Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**COUNTYWIDE****ROADCHECK 2009**

*Fairfax County Police conducted comprehensive truck safety inspections as a part of the national RoadCheck 2009 annual safety effort on Thursday, June 4. Officers assigned to the Motor Carrier Safety unit inspected 21 vehicles in the Chantilly area. Almost half of the trucks were placed out of service for significant safety infractions and officers noted a total of 117 safety violations. The safety check ran from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m. and was one of many held across the country this week in conjunction with the annual RoadCheck 2009 campaign, coordinated by the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance. Motor Carrier Safety Officers are an integral part of the Fairfax County Police Department. Of the 1,768 trucks and trailers inspected in 2008, nearly 46 percent were ordered off the roads for safety violations. RoadCheck 2009 is sponsored by the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance and mobilizes federal, state and local inspectors for a 72-hour enforcement and educational truck safety effort. SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)**UPDATE: AGGRAVATED SEXUAL BATTERY/INDECENT LIBERTIES WITH A CHILD BY A PERSON WITH CUSTODIAL OR SUPERVISORY RELATIONSHIP**

Fort Hunt Road

*On Friday, June 5 shortly after 10 a.m., detectives charged John E. Hamilton with two counts of sodomy in connection with their ongoing investigation. The warrants were obtained and executed on Hamilton who remains incarcerated at the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. The new charges stem from allegations made by two additional victims; one is now 19 years old, the other 28. In the case of the 19-year-old, the incidents allegedly occurred from October through December of 2001. The 28-year-old victim alleges that the offenses took place from December 1992 until April of 1993. Both victims lived in the Hollin Hall area at that time. Hamilton acted in a coaching capacity for both of these victims. Due to the complex and delicate nature of this investigation, additional resources have been allocated. The most recent charges do not reflect all of the allegations or all of the potential victims in this case. Detectives understand that victims may fear coming forward for various reasons, but want to encourage them to do so in order to bring this investigation to a comprehensive, successful conclusion as soon as possible. BEWARE OF BEARS

Clifton area

*Police received the first reports of a bear sighting in 2009 on Monday, June 8. Residents observed a young black bear trolling through back yards in the Clifton-area shortly after 7 a.m.

According to animal control officers, it is not unusual to see black bears at this time of year and residents should not panic or feel alarmed when they see one. According to the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, Virginia's bear population is healthy and growing, estimating that the population has grown by about 37 percent since 2001. Bears typically avoid humans but in their search for food it is not uncommon to see them. Most often, bears will keep moving through an area once they fail in their attempts to find food. Unless the animal is sick or injured, or is deemed a threat to public safety, animal control officers do not take actions to attempt to remove bears from a neighborhood. Black bears have a natural fear of humans and, in most cases, would rather flee than encounter people. If addressed quickly, wildlife issues caused by food attractants in yards can be resolved almost immediately. Take the following precautions to keep bears, and other wildlife, away from your home:

- Do not store household trash on porches, decks or in vehicles.
- Keep it secured in a garage, shed or basement if possible.
- If a bear is sighted in your neighborhood, remove birdfeeders.
- Take garbage to the curb on the morning of pickup, rather than the night before.
- Consider installing electric fencing around gardens, dumpsters and other potential wildlife food sources. Electric fencing is an inexpensive and efficient proven deterrent against bears.

* Police are investigating a burglary of an occupied dwelling that occurred on Tuesday, June 9 in the 8200 block of Westchester Drive. She went downstairs to investigate and saw a man come inside through an unlocked rear sliding glass door. The homeowner asked the man what he was doing in her home. The suspect left the house. No items were stolen. The suspect who entered the home was white, in his early 20s, with curly, brown hair. He was wearing a white T-shirt and dark pants. The second suspect was Asian, in his early 20s. He was thin, wearing a white T-shirt, blue jeans and black rimmed glasses. There was no further description of the third suspect.

