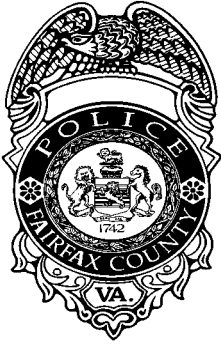

There are three sections in this report: Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS; Section II: PROPERTY CRIMES; and, Section III: ANIMAL RELATED INCIDENTS. Sections are appropriately identified. Within the sections, incidents are organized by station, then by type of offense. They are listed alphabetically by street address.

Addresses shown indicate blocks and not specific locations. Thus an entry showing Chain Bridge Road 4100 would mean the 4100 *block* of Chain Bridge Road, not the address 4100 Chain Bridge Road.

An asterisk (*) before an item indicates that an incident report was distributed on that offense.

Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS

COMMUNITY HOLIDAY SAFETY ADVISORY

*Everyone is looking for extra money or gifts during the final weeks of holiday shopping and that includes criminals. They are out in force trying to separate you from your money and property. In recent months there has been an increase in the number of GPS, iPod and other electronic devices being stolen from vehicles. Be extra vigilant during the holiday season and keep the following tips in mind.

PERSONAL SAFETY WHEN SHOPPING

- Shop during daylight hours whenever possible.
- Always be aware of your surroundings.
- Know exactly where you park your car.
- If shopping at night, park in well-lit areas.
- Avoid shopping alone.
- Carry keys, cash and credit cards separate from each other.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash. If possible, avoid carrying a purse. Use a fanny pack or deep pockets in clothing to carry what you need. Limit the number of credit cards that you carry.
- If you have to carry a purse, carry it close to your body and always zipped or snapped.
- Be aware of strangers “accidentally” bumping into you. Pick-pockets use this as a diversion.
- Avoid carrying large packages that block your vision and make you a target for thieves.
- Avoid shopping until you are exhausted. You are more alert when you are less tired.
- When hurried or in a crowded shop, make sure you get all forms of identification and credit cards returned to you before you leave.
- Leave the mall/store well before closing time. This way, there is a greater assurance you will walk out with other people. There is safety in numbers.
- Use an escort or mall security if you have too many packages or if you are leaving the store after closing.
- Be alert while walking to your car. Check under and around your car as you approach it. After checking your car, lock it immediately upon entering it.
- If you see a van parked next to your car, you can choose to enter your car through the passenger side.
- Avoid using automatic teller machines at night and remember to keep others from seeing when you type in your PIN.
- Remove GPS, iPods and any other electronic devices from your windshield and store them out of sight.
- Remove any evidence (i.e. suction cup marks) from your windshield.

HOME SAFETY

- Do not leave the boxes of your holiday gifts (such as computers, televisions, etc.) at the curb as this advertises the contents of your home to potential thieves.
- Ensure doors and windows are locked at all times, even when you are home.
- Use timers on lights to give the appearance you are home when you are not.
- If you order gifts to be delivered to your home, ensure someone is there to accept the package. Have a trusted neighbor keep a lookout for the packages.

- If you go out of town for the holidays, make sure you ask a trusted neighbor, friend or family member to check the house at least once a day and pick up mail and newspapers. Provide your contact number in case of emergency.
- Keep garage doors closed and be sure the door from the garage into the home is secured.
- Make sure your home address is not showing on your luggage.

SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)

PROSTITUTION/ NARCOTICS/ ARREST

Saguaro Place/ Saint Germain Drive

A man and woman were arrested on prostitution charges during a traffic stop on Friday, November 21. Around 10:25 p.m. a patrol officer stopped the driver of a 1994 Honda Accord for traffic charges. During the stop the officer determined the woman was reportedly working as a prostitute and the man was aiding her in doing so. Marijuana was also found in the car. Almiri Altigracia Francisco Trabous, 24, of 1904 Stevens Road #1508 in Woodbridge, was released on a summons for prostitution. Julio Sesar Huancayo, 27, of 6826 Darby Lane in Springfield, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with aiding prostitution, receiving money from earnings of a prostitute and possession of marijuana. A third man in the car was not charged.

FATAL CRASH

Braddock Road/Virginia Chase Drive

*On Sunday, November 23 at 1:50 a.m. a single vehicle crashed on Braddock Road near Virginia Chase Drive in the Centreville area. The driver, alone in the vehicle, was traveling east on Braddock Road when he struck a telephone pole. He was ejected from the 2001 Mitsubishi and pronounced dead at the scene. He was identified as Frank Jensen, 31, of Loudoun County. Speed appears to be a factor. This is the 25th fatality in Fairfax County this year.

