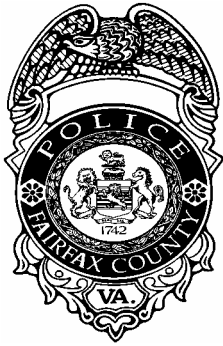

POLICE SURVEY

* The Fairfax County Police Department wants to hear from you. A public survey has been posted on the agency web page in an effort to solicit your ideas and concerns. Officials are seeking greater community input in an effort to provide better service to the diverse population of Fairfax County. Constructive feedback is vital in helping the agency evaluate and improve our services to the public, according to John Kapinos, Strategic Planner for the Police Department. "To date, more than 70 percent of our respondents have expressed overall satisfaction with our services," said Kapinos, who tabulates the results monthly and plans to evaluate them quarterly. "Our survey offers an opportunity for the public to tell us what they like, what they need and where they feel we can make improvements." In addition to the web survey (which can be found at www.fairfaxcounty.gov/police) officers are distributing the survey at public meetings and at district stations.

SEXTING FORUM

Rolling Road

6100

* Back by popular demand, the Fairfax County Police Department hosted a second public forum on sexting at West Springfield High School, located at 6100 Rolling Road, on Wednesday, May 13 from 7 to 9 p.m. Fairfax teens, along with others across the nation, are increasingly involved in sending racy photos via cell phone and other electronic devices. The forum provided an opportunity to learn more about sexting and the potentially devastating consequences for teens and their families. A school resource officer, a member of the online child sexual exploitation unit and a representative from the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children presented powerful discussions on the issue. Delegate Dave Albo, Virginia House of Delegates, Supervisor Pat Herrity, Fairfax County Board of Supervisors, and Ray Morrogh, Commonwealth's Attorney for Fairfax County were also available for questions regarding the issue here in Fairfax County.

* A 16-year-old Centreville girl woke up around 3:36 a.m. on Sunday, May 10 to find a man standing in her room. Furman Lane

* Fairfax County Crime Solvers is still asking for the public's assistance in identifying and locating the person responsible for killing a 49-year-old man. Police responded to a shooting in the 2900 block of Furman Lane on Saturday, May 10 at 11 p.m. Officers found the deceased victim, Michael Anthony Ross of Suitland, Maryland, lying outside next to an apartment patio. An investigation determined Ross was shot in the upper body as he stood outside at the sliding glass door of an apartment. The suspect was described as black, between 18 and 25 years old. He was 5 feet 8 inches to 5 feet 10 inches tall and 150 to 170 pounds. He was wearing all black clothing. DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM INTO A VEHICLE/ARREST

A man was arrested for allegedly shooting at a vehicle on Monday, May 11 around 10:08 p.m. An investigation determined two men were standing in the 6000 block of Shaffer Drive when one of them pulled out a handgun and fired a shot at a dark-colored, four-door car as it was driving away. Officers located the suspect working as an armed security guard at a bowling alley nearby and further investigation led to his arrest. Hitesh Gupta, 29, of 14701 Hackwood Street in Woodbrige, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with the discharge of a firearm into a vehicle. No victims were identified in this case.

Police responded to the 8700 block of Richmond Highway for a burglary on Tuesday, May 12. An investigation determined that around 12:20 a.m. a man burglarized the Family Dollar store, located at 8734 Richmond Highway. The suspect broke into the safe and took an undisclosed amount of cash. The suspect also apparently moved a soda machine from its original location but nothing appeared to be missing from it. The suspect was described as black, about 20 years old. He was about 6 feet tall, 190 pounds and wore a black jacket, black jeans, gloves and a beanie.

*On Wednesday, May 6, over 135 law enforcement personnel participated in concluding a year-long undercover investigation. Operation Build America was launched in May 2008 to better understand the criminal activity taking place in and around the Build America Shopping Center. The shopping center is nestled in the Skyline community in the 3800 block of South George Mason Drive. Community concerns of illegal activities in the shopping center coupled with indicators that crime was in the upswing sprung the operation into motion. The investigation successfully infiltrated several criminal organizations and businesses operating around the center. Undercover police officers identified nearly 40 people suspected of criminal activity that ranges from property crimes to crimes of violence. The undercover operation successfully recovered stolen firearms and illegal narcotics including cocaine and marijuana. Collectively, 143 criminal arrest warrants and 15 search warrants were issued in this undercover operation. The success of the operation can be attributed to the coordinated effort of several units and agencies:

GRAND LARCENY/ASSAULT ON A POLICE OFFICER/POSSESSION OF BURGLARIOUS TOOLS/ESCAPE WITH FORCE/NO DRIVER'S LICENSE/ARREST

Little River Turnpike 6500

An officer responded to The Home Depot, located at 6555 Little River Turnpike, for a shoplifting report on Wednesday, May 13 around 5:10 p.m. While inside, an employee alerted the officer to another shoplifting that was allegedly taking place. The officer located the suspect and attempted to talk to him but the suspect would not comply. After giving the suspect several commands to stop, the officer tried to physically gain control of the suspect who resisted and got into a car. He drove away in a 1991 Honda Accord but responding officers located the vehicle nearby and arrested the driver. John McLamb, 50, of Chicago, Illinois, was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital for non life-threatening injuries and then taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with grand larceny, assault on a police officer, possession of burglarious tools, escape with force and no driver's license.

A 15-year-old Reston boy was arrested for touching a female student inappropriately at South Lakes High School, located at 11400 South Lakes Drive, on Wednesday, May 6. The victim, 15, from Reston, was in a girls' locker room around 10:25 a.m. when the boy walked in and started chatting with her. She asked him to leave but he did not. She asked him to leave again and he asked for a hug. As they hugged, he allegedly touched her inappropriately and the victim pushed him away. She tried to leave the locker room, but the suspect reportedly prevented her from walking out and again touched her inappropriately. The victim was able to exit the locker room and school personnel were notified. An investigation led to the boy's arrest on Friday, May 8. He was transported to the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center. He was charged with abduction and misdemeanor sexual battery.

* A 28-year-old woman was awakened by an unidentified man standing in her bedroom on Thursday, May 7 around 5:15 a.m. The man had apparently snuck into her apartment in the 11000 block of Vantage Hill Road but nothing was reported stolen. The suspect was described as Hispanic, between 5 feet 5 inches and 5 feet 8 inches tall and 160 to 170 pounds. He wore a gray, hooded sweat shirt and sweat pants. He was between 25 and 30 years old. * Police were called to the 2600 block of John Milton Drive on Friday, May 8 at 7:33 p.m. for a stabbing. Officers located a 17-year-old boy lying in the roadway with several neighbors assisting him. The victim was medevaced to Inova Fairfax Hospital and treated for his non life-threatening injuries. An investigation determined the victim was with an acquaintance when the two had a disagreement. During the confrontation, the suspect stabbed the victim in the upper body and fled. Detectives identified the suspect, a 17-year-old Reston boy. He was apprehended on Saturday, May 9 and transported to the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center where he was charged with malicious wounding.

FELONY SPEED TO ELUDE/RECKLESS DRIVING/ARREST

Springvale Road

An officer was responding to a hit and run crash around 5:08 p.m. on Tuesday, May 12 when he spotted the fleeing car driving in the 800 block of Springvale Road. The officer activated his emergency equipment and attempted to stop the vehicle, a 2006 Mercedes-Benz SLK350. The driver allegedly accelerated and a traffic pursuit was initiated. The pursuit ended near the area of Brockman Lane and Seneca Road when the suspect attempted to make a U-turn and collided with the officer's police cruiser. Bridie McGowan, 54, of 191 Somerville Street #102 in Alexandria, was arrested and transported to the Reston Hospital Center with non life-threatening injuries. She was issued a summons for reckless driving. Further charges are possible. The officer was not injured.

* Fairfax County Crime Solvers is asking for the public's assistance in identifying the man believed to be responsible for two separate larcenies at a home in the 8000 block of Ox Road. Police were first called to the home on Wednesday, April 15. Officers determined a 2003 Suzuki DRZ125 dirt bike was stolen from a locked shed on the property some time between April 14 and April 15. Four days later, on Sunday, April 19, police were again called to the residence around 12:20 a.m. An investigation determined the 45-year-old victim saw a man removing tools from his locked shed around 12:10 a.m. The victim and his 18-year-old son ran outside and chased the suspect a short distance before they caught him. The 45-year old victim was injured during a struggle with the suspect; who was able to escape and flee on foot. The injured victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital and treated for his non life-threatening injuries. The suspect was described as white, 45 to 50 years old. He was about 5 feet 7 inches tall and 180 pounds. He was wearing blue jeans and a dark-colored sweater. ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION
