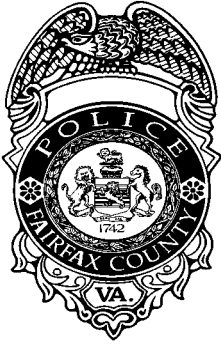

An asterisk (*) before an item indicates that an incident report was distributed on that offense.

Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS

SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)

SHOULDER TAP OPERATION

*On Friday, June 12, officers of the Sully District Station, along with a member of the Traffic Safety Services Unit, conducted a "Shoulder Tap" at several locations in the Centreville and Chantilly areas of the county. This undercover operation is part of the ongoing Youth Alcohol/Business Compliance enforcement campaign. Fairfax County police cadets dressed in plain clothes attempted to have adults purchase alcohol for them in violation of Virginia State Code 4.1-306. The locations of enforcement for this operation were parking lots of businesses that possess state ABC licenses to sell alcoholic beverages. The cadets were advised to approach adults in the parking lots and ask them to purchase alcohol for them. If asked by the adult if they were 21, the cadets were told to respond with their true age. If the illegal purchase of alcohol took place, a plain clothes officer watching the transaction would intervene. Appropriate charges would then be placed. As a result of this operation, 47 adults were approached. Five arrests were made for illegal purchase of alcohol at the following locations:

The "Shoulder Tap" operation was conducted using one team, each consisting of one cadet, two plain clothes officers and one uniformed officer serving as a security team.

ROBBERY/ASSAULT

Lee Jackson Memorial Highway/ Chantilly Road

A 26-year-old man was the victim of a robbery and assault on Friday, June 12. Police were called to a home in the 4100 block of Hamlin Court at 10:08 a.m. Officers determined the victim was riding his bicycle several hours earlier around midnight on a service road for Lee Jackson Memorial Highway near Chantilly Road when he encountered another man on a bicycle coming toward him. As the two passed each other, the other man pushed the victim off his bicycle. The suspect kicked the victim several times before removing money and a cellular phone from his pocket. The victim attempted to leave with his bicycle but the suspect threatened him and took the bicycle away. The victim ran away on foot and waited to report the incident to police. The victim was transported to Inova Fair Oaks Hospital and treated for non life-threatening injuries. The suspect was described as Hispanic, 25 to 30 years old. He was 5 feet 6 inches tall and 160 pounds. He was wearing black, baggy jeans, a white Polo-style shirt and a black hat with the letter "N" on it.

GRAND LARCENY/SPEED TO ELUDE/DRIVING ON A SUSPENDED LICENSE/ARREST

Interstate 66/ Sully Road

A man was arrested on Friday, June 12 for driving a stolen vehicle. An officer was driving on Interstate 66 near Nutley Street around 10:20 p.m. when he observed a man driving a stolen 2005 Pontiac Grand Prix. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle but the suspect did not yield and a traffic pursuit began. Officers were able to stop the car on I-66 near Sully Road and they arrested Steven Burke Jr., 24, of no fixed address. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with grand larceny, speed to elude and driving on a suspended license. No one was injured during this event.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/ SIMPLE ASSAULT

Multiplex Drive

6200

Three teenage boys were the victims of an attempted robbery and assault on Friday, June 12. Police were called to the Multiplex movie theater, located at 6201 Multiplex Drive, at 10:54 p.m. Officers determined the three victims, 14, 15 and 16 years old, left the theater and walked to their car in the parking lot. While standing outside their car, three other teenaged boys drove up to them in a car. They exited their vehicle, implied a gun and demanded money from the victims. Two suspects assaulted two of the victims; the victims yelled out to a passerby for help and ran toward the front of the theater as the suspects fled. The victims did not require medical treatment. The three suspects were described as black, in their late teens. Suspect one was about 6 feet 2 inches tall and 154 pounds. He was wearing jean shorts, a black shirt with the words "Centreville High School" on it and glasses. The second suspect was about 5 feet 5 inches tall and 110 pounds. He was wearing a black shirt and jeans. The third suspect was 5 feet 7 inches tall and 170 pounds. He was wearing a red shirt. The suspects were in a red, two-door Chevrolet Monte Carlo.

Richmond Highway

* The U.S. Marshals Service arrested Tyree Harvey, 18, of no fixed address, around 1 a.m. on Sunday, June 14 for a homicide that occurred in the 9100 block of Richmond Highway. On Wednesday, June 10, shortly after 11 p.m., fire and rescue personnel responded to that location for an unrelated medical call. When they arrived, they located the body of a man lying outside on the sidewalk and called police at 11:28 p.m. The victim was identified as William J. Bowie, 54, of no fixed address. Preliminarily, it appears Bowie died from a gunshot wound to the upper body. Harvey was located in Prince George's County and transported to the Prince George's County Correctional Center. He awaits extradition to Fairfax County where warrants will be served for murder and attempted robbery for the homicide that occurred on Wednesday, June 10 in the 9100 block of Richmond Highway. A woman was charged with forgery and uttering after she allegedly committed check fraud on Thursday, March 5. The woman was working at Belle View Elementary School, located at 6701 Fort Hunt Road, and collected several checks as part of her duties. Shortly before 2 p.m. a 32-year-old woman was in her home when a man kicked in the front door, displayed a handgun and told her not to move. The suspect then went to a rear door to let another man inside. An acquaintance of the victim entered the home and the two suspects fled out a rear door. No items were stolen and there were no injuries. Both suspects were Hispanic. They were wearing black clothing and black masks. RECKLESS DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM IN AN OCCUPIED DWELLING/ARREST

Radcliffe Drive

A man was arrested on Thursday, June 11 for firing several shots inside his home in the 6800 block of Radcliffe Drive. Police responded around 10:10 p.m. and saw the man inside the house with a gun. Officers made contact with the suspect and arrested him without incident. Payne Street

A man was arrested after breaking into a home in the 3400 block of Payne Street and assaulting a man and woman inside. On Sunday, June 13 around 1:30 a.m., the victims, 20 and 28, were sleeping and awoke when they heard someone walking around inside. Upon investigating, the male victim saw the man and tried to call police but the suspect assaulted him. A struggle ensued and the female victim assisted in subduing the suspect. Elias Carballo Diaz, 24, of an unknown address, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged

with burglary, stalking, violation of a protection order, interfering with a 9-1-1 call and destruction of property. The victims were not seriously injured and declined medical attention.

ROBBERY

Furman Lane

Police charged a man for filing a false police report on Sunday, June 14. Officers responded to a report of a robbery around 3:42 p.m. in the 2900 block of Furman Lane. The 18-year-old victim claimed that he was robbed while walking through an apartment complex. He reported that two men approached and one of them brandished a handgun. He demanded the victim's property and the victim complied. An investigation determined that the robbery never occurred and on Wednesday, June 17, detectives charged Robert James Grant, of Baton Rouge, Louisiana, with falsely reporting a crime to law enforcement.

Police arrested a man for exposing himself to a 44-year-old woman on Monday, June 15. The woman was outside in the area of Van Dyke Street and Moon Street around 8:20 p.m. when the man exposed himself while standing in the doorway of a trailer. Police responded and an investigation led to the arrest of Gary Peterson, 48, of 186 Spriggs Lane in Reedville, Virginia. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with indecent exposure.

A 24-year-old man was robbed of his bicycle and wallet on Tuesday, June 16. The victim was walking in the 8000 block of Central Park Drive around 9:54 p.m. when two men started following him and calling out to him. The two men caught up to the victim, grabbed him and took his bike and wallet, which contained an undisclosed amount of cash. The victim ran to a friend's house nearby and called police. The suspects were described as black, between 20 and 25 years old. They were about 5 feet 9 inches tall and 180 pounds, with brown eyes and black, braided hair. ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/BRANDISHING A FIREARM/ARREST

Southland Avenue/Frenchmens Drive

A 14-year-old boy attempted to rob a 12-year-old boy on Thursday, June 11 around 4:30 p.m. The victim was in the area of Southland Avenue and Frenchmens Drive waiting for a friend

when the teenager approached, pointed an Airsoft-type gun at him and demanded money. The victim refused; the suspect pushed him twice and again demanded money. The victim's mother happened to pull up in a car and the victim walked away. Police responded and arrested the teenager. He was transported to the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center and charged with attempted robbery and brandishing. The victim was not injured.

BURGLARY/ GRAND LARCENY/ ARREST

Beauregard Street

Police charged a 21-year-old man after he allegedly broke into an apartment and stole items. Police were called to the 4900 block of Beauregard Street at 1:08 a.m. on Friday, June 12 for an unknown situation. Officers located a group of males outside an apartment building. An investigation determined the group was confronting another male who reportedly entered their apartment through an unlocked door. The suspect took several items while inside and was seen as he exited the apartment. The victims were able to recover the items from the suspect prior to police arrival. *A 6-year-old girl was the victim of an attempted abduction on Saturday, June 13. The victim was inside the Payless ShoeSource store, located at 3501 South Jefferson Street, around 4:30 p.m. She asked an employee for assistance and a man standing behind her offered to help. He led her outside the store. When they reached the parking lot, the victim asked for her parents and headed back toward the store. She found her parents and walked outside with them to find the suspect, but he was gone. The suspect was described as white, between 20 and 30 years old. He was about 5 feet 8 inches tall and 175 pounds, with straight, medium-length black hair. Seven Corners Center

A 46-year-old man was the victim of a robbery on Saturday, June 13 around 10 p.m. The victim was in the parking garage of a store in the 6200 block of Seven Corners Center when he was approached by three other men. One suspect threatened the victim and demanded his motor scooter. When the victim did not comply, the suspects allegedly assaulted him and brandished a handgun and a knife. A store employee interrupted the robbery; the suspects fled with the motor scooter. The victim returned home and called police around 2:30 a.m. on Sunday, June 14. The victim did not require medical attention. The suspects were all described as Hispanic, in their 20s. The first suspect was 5 feet 8 inches tall and 160 pounds. He was wearing a Chicago Bulls shirt and jeans. The second suspect was 5 feet 7 inches tall with a heavy build. He was wearing a

white shirt and jeans. The third suspect was 5 feet 9 inches tall and 160 pounds. He was wearing a gray shirt and jeans.

BURGLARY WITH INTENT TO ASSAULT WITH A WEAPON/ATTEMPTED MALICIOUS WOUNDING/DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY/ARREST

Manitoba Drive

4800

A man was arrested for burglarizing an acquaintance's home in the 4800 block of Manitoba Drive on Sunday, June 14. The victim, a 34-year-old man, heard someone knock on his door around 11:45 p.m. He opened the door and saw the acquaintance standing there with a sword. The victim quickly shut the door but the suspect walked around back and forced entry through another door. The suspect chased the victim who fled and called for a friend to pick him up. Police responded but could not locate the suspect. About 30 minutes later an officer saw the suspect driving and stopped him near the intersection of Little River Turnpike and Beauregard Street. They arrested Julio Rodriguez Cruz, 37, of 7802 Appamattox Avenue in Manassas, and transported him to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with burglary with intent to assault with a weapon, attempted malicious wounding and destruction of property.

ATTEMPTED UNLAWFUL WOUNDING/FELONY DESTRUCTION/UNLAWFUL ENTRY/PROVIDE FALSE IDENTIFICATION TO POLICE/ARREST

John Court

Police arrested a man for breaking into a home in the 3600 block of John Court on Sunday, June 14 around 1:30 a.m. A 28-year-old woman was sleeping but awoke when she heard a loud noise in another part of the house. She went to investigate and saw a man standing inside a broken glass door. He was looking for another woman who also lived in the home, but left when he did not find her there. Several minutes later, the suspect returned with the other woman, also 28 years old, and they went into a bedroom. Police were called after the suspect allegedly threatened the second victim with a knife. Officers responded and their investigation led to the arrest of Oscar Hidalgo, 23, of 4016 Thornton Street in Annandale. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with attempted unlawful wounding, felony destruction, unlawful entry and providing false identification to police. The victims were not injured.

As they entered I-95, the driver crashed the vehicle into a jersey wall. The suspect exited the car and fled on foot.
