Addresses shown indicate blocks and not specific locations. Thus an entry showing Chain Bridge Road 4100 would mean the 4100 *block* of Chain Bridge Road, not the address 4100 Chain Bridge Road.

An asterisk (*) before an item indicates that an incident report was distributed on that offense.

Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS

COUNTY INITIATIVES

*Along with law enforcement agencies across the nation, Fairfax County Police officers will step up seat belt enforcement and education efforts during the Click It or Ticket mobilization beginning this week. Motorists should expect to see officers conducting seatbelt surveys at many intersections across the county through June 1. Click It or Ticket is a high-visibility enforcement program designed to raise safety belt usage and save Virginians from roadway deaths and injuries. There were 52 people killed in 47 crashes in 2007 on Fairfax County roadways. Of those victims, 16 were either pedestrians or bicyclists. Of the other fatal crashes, just 48 percent were wearing restraints. Fairfax County Police officers issued 6,196 seat belt violations during 2007. Statewide, according to preliminary numbers from the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), there were 1,026 fatalities in Virginia in 2007. Of those, 60 percent were not wearing safety restraints. When worn correctly, seat belts have proven to reduce the risk of fatal injury to front-seat passenger car occupants by 45 percent, and 60 percent in pickup trucks, SUVs and mini-vans. Yet, nearly one in four Virginians fail to regularly wear their seat belts when driving or riding in a vehicle.

SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)

BURGLARY OF OCCUPIED DWELLING/ARREST

Gladewright Drive

A 57-year-old Centreville woman witnessed a burglar in her home on Wednesday, May 14 around 3:45 p.m. She was in the basement of her home in the 5400 block of Gladewright Drive when she saw a man run out the sliding glass door. It appeared that nothing was taken and the suspect entered through an unlocked sliding door. An investigation led police to question Scott Sanford, of 5421 Goldmoore Court in Centreville. Sanford, 27, was taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with burglary.

DWI ENFORCEMENT INITIATIVE

Sully District

*Beginning May 16 and running through June 22, officers from the Sully District Police Station will conduct an intensive drunk driving enforcement campaign. Greater saturation will take place during graduation and Memorial Day weekends. The goal is to ensure safe and sober celebrations. Officers assigned to this detail will be conducting directed patrols throughout the Sully District to deter and apprehend intoxicated drivers. Motorists stopped for suspicion of driving while intoxicated will undergo a field interview to assure that their abilities to drive have not been impaired by alcohol or drugs. Specific dates in May and June have been targeted although the enforcement will be ongoing during this entire period. The Fairfax County Police Department takes the issue of drinking and driving very seriously. This effort combined with ongoing DWI enforcement initiatives throughout the county are designed to prevent alcohol related crashes and make the roadways safer.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)**HOMICIDE**

Furman Lane

2900

*Police responded to a call for a shot person in an apartment in the 2900 block of Furman Lane on Saturday, May 10 shortly after 11 p.m. Officers discovered a deceased man, shot in the upper body. Preliminary suspect information was a male, wearing dark-colored pants and a black, hooded sweat shirt. Detectives from the Criminal Investigation Bureau, crime scene technicians, the police helicopter and K9 units responded to the scene. The victim has been identified as 49-year-old Michael Anthony Ross, of Suitland Maryland. This is the eighth homicide in Fairfax County this year.

ASSAULT BY MOB/ARRESTS

Village Green Drive

8600

On Saturday, May 10 around 10:30 p.m., four male teenagers assaulted a 24-year-old Alexandria-area man in the 8600 block of Village Green Drive. The suspects were confronted by the victim's friend and all fled. The victim was treated on the scene for minor injuries. The friend chased the suspects until police arrived. Two of the suspects were detained and released to their parents or guardians. Charges of assault by mob will be obtained on two Alexandria-area 14-year-olds and a 16-year-old from Lorton.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING

Richmond Highway

A 32-year-old Alexandria-area man was assaulted behind the Las Vegas Club restaurant at 6151 Richmond Highway. On Tuesday, May 13 around 8:45 p.m., the victim encountered a man he had seen before who asked him to step outside. Once outside, the man became confrontational and struck the victim with a piece of wood. The suspect fled and the victim was not seriously injured. The suspect was described as white with short, brown hair and a mustache. He was about 5 feet 10 inches tall and weighed 150 pounds. He wore a white, striped shirt and dark pants. The case is under investigation.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

Buckman Road/Richmond Highway

Four teenage males attempted to rob a 32-year-old Alexandria-area man on Friday, May 9. He was walking toward Richmond Highway on Buckman Road around 10:45 p.m. when the suspects approached. They asked for his money and when the victim did not comply, they assaulted him. The suspects fled with nothing and the victim was not injured. The suspects were described as Hispanic, about 16 years old. The victim could only describe one suspect in detail. He was about 5 feet 8 inches tall and weighed 160 pounds. He had long hair, a mustache and wore a gray jacket.

