Addresses shown indicate blocks and not specific locations. Thus an entry showing Chain Bridge Road 4100 would mean the 4100 *block* of Chain Bridge Road, not the address 4100 Chain Bridge Road.

An asterisk (*) before an item indicates that an incident report was distributed on that offense.

Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**COUNTY-WIDE****CRIMINAL JUSTICE ACADEMY GRADUATION**

*Twenty-nine new police officers graduated from the Fairfax County Criminal Justice Academy's 54th session on Thursday, September 25, to serve and protect the citizens of Fairfax County. The ceremony was held at George Mason University Center for the Arts, 4400 University Drive, Fairfax, Virginia. The keynote speaker was Robert Tobias, Director of the Public Sector Executive Programs as well as Director of the Institute for the Study of Public Policy Implementation and a professor at The American University. Each Fairfax County police officer's first assignment will be to one of eight district stations. Their training will continue with a senior officer, known as a Field Training Instructor, for three months. Additional personnel graduating with this class included one fire marshal and 18 sheriff's deputies. The six-month basic recruit session is a non-residential training program. Recruits commute to the facility in Chantilly Tuesday through Friday for a 10-hour day, varying between day and evening hours. The curriculum includes Virginia law, report writing, criminal and crash investigation, warrant service, crime prevention, defensive tactics, emergency vehicle operations, first aid and firearms skills. In order to attend the Academy and become officers, candidates go through a rigorous application process which includes testing, background check, medical check, polygraph test and interviews. On average, of the 1,800 people who take the entry level test every year, only 97 make it to the Academy. The Fairfax County Criminal Justice Academy trains approximately 140 to 150 new law enforcement officers a year. It is the current training center for all law enforcement officers from the Fairfax County Police Department, Fairfax County Sheriff's Office and the town police departments of Herndon and Vienna. Animal Control Officers and Fire Marshals are also trained here.

SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)**DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY/ BIAS INCIDENT**

Schoolfield Court

5600

Police were called to the 5600 block of Schoolfield Court at 6:30 p.m. on Saturday, September 20, for graffiti. Officers found derogatory words spray painted on the community basketball courts. The Fairfax County Police Department recognizes the potential harm that bias crimes and incidents can have in a community, and consequently encourages people to report them. All bias crimes and incidents are investigated thoroughly.

MISSILE AT AN OCCUPIED VEHICLE/GANG PARTICIPATION/ASSAULT BY MOB/OBSTRUCTION OF JUSTICE/CONTRIBUTING TO THE DELINQUENCY OF A MINOR/ARREST

Sully Road/Willard Road

Police arrested five males after a traffic altercation on Monday, September 22. The five males were driving a gold-colored Honda sedan north on Sully Road around 3:47 p.m. They stopped for a red light at Willard Road and reportedly exchanged words with two 19-year-old men driving a Mercedes sedan. The light turned green and as both vehicles accelerated, the suspects in the Honda threw items at the victims' car, striking it several times. A chase ensued between them and the two victims called police. Both vehicles stopped in the area of Chantilly Road. The suspects exited their car, approached the victims and threatened them. A female passerby saw the altercation and scared the suspects away. Responding officers located the five individuals nearby and took them into custody. Joe Canales, 19, of 4113 Dawn Valley Court in Chantilly, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor, gang participation and assault by mob. A 14-year-old from the Fairfax area was transported to the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center and charged with throwing a missile at an occupied vehicle, gang participation, obstruction of justice and two counts of assault by mob. The three other juvenile suspects from Manassas were released to their parents and petitions were obtained charging two of them, 14 and 15 years old, with throwing a missile at an occupied vehicle, obstruction of justice and two counts each of assault by mob. The third suspect, a 14-year-old, was charged with obstruction of justice and two counts of assault by mob. The victims were not injured. Detectives believe this incident was gang-related.

SEXUAL ASSAULT

Silo Valley View

14300

*A woman was attacked and sexually assaulted at 14336 Silo Valley View in Centreville on Monday, September 22. Officers responded about 8:20 p.m. after a woman went to a house nearby for assistance. An investigation revealed the woman, a 42-year-old from Centreville, went to the home by appointment to sell some items. Her customer directed her to the basement where he attacked the victim and sexually assaulted her. He took her purse and fled in her car which was recovered a few blocks away. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The suspect was described as Hispanic, in his 30s. He was approximately 5 feet 6 inches tall with an average build. He had brown eyes with medium-length wavy hair. He was wearing a light colored shirt and jeans.

ATTEMPTED BURGLARY/ARREST

Lee Jackson Memorial Highway

14000

A man was arrested for attempting to break in to the MVC Late Night Video store at 14021 Lee Jackson Memorial Highway in Fairfax, on Wednesday, September 24. Police responded to a burglar alarm around 3:30 a.m. and discovered damage to the front door. They located the suspect nearby and an investigation led to his arrest. Joshua Nowlin, 21, of 13292B Leafcrest Lane #203 in the Fairfax area, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with attempted burglary.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)**ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/ ARREST**

Janna Lee Avenue/ Buckman Road

A 31-year-old Alexandria-area man was the victim of an attempted robbery on Sunday, September 21 around 8 p.m. The man was walking along Richmond Highway near Buckman Road when a man on a bicycle began following him. The man asked for money but the victim had none to give. The suspect got off his bike and assaulted the victim, knocking him to the ground. The suspect went through the victim's pants pockets but was not successful in stealing anything. The suspect fled on his bike. Further investigation led to the arrest of James Pryor, 41, of no fixed address. Pryor was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with attempted robbery. The victim did not require medical treatment.

NARCOTICS/ ARREST

Richmond Highway/ Sacramento Drive

A traffic stop led to the arrest of three men on Sunday, September 21. An alert patrol officer stopped a car for a traffic violation on Richmond Highway at Sacramento Drive around 1:25 a.m. The officer requested a K9 due to the suspicious behavior of the three occupants in the vehicle. The police dog located narcotics in the vehicle which was seized by officers. The vehicle, a 2001 Buick Park Avenue, was seized by officers. Leroy Kear, 21, of 7953 Janna Lee Avenue #203 in Alexandria, James Smith, 22, of 3424 Buckman Road #303 in Alexandria and Alex Koiwood, 23, of 3506 Buckman Road # 203 in Alexandria, were each issued a summons for possession with the intent to distribute marijuana. Kear was additionally charged with disregarding a red light and driving with a suspended operator's license. They were released on their signatures.

MCLEAN DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 3)**ROBBERY**

Rosemary Lane

3000

A 30-year-old Falls Church-area woman was robbed on Saturday, September 20 around 2:05 a.m. The woman exited her car in the 3000 block of Rosemary Lane and was approached by two men who were hiding in the bushes. The suspects grabbed her purse and fled on foot. The victim was not injured. The suspects were described as Hispanic, about 5 feet 7 inches tall and skinny.

BURGLARY SCAM

Rosemary Lane

2800

*A 55-year-old Falls Church-area woman was the victim of a burglary scam that may be connected to a similar incident that occurred in another area of Fairfax County. A man posed as a tree expert to gain entry into the victim's home on Monday, September 22. The suspect approached the woman in her driveway around 2 p.m. in the 2800 block of Rosemary Lane, and said he needed to take down some trees in her backyard. The suspect escorted the victim and her husband to the back of the property to examine the trees. A short time later another man walked

up and the two suspects left. The victims then discovered their rear door was open and a safe had been stolen. The safe contained an undisclosed amount of cash and other items. The suspects were described as Hispanic with brown eyes and short, black hair. One suspect was in his 20s, approximately 5 feet 2 inches to 5 feet 5 inches tall with a small build. He wore a gray shirt, orange vest, dark pants and a white hard-hat. The other was in his 30s, approximately 5 feet 6 inches tall with a medium build. He wore a red and white checkered T-shirt and black pants. A similar ruse was used to gain entry into an 86-year-old woman's home on Sunday, September 21 in the Alexandria-area of Fairfax County. The two suspects in that case also presented themselves as tree experts. They were described as white, in their 20s, approximately 5 feet 6 inches tall with medium builds. They both had brown hair and were wearing short sleeved shirts and light-colored pants. Detectives are working to determine whether these two incidents are related.

MASON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 4)

FATAL CRASH

Lake Drive/ Little River Turnpike

*A 93-year-old Alexandria man died of injuries he sustained in a crash on Monday, September 15 at the intersection of Lake Drive and Little River Turnpike. Charles H. Schafer of 307 Yoakum Parkway succumbed to his injuries shortly after 4:30 a.m. on Thursday, September 18 at Inova Fairfax Hospital. The crash occurred around noon, as Schafer drove his 2000 Nissan Sentra into the intersection from Lake Drive against a red light, and was struck by a 1997 Honda Accord traveling westbound on Little River Turnpike. The driver of the Honda, a 42-year-old Annandale woman, was not injured. This is the 14th fatal crash in Fairfax County in 2008. At this time last year, there were 30 fatal crashes resulting in 35 deaths.

WEAPON BRANDISHING/ ARREST

Wadsworth Court

4100

Police were called to a home in the 4100 block of Wadsworth Court at 4:40 p.m. on Wednesday, September 17, for brandishing a weapon. An investigation determined there was an argument between the residents in the home. One of them, a 17-year-old male, allegedly brandished a handgun and threatened a 36-year-old Annandale man. The victim fled the apartment and encountered another 17-year-old male at the door, reportedly with a gun. The two suspects fled the apartment and officers located them nearby in a car. Petitions will be obtained for the 17-year-old Annandale teens charging both Annandale teenagers with brandishing.

