Within the sections, incidents are organized by station, then by type of offense. They are listed alphabetically by street address.

Addresses shown indicate blocks and not specific locations. Thus an entry showing Chain Bridge Road 4100 would mean the 4100 *block* of Chain Bridge Road, not the address 4100 Chain Bridge Road.

An asterisk (*) before an item indicates that an incident report was distributed on that offense.

Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****BURGLARY/ARREST**

Emerald Pool Drive

14300

Two 17-year-old boys, of Centreville and Herndon, were arrested for allegedly stealing alcoholic beverages from a man's garage on Friday, December 26. Around 9:10 p.m., the victim, 40, from Centreville, heard noises in his garage in the 14300 block of Emerald Pool Drive. He went to investigate and discovered one of the boys leaving the garage carrying something in his hand. The suspect walked to a vehicle parked in the street with the other teenager waiting inside. The victim followed him and detained the two suspects until officers arrived. The boys were released to their parents. The incident was referred to juvenile court.

FATAL CRASH

Fairfax County Parkway/Burke Centre Parkway

*A 23-year-old Centreville man died as a result of a crash that occurred on Saturday, December 27. Around 1:30 p.m., the man was driving a 2007 Toyota Scion southbound on Fairfax County Parkway and as he approached Burke Centre Parkway, lost control of the car. The vehicle crossed over the median, flipped as it entered the northbound lanes of the county parkway and landed on the hood of a 2001 Toyota Tacoma pickup truck. The driver of the Scion was ejected from the vehicle and suffered severe trauma to the upper body. Mohamad Khalid, of 13969 Sawteeth Way, was medevaced to Inova Fairfax Hospital where he later died of his injuries. The driver and passenger of the pickup truck were not injured during the crash. Speed and alcohol do not appear to be factors in this crash. The case is still under investigation. This is the 29th fatal crash in Fairfax County this year.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)**ROBBERY**

Furman Lane

*A 25-year-old Alexandria-area woman was robbed at gun point just after midnight on Thursday, December 25. The victim had just gotten out of her vehicle in the 2900 block of Furman Lane when the suspect appeared. He pointed a gun at her and demanded her things. She handed over her purse and jewelry, and he fled on foot. She was not injured. On Monday, December 29 around 1 a.m., a 39-year-old Alexandria-area cab driver picked up a fare at the Huntington Metro station. He drove the individual to the 3000 block of Furman Lane when the suspect produced a gun and demanded money. The victim gave him an undisclosed amount of cash and the suspect fled on foot. The victim was not injured. Detectives are investigating the possibility that these two events are related. In each instance the suspects were described as Hispanic, between 5 feet 5 inches and 5 feet 8 inches tall and 130 to 170 pounds. They had dark hair and eyes. They were wearing a black knit hat, a dark jacket and dark pants.

ROBBERY/ ASSAULT

Huntington Avenue

2000

A 58-year-old Alexandria-area man was robbed while working as a security guard on Sunday, December 28. At 2:25 a.m., a patrol officer was flagged down by a passerby advising the security guard of an apartment complex in the 2000 block of Huntington Avenue needed help. Officers located the victim in the parking lot. Further investigation determined the guard was inside the security booth at the gate when a car pulled up and a man exited. The man tried to gain access into the complex but was denied. As the man returned to his car, the guard exited the booth. The man turned around and assaulted the guard. The suspect took personal items from the victim and fled in his car. The victim was treated at the scene for minor injuries. The suspect was described as black, in his 20s. He was wearing a blue jacket with a gold stripe.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/ ASSAULT

Sacramento Drive/ Southlawn Court

A 30-year-old Alexandria-area man was the victim of an attempted robbery on Sunday, December 28. The man was walking along Sacramento Drive around 9:30 p.m. when he was approached by another man who asked if the victim wanted narcotics. The victim declined and was struck by the suspect who then demanded money. The suspect struck the victim several times and fled with three other males, who were waiting nearby. All four suspects left in a dark-colored sedan with temporary license plates. The main suspect was described as black, in his late teens. He was about 5 feet 6 inches tall and 150 pounds and was wearing a white tank top, blue jeans and a black bandana. No descriptions were available for the three other suspects. The victim did not require medical treatment.

MCLEAN DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 3)STOLEN AUTO/ARREST

Peach Orchard Drive

2000

Officers responded to the 2000 block of Peach Orchard Drive on Wednesday, December 24 for a report of a stolen car. The victim, a 28-year-old Falls Church man, started his car, a 2002 Dodge Neon, around 6:30 a.m. and left the car running as he went inside his house. Approximately 10 minutes later, he returned outside to find his car gone. On Saturday, December 27 around 9:30 p.m., an auxiliary police officer observed the car driving in the 13200 of Lee Jackson Memorial Highway and quickly turned onto a side street and stopped. The auxiliary and patrol officers pulled in behind the vehicle and its four occupants and took them into custody. Two 14-year-old girls, a 17-year-old boy and an 18-year-old man, all from Falls Church, were taken into custody. The juveniles were released to their parents and the adult was released as well. A petition for stolen auto will be obtained for the remaining teenager.

ROBBERY

Spring Hill Road

1300

A 21-year-old Vienna-area woman was the victim of a robbery on Saturday, December 27. The woman was reportedly walking in the 1300 block of Spring Hill Road around 3:30 p.m. when she was startled by a man hiding in the bushes. The suspect grabbed the woman, displayed a knife and demanded money. The victim complied and the suspect fled south on Spring Hill Road. The suspect was described as Hispanic, in his mid-twenties. He was about 5 feet 11 inches tall and 180 pounds with a scar on his forehead. He was wearing a black hoodie, a yellow shirt made by Echo and baggy, dark-colored pants. The victim did not require medical attention.