MASON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 4)**ASSAULT ON POLICE OFFICER/ARREST**

Parkwood Court

On Friday, May 9 around 9:15 p.m., an officer noticed a man walk by who stared intensely at her. She questioned him, as he appeared to be intoxicated. The man charged the officer, pinning her against a wall. They struggled briefly before the suspect ran into an apartment. The officer followed and deployed the conductive energy device (CED). A second officer responded to assist in the arrest and the suspect reportedly attacked him as well. The CED was again deployed but had no effect. The suspect, Dolman Cifuentes, attempted to disarm the second officer and was struck by police with their batons. Cifuentes, 20, was then placed under arrest and taken to Inova Fairfax Hospital for minor injuries. He was treated and released then taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Cifuentes, of 7249 Parkwood Court #101 in Falls Church, was charged with attempted to disarm a police officer and two counts of assault on a police officer.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ARREST

Lakewood Drive

6300

Police responded to the 6300 block of Lakewood Drive for a stabbing on Sunday, May 11. A 30-year-old Falls Church-area man got into an altercation with an acquaintance around 9:30 p.m. Donovan Harper, 23, allegedly stabbed the victim in the upper body and fled. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with life-threatening injuries. Officers located Harper and a 16-year-old Falls Church-area female a short time later. Both had outstanding warrants on unrelated charges and were arrested. Harper, of 101 Chanel Terrace #102 in Falls Church, was also charged with malicious wounding and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. He was taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. The juvenile was wanted by Falls Church City Police and was released to them at the county line.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING

Glen Carlyn Drive

3400

A 29-year-old Falls Church-area man was stabbed on Wednesday, May 14. He got off a bus with a former girlfriend near the 3400 block of Glen Carlyn Drive around 11:30 p.m. Her current boyfriend was waiting for her and saw the victim with her. The victim was walking away from the bus when the suspect stabbed him in the upper body. The victim turned and recognized the suspect then ran to call police. The suspect fled. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The case is still under investigation.

WEAPON BRANDISHING/RECKLESS DISCHARGE/ARREST

Westlawn Drive

Neighbors in the 6700 block of Westlawn Drive called police to report a man waving a gun around. This occurred on Saturday, May 10 around 3:30 p.m. Police arrived and ordered all the occupants out of the house, then recovered the gun. The investigation revealed that Domingo Castro, 38, allegedly got into an argument with a family member and armed himself with the gun. The family member, a 48-year-old Falls Church man, tried to wrestle the gun away when Castro fired one round. The victim was not injured. Castro, of 6733 Westlawn Drive, was arrested and taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with brandishing and reckless discharge of a weapon.

GRAFFITI/ARRESTS

Falls Church/Annandale areas

*Officers and detectives of various agencies have made the initial arrests for a series for destruction by graffiti cases. Carlos Lara, 18, of 3100 South Manchester Street, Falls Church, was arrested on Wednesday, May 7 and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Lara and two juveniles, a 17-year-old Falls Church-area boy and 16-year-old Arlington boy, have been charged with felony destruction of property. The three arrested are accused of writing graffiti on several locations in the Northern Virginia area. Examples of their work have been found as far back as December 2007. It is believed they are responsible for graffiti on as many as 50 different locations at a cost that could exceed \$50,000. These cases are being investigated and coordinated through the efforts of officers from the Fairfax County Police Department, the Arlington County Police Department, the United States Postal Service and the Northern Virginia Community College Police Department.

RESTON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 5)TRAIL SAFETY

Washington and Old Dominion Trail

*Officers from the Reston District will be conducting an enhanced pedestrian education and enforcement campaign beginning Saturday, May 10 in order to prevent injuries and deaths due to pedestrian and cyclist crashes. While the enforcement and education effort will take place across

the Reston area, pedestrians and cyclists on the Washington and Old Dominion (W&OD) Trail will be specifically targeted.

Since January 2005, there have been 55 bicycle and pedestrian vehicle crashes in the Reston District, with the highest number occurring at the intersection of Sunset Hills Road and Wiehle Avenue. There have been eight crashes there, which is the highest for any single location in the county. In 2007, 14 pedestrians and two bicyclists were killed in collisions with vehicles. This enforcement and education effort will run through May 23.

Efforts will include increased patrols on the station's Kubota all-terrain vehicle, as well as members of the bike enforcement team. They will be distributing literature that explains the laws governing the interaction between vehicles, bicyclists and pedestrians. Large, electronic signboards will be posted along the roadways reminding motorists to share the road safely with bicyclists and pedestrians.

Pedestrian safety is a high priority of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors. For information about the Fairfax County Pedestrian Program, go to <http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/fcdot/pedestrian.htm>. When using trails, Fairfax Police urge the public to use caution.

Pedestrians should:

- Cross the street at marked crosswalks and intersections.
- Before crossing, look left, right then left again.
- Use pedestrian pushbuttons.
- Begin crossing the street on "Walk" signal.
- Stay visible after dark and in bad weather.

Bicyclists should:

- Obey all regulatory signs and traffic lights.
- Never ride against traffic.
- Use hand signals to tell motorists what you intend to do.
- Ride in a straight line to the right of traffic and about a car door width away from parked cars.
- Always wear a helmet.
- Use lights at night and when visibility is poor.

Drivers should:

- Stop for pedestrians.
- Slow down and obey the posted speed limit.
- Look before opening your door.
- Be careful when passing stopped vehicles.
- Allow 3 feet when passing bicyclists.

They were about 5 feet 9 inches tall and weighed 180 pounds. Both suspects wore black, hooded sweat shirts covering their faces and blue jeans.