INDECENT EXPOSURE

Glenmore Drive

3300

*A man reportedly exposed himself to two teenage girls on Thursday, September 18, in the 3300 block of Glenmore Drive. The Falls Church area girls, ages 15 and 16, were walking home from JEB Stuart High School when a man in a car attempted to get their attention. They turned around and saw the suspect exposing himself. The girls quickly turned and kept walking as the suspect drove away. They reported the incident to police on Friday, September 19. The suspect was

described as Hispanic, in his 30s or 40s. He had a heavy build and dark, bushy hair. He wore a light brown or tan T-shirt and blue pants. He was driving a beige sedan.

ROBBERY/MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ARREST

Patrick Henry Drive/John Marshall Drive

Police arrested a man for a robbery that occurred around 11 p.m. on Saturday, September 20. The victim, a 37-year-old Falls Church-area man, was walking in the area of Patrick Henry Drive and John Marshall Drive when a man approached him with a knife. The suspect allegedly cut the victim in the upper body, took his wallet and fled. The victim was driven to Inova Fairfax Hospital where police responded. The victim was treated for minor injuries and released. Around 1:50 a.m. Sunday morning, the victim and his friends saw the suspect walking in the 6100 block of Patrick Henry Drive. They approached the suspect and held him until police arrived. The suspect was treated at the scene for minor injuries he received while being held down. Roberto Nieto, 35, of 2931 John Marshall Drive #2 in the Falls Church area, was taken into custody and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with robbery and malicious wounding.

ASSAULT ON POLICE OFFICER/ DISORDERLY CONDUCT/ NARCOTICS/ ARREST

Beechview Drive

6800

Police arrested a 24-year-old man while investigating a disorderly conduct complaint. Officers were called to the 6800 block of Beechview Drive at 11:38 p.m. on Saturday, September 20. They found two men and a woman outside yelling. One man approached an officer and threw an envelope at him as he continued to yell. The man reportedly refused to follow the officer's commands and was subsequently arrested. During his arrest, the suspect resisted and the officer was sprayed with pepper spray. The envelope was recovered; cocaine and Oxycodone pills were located inside. The suspect was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with assault on a police officer, disorderly conduct, possession of cocaine and possession of a schedule II narcotic. The officer was not injured.

INDECENT EXPOSURE/ ARREST

Argyle Drive

6000

*Officers were called to Argyle Drive in Falls Church on Sunday, September 21 for a man detained by citizens. An investigation revealed that Giovanni Gregorio allegedly exposed himself to a 20-year-old woman and two 14-year-old girls in the 6000 block of Argyle Drive. In an attempt to flee, he forced his way into an apartment. He was detained by citizens who heard the commotion. No one was injured and Gregorio, 27, of no fixed address was arrested. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with three counts of indecent exposure and one count of unlawful entry. Detectives have determined that Gregorio is not the subject of recent exposure cases in the area.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/PROVIDING FALSE INFORMATION TO LAW ENFORCEMENT/ARREST

Glen Carlyn Drive

3300

A Falls Church-area man was the victim of an attempted robbery on Monday, September 22. The man, 22, was walking in the 3300 block of Glen Carlyn Drive around 4:46 p.m., when he was approached by a man who asked for money. The suspect reportedly produced a knife and the victim ran. Jose G. Suarez, 42, of no fixed address, was located nearby and taken into custody. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with attempted robbery and providing false information to law enforcement. The victim was not injured.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/VEHICLE TAMPERING

King Louis Drive

6400

Police responded to a report of an attempted robbery on Monday, September 22. The victim, a 29-year-old Alexandria-area man, was in the 6400 block of King Louis Drive jumpstarting his car when three men in a dark-colored vehicle pulled up. Two of the men exited the car, approached the victim and asked for money. The victim declined and ran into a house nearby when he noticed that one of the suspects was holding a knife. The suspects shouted and kicked his car several times before they left in their own vehicle. The victim was not injured and nothing was taken. The two suspects were described as Hispanic, in their 20s. They were approximately 5 feet 7 inches to 5 feet 10 inches tall and weighed 150 to 170 pounds with black, medium-length hair. One suspect had a tattoo on his right bicep. They both wore baggy blue jeans.