MASON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 4)**ASSAULT ON A POLICE OFFICER/DRUNK IN PUBLIC/ARREST**

Columbia Pike

7000

Patrol officers responded to the 7000 block of Columbia Pike for a report of a suspicious person on Sunday, December 28 around 9:30 p.m. They located a man sitting in the area and began talking to him. The officers determined the man appeared to be intoxicated and placed him under arrest. Once in custody, the suspect allegedly resisted and grabbed one of the officers' arms and refused commands to let go. They transported Fariborz Hidaroughli, 46, of no fixed address, to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where he was charged with drunk in public and assault on a police officer. The officer did not require medical treatment.

A man was arrested for allegedly watching a child through a window on Monday, December 29 around 8:55 p.m. The girl's father noticed the suspect peering through his daughter's window, apparently touching himself inappropriately and immediately called the police. Officers discovered the man still at the window and took him into custody. Sabastian Perez-Cedillo, 25, of 4903 Manitoba Drive #T2 in Alexandria, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with peeping.

Wainwright Drive

Saint Anne's Episcopal Church, located at 1700 Wainwright Drive, was burglarized some time between 8 p.m. on Tuesday, December 23 and 8 a.m. on Wednesday, December 24. A 59-year-old Reston woman arrived at the church Wednesday morning and heard a door slam shut in another part of the building. She went to investigate and discovered that numerous offices had been broken into; nothing appeared to be missing except for a small amount of cash from one of the offices. The woman was not injured and there is no suspect information available at this time.

BANK ROBBERY

Colts Neck Road

2200

*An employee of the Wachovia Bank, located at 2264 Colts Neck Road, was robbed on Friday, December 26. The victim, a 34-year-old Reston woman, was working behind the counter around 5:40 p.m. when a man reportedly armed with a gun walked in and demanded money. The victim complied and the suspect fled with an undisclosed amount of cash. The suspect was described as 25-30 years old with a medium-complexion. He was about 5 feet 6 inches tall with a medium build and wore a dark blue or gray winter coat with a light blue inner collar and red zipper. He also wore blue jeans, dark boots and a navy blue, knit mask.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

Old Farmhouse Court

2400

A 12-year-old boy was the victim of an attempted robbery on Monday, December 29 around 12:15 p.m. The victim was walking in the 2400 block of Old Farmhouse Court when three teenage boys reportedly approached him, struck him in the face and kicked him. The suspects went through his pockets and fled without taking anything. They were described as Hispanic, between 14 and 16 years old and all wore light blue hoodies. The first suspect was about 5 feet 2 inches tall and 140 pounds. He also wore blue jeans. The other two suspects were about 5 feet 8 to 5 feet 9 inches tall and 140 pounds. One of them wore a white shirt under the hoodie. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries.

UNLAWFUL ENTRY/ARREST

Sideburn Road

Police arrested a 21-year-old Fairfax Station man on Saturday, December 27, after he was found inside a school at night. School security requested officers at Robinson High School, located at 5035 Sideburn Road, at 3:52 a.m. An investigation determined the security officers responded to a burglar alarm activation at the school and reportedly located the man walking around inside and took him into custody. The man entered the school through a door on the roof. James R. Mattingly, of 6320 Karmich Street, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with unlawful entry. Nothing was taken from inside the school.

STOLEN VEHICLE/ PURSUIT/ ARREST

Backlick Road/ Alban Road

Four teenagers were arrested on Saturday, December 27 after a brief traffic pursuit. Around 2:30 a.m., Fairfax County officers observed a Virginia State Trooper in pursuit of a vehicle. The cars were traveling south on Backlick Road and turned onto Alban Road. During the pursuit, officers attempted to utilize the precision immobilization technique and the suspect vehicle rammed a

police cruiser. The suspect vehicle was stopped on Pohick Road and three suspects fled on foot. After a brief foot pursuit, all three were apprehended. A fourth suspect was apprehended inside the car. Police determined the car was previously stolen in Washington, D.C. The suspects, a 16-year-old Washington, D.C. boy, a 15-year-old Falls Church-area boy, a 15-year-old Springfield-area girl and a 15-year-old Fairfax-area girl, were transported to the West Springfield District Station and released to their parents. Fairfax County Police will obtain petitions against the teens and further charges are possible by Virginia State Police.

ROBBERY

Fair Lakes Shopping Center

Two men robbed a 21-year-old Springfield-area woman on Wednesday, December 24. The woman was walking toward her car in the shopping center parking lot around 4:15 p.m. As she approached the car, two men appeared and one of them reportedly opened her car door and attempted to steal her GPS unit from inside. The victim ran to the other side of the car and removed the GPS unit. As she held it, the other man pushed her and forcefully removed it from her hands. Both suspects fled on foot through the parking lot. They were described as black, in their late teens to early 20s. The first suspect was about 6 feet tall and 180 pounds. He was wearing a dark maroon-colored hoodie and jeans. The second suspect was about 5 feet 10 inches tall and 180 pounds. He was wearing khaki pants. The victim did not require medical treatment.

WARRANT SERVICE/ FOOT PURSUIT/ ARREST

Dower House Drive/ West Ox Road

Officers chased a man after he fled during a warrant service. On Sunday, December 28 around 10:40 a.m., two officers attempted to serve a warrant from another jurisdiction in the 3100 block of Dower House Drive. The officers observed the wanted man leaving the home in a car and stopped the vehicle at Dower House Drive and West Ox Road. The suspect exited the car and failed to obey the commands of the officers. He fled on foot and the officers chased him. He was located nearby on Briarwood Court and taken into custody. Jerrell L. Crosby, 29, of 3109 Dower House Court in Herndon, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. In addition to the outstanding warrant, Crosby was also charged with escape without force.