FATAL ATV CRASH

Dunquin Court

7400

*On Sunday, November 23 at 3: 34 p.m. police were called to the 7400 block of Dunquin Court in Clifton. A 14-year-old boy was riding his Yamaha Banchee, a 4-wheel ATV, on a path in the area. He crashed into a chain that was strung across the path. Samuel Seipal of Clifton was pronounced dead at the scene.

AUTOMOBILE CRASH

Sully Road/ Old Centreville Road

*Fairfax County Crash Reconstruction Detectives are asking for anyone who may have witnessed a crash involving a school bus to call the police. The crash occurred at the intersection of Route 28 and Old Centreville Road shortly after 9 a.m. on Monday, November 24. A 44-year-old woman from Marshall, Virginia was operating an unloaded 2005 Bluebird, Fairfax County School bus northbound on Route 28, approaching the red signal at Old Centerville Road. A 2005

Sterling dump truck was stopped at the red light in the right northbound lane of Route 28 at Old Centreville Road. A 1997 Dodge Caravan was stopped at the red light in the left turn lane of southbound Route 28 at old Centreville Road. The school bus rear ended the dump truck which accelerated across the intersection. The dump truck then turned and crossed into the southbound lanes striking the Dodge Caravan in the driver's side. The dump truck continued to accelerate, pushing the van across all southbound lanes and up onto the sidewalk. The van and the dump truck became pinned against the guardrail. Neither the driver of the van nor dump truck suffered major injury. The driver of the school bus was flown by Fairfax County medevac helicopter to Inova Fairfax Hospital with life-threatening injuries. The bus attendant on board the bus was also transported to Fairfax Hospital with what appear to be non life-threatening injuries. There were no children on the school bus at the time of the crash. Speed and alcohol do not appear to be factors.

A 33-year-old man was arrested Thursday evening after police responded to an alarm call and found him hiding inside a trailer. At 11:41 p.m. on November 20, officers were called for a commercial alarm at the Dunn Loring Center, located at 2334 Gallows Road. Officers located the man inside a trailer on the property. Further investigation determined the man had reportedly taken property from inside the trailer. Benjamin Relph, of no fixed address, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with burglary and petit larceny.

A 23-year-old Falls Church-area man found his apartment burglarized on Friday, November 21. The man left his home, located in the 2900 block of Kings Chapel Road, at 9:45 a.m. and returned a short time later at 10:55 a.m. He encountered a man standing outside a vehicle in the parking lot. That man engaged him in a brief conversation then got into a vehicle. As the victim climbed the stairs, he passed another man walking down who was carrying a bag. The victim then found his front door pried open and several items missing from inside. The two men he'd just encountered outside were gone along with the vehicle. The two suspects could only be described as Hispanic. One was tall and chubby; the other was shorter with a thin build. The vehicle was described as a newer model Nissan Frontier with New York license plates.

An apartment in the 8000 block of Chanute Place was reportedly burglarized on Friday, November 21 between 10 and 11 a.m. The resident, a 34-year-old Falls Church-area woman, left her front door unlocked when she left her home. Upon returning, she discovered several items moved around inside and a pair of gold earrings missing. There is no suspect description available.

*On Monday, November 24 at 7:40 p.m. officers were called to 2001 International Drive for a robbery. The victim, a 58-year-old Potomac, Maryland woman, was in the parking lot outside Nieman Marcus when the suspect approached her. He cut her purse strap and attempted to steal the bag. She fought for the purse and sustained a minor injury. The suspect fled and the victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital. The purse was recovered. The suspect was described as Asian, 25-35 years old, approximately 5 feet 4 inches tall and 140 pounds. He was wearing a gray hoodie and black pants. UPDATE/ COMPOSITE SKETCH RELEASED