INDECENT EXPOSURE

Arlington Boulevard/ Black Hickory Drive

*Shortly before 4 p.m. on Monday, September 22, two high school students were victims of an exposure. The 14 and 15-year-old Falls Church-area girls were walking along Arlington Boulevard near Black Hickory Drive. A man yelled out to them from behind while allegedly exposing himself. The girls ran away and were not injured. They reported the incident the following day. If you find yourself a victim of this type of incident, please immediately report it to the police. Detectives are investigating the possibility that this incident is linked to other recent exposure cases also in the Falls Church area. The suspect was described as Hispanic, in his late 30s. He was approximately 5 feet 5 inches tall and 130 pounds with short, dark hair. He was wearing a short-sleeve shirt and light-colored blue jeans.

RESTON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 5)ATTEMPT ROBBERY

Library Street/ Bluemont Way

A 25-year-old Reston-area man was the victim of an attempted robbery at 1 a.m. on Sunday, September 21. The man exited the Metro bus at the bus stop on Bluemont Parkway. Two other men followed him off the bus. As the man crossed the street in the Reston Towne Center, the two suspects assaulted him and demanded his money and property. The victim broke free, refused to

comply and continued walking. The suspects fled the area on foot. The victim did not require medical treatment. The suspects were described as black, in their late teens to early 20s.

ROBBERY

Pleasure Cove Court

* 30-year-old Alexandria-area woman was robbed while walking in the 5200 block of Pleasure Cove Court on Thursday, September 18. Around 8:45 p.m., a man approached, pointed a gun at her and announced the robbery. The victim gave her purse to the suspect and he walked away. The victim was not injured. The suspect was described as black, approximately 5 feet 10 inches tall and 170 pounds. He had dark eyes. He wore a black, hooded sweatshirt with a white logo, dark pants and a dark bandana.

HOME INVASION ROBBERY

Kerr Drive

A 59-year-old Springfield woman was the victim of a home invasion robbery on Friday, September 19. Two men entered her home armed with a handgun just after noon and demanded cash. The victim handed over an undisclosed amount of proceeds from her check cashing business. One of the suspects fired one round in an effort to get more money. No additional money was taken and no one was injured. The suspects fled the scene. The description of one suspect was Hispanic, approximately 5 feet 6 inches tall with a "belly". He was wearing a hat, a short-sleeve gray shirt and black pants.

ATTEMPTED BURGLARY

Rock Cliff Lane

Police were called to an apartment in the 6000 block of Rock Cliff Lane for an attempted burglary on Friday, September 19 at 11 a.m. Officers learned the apartment resident, a 31-year-old Alexandria-area man, heard two men knocking on his front door. The man did not recognize them so he did not answer. They left and returned moments later, knocking again. The victim again looked out the peep hole and saw the same two suspects armed with a crow bar. One suspect attempted to pry the front door open. The victim called police as he held the door shut. The suspects were not successful in opening the door and fled prior to police arrival. The suspects were described as black, in their late 20s to early 30s. The first suspect was 6 feet tall and 195 pounds. He was wearing a black T-shirt, blue jeans and a black baseball cap. The second suspect was 5 feet 7 inches tall and 175 pounds. He was wearing a brown, hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans and Timberland boots.

BURGLARY SCAM

Lewin Drive

6300

*Two men posed as tree experts to gain entry into an 86-year-old Alexandria-area woman's home. On Sunday, September 21 shortly after 5 p.m., two men knocked on the homeowner's door in the 6300 block of Lewin Drive. The men told the woman she had trees in her back yard that needed to be trimmed. The woman led the men to her back yard to inspect the trees. She asked for identification and when they produced none, she asked them to leave. As the woman walked back to her house, entered and began to close the door, the suspects pushed the door open and came inside. Once inside, the suspects split up and went to different parts of the home. The victim threatened to call the police and one of the suspects pushed her aside. Both suspects fled without taking anything. The victim was not injured. The suspects were both described as white, in their 20s, approximately 5 feet 6 inches tall with medium builds. They both had brown hair and were wearing short sleeved shirts and light-colored pants.

She was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with simple assault, disorderly conduct and possession of marijuana.

ROBBERY

Little River Turnpike

A 19-year-old Annandale-area man reported a robbery on Sunday, September 21. Officers responded to Inova Fairfax Hospital at 3 a.m. and met with the victim, who was receiving medical treatment for his minor injuries. The victim reportedly received a phone call from a 20-year-old male acquaintance around 1 a.m. The man arrived at the victim's apartment, located in the 7500 block of Little River Turnpike, with two other men the victim did not know. The three men left the apartment after a short time but reportedly hung around on the stairs inside the building. The victim went into the hallway to see what they were doing. One suspect brandished a handgun and demanded the victim's money. The victim refused and pushed the second suspect away. The first suspect struck the victim in the head with the gun and took money from his pockets. All three suspects fled in a red pickup truck. The two unknown suspects were described as black, in their 20s.