Leesburg Pike

8300

*Detectives have released a composite sketch of the suspect in an abduction case on Thursday, November 6. Anyone who thinks they recognize the person depicted in the sketch is asked to contact the Fairfax County Police Department. A 36-year-old Arlington woman was abducted at gunpoint, driven to her bank and forced to withdraw and hand over an undisclosed amount of money. The victim had just gotten inside her car around 1:45 p.m. in the Pike 7 Plaza, 8389 Leesburg Pike when she suddenly saw a man standing between her and the car door. He produced a gun and told her to exit the car. The victim complied and a second suspect approached them. Both men told her to follow them and then ordered her to get into a gold-colored sedan, bearing Michigan license plates, parked nearby. When the victim told the suspects she did not have any money, they drove to a Wachovia Bank, at 8117 Leesburg Pike and told her to withdraw money using a credit card. The transaction took place between 2:30 and 3 p.m. The victim left the bank and ran back to the area where she had parked her car. She was not injured. The suspects were described as black, between 45 and 50 years old. One suspect was 5 feet 8 inches, around 140 pounds and wore a black long coat, a gray hat and black pants and shoes. The other suspect was described as between 6 feet and 6 feet 3 inches tall, heavy-set and wore a long black jacket with black pants and a black ball cap. He wore gold pinkie rings on both hands. Also, the men reportedly spoke to each other in a language other than English.

FATAL BICYCLIST CRASH

Leesburg Pike/ I495

*Detectives need the public's assistance regarding a fatal hit and run crash which occurred just after midnight on Wednesday, November 26. Officers were called at 12:21 a.m. for a suspicious

person in the road on Leesburg Pike at Interstate 495. A man was found dead on the road near his bicycle. It appears the man was travelling eastbound in the right through lane and was struck by a vehicle from behind. The victim has been identified as Jesus Villanueva, 31, of 1923 Hillside Drive in Falls Church. It is possible the striking vehicle will have minor damage to its front right portion.

UPDATE/ INDECENT LIBERTIES/ ARREST

*Police charged Dan Hegarty, 39, of 6003 Pratt Street in Alexandria with indecent liberties with a child under the age of 15 in reference to the November 10 incident at Spring Hill Recreation Center. Hegarty turned himself in at the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center on Tuesday, November 25 around 5 p.m. He was identified with assistance from the public after flyers and a composite sketch were distributed. Anyone that may have had similar contact with this suspect is asked to contact police at 703-691-2131. This arrest stems from an incident on Monday, November 10 around 8:30 p.m. Police investigated a report of an 8-year-old McLean boy who was approached and touched by a naked man in the locker room of the Spring Hill Recreation Center. The child had gone to change after swimming, when a man allegedly approached him and touched him in a sexual manner. The child reported the incident to his parents later that evening. The victim was not injured.

A 30-year-old Fairfax man and a 36-year-old Laurel, Maryland man were the victims of a reported robbery on Tuesday, November 25. The two men parked their car in the 5700 block of Columbia Pike at 2:38 p.m. and were approached by a man as they exited the car. The suspect implied a weapon and demanded money from the two victims. The victims complied and the suspect fled on foot. The victims called police about 25 minutes later. No one was injured. The suspect was described as black, about 6 feet 3 inches tall and 250 pounds. He was wearing a Redskins hat, gray sweat shirt and khaki pants.

FAIR OAKS DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 8)**ATTEMPT ABDUCTION**

Fair Lakes Circle

*Police are searching for two victims of apparent abduction attempts that occurred on Friday, November 14 around 7:45 p.m. in the parking lot of Fair Lakes Shopping Center in the 12000 block of Fair Lakes Circle. Police received several reports of a man attempting to break into cars in the shopping center parking lot. Officers in the area stopped a man fitting the suspect description who was walking nearby along Fair Lakes Parkway. Despite police commands to stop, the man attempted to run away, then turned and charged towards the officer. Other officers arrived and they were able to take Jeffrey Parsons, 46, of 2223 Christy Place in Herndon, into custody. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with assault on a police officer and resisting arrest. Officers later learned that a man fitting Parsons' description was observed trying to abduct two different people in the parking lot area. In both reports, the victims left the scene prior to making documented police reports. In one incident, the suspect was observed getting into a woman's car and demanding that she take him somewhere. An observant passer-by was able to grab the suspect and remove him from the vehicle. The woman quickly drove away and did not wait to provide police further information. The victim is described as a white woman, seated in the passenger seat of a locked vehicle. In another report, a man was seen standing by his vehicle, being ordered to drive the suspect. In this case, it is unknown how the victim got away. The victim was described as an Asian man, between 35 and 40 years old, wearing a blue fleece sweatshirt and tan pants. He was driving an older model, white Lexus.