GANG RECRUITMENT/GANG PARTICIPATION/HAZING/ARREST

*Nine high school students have been charged with gang recruitment for the initiation of another student into a gang. A police investigation began on Tuesday, March 31 when the School Resource Officer at Edison High School discovered that a student had been jumped into a gang on Friday, March 20. The nine students reportedly walked with the victim, a 16-year-old boy, to a path near Gum Street and Woodway Drive around 3 p.m. and allegedly punched and kicked the victim for about a minute. Chaimongkhon Ruengvivatanakij, 18, of 4524 Roundhill Road in Alexandria, was arrested on May 8 and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. The eight minors, between 14 and 16 years old, were also arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center. Everyone was charged with gang participation, gang recruitment and hazing.

ROBBERY

Brook Hills Drive

A man was robbed by an acquaintance on Friday, June 5. The 24-year-old victim was with the acquaintance around 2:20 a.m. They met up with two other people, a man and a woman, and got into a white vehicle. They drove around for a short time and when they were in the 4900 block of Brook Hills Drive, the driver stopped the vehicle and all three men took the victim out of the car. One of the suspects punched him and the other two took his wallet. The suspects left the victim on the road and fled in the vehicle. The suspects were described as Hispanic, in their 20s. The acquaintance was described as about 6 feet tall and 180 pounds, with brown, medium-length corn rows and a goatee. He wore a brown and black shirt with a design and black pants. The driver of the vehicle was about 5 feet 8 inches tall and 140 pounds, with short, black hair and a moustache. The third suspect was about 5 feet 7 inches tall and 150 pounds, with a beard and short, black hair. The woman was about 5 feet 6 inches tall and 112 pounds, with straight, long, black hair. The victim was treated at the scene for minor injuries.

ROBBERY

Springfield Mall

*A 28-year-old man was robbed on Friday, June 5 in the 6500 block of Springfield Mall. The man was walking from the Franconia-Springfield metro station to the parking garage located outside the Macy's store around 5:35 p.m. He was grabbed by four males inside the lower level of the parking garage. The suspects assaulted the victim, took his wallet and fled. A passerby found the victim and called police. The victim was transported to Inova Healthplex Franconia-Springfield where he was treated for non life-threatening injuries. The suspects could only be described as black, in their 20s. FATAL CRASH

South Kings Highway/Telegraph Road

*A 47-year-old man died in a crash on Saturday, June 6. Police were called to the area of South Kings Highway and Woodstone Drive at 2:33 p.m. for the crash. An investigation determined the driver of a 2008 Harley Davidson "Fat Boy" motorcycle was traveling north on South Kings Highway when he crossed over the double-yellow line. The motorcycle collided head-on with a 1994 Honda Accord, operated by a 40-year-old Alexandria-area man. Both drivers were transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital. The driver of the Honda was treated for minor injuries and released. The motorcycle operator, Robert M. Tyler, of 7537 Grey Goose Way in the Alexandria area, was pronounced dead at the hospital. Neither speed nor alcohol was a factor in the crash. Tyler was wearing a helmet. This is the 14th fatal crash this year.

*A match generated through "The Combined DNA Index System" (CODIS), resulted in the identification of a suspect currently incarcerated on unrelated charges. Maurice Turner, 63, was in the Hampton Roads Regional Jail until Thursday, June 4, when Fairfax County Cold Case detectives arrested Turner for a 1981 sex offense. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with rape, abduction with intent to defile, and burglary with intent to commit a felony. The original case was reported on April 22, 1981, at a townhouse in the 5400 block of Crossrail Drive in Burke. The victim was in her 20s at the time and reportedly lived with one roommate. The suspect forced entry into the home and held the victim at gunpoint. Detectives have made contact with her.

ATTEMPTED CARJACKING

Killebrew Drive/Heritage Drive

A 20-year-old man was the victim of an attempted carjacking on Monday, June 8 around 9:45 p.m. The victim was driving his 2002 Cadillac STS and stopped at a stop sign near Killebrew Drive and Heritage Circle. A man ran up to the car, ordered the victim to get out and tried to pull him through the driver's window. The victim resisted, exited the car and stabbed the suspect during their struggle. A second suspect approached and struck the victim in the upper body with an object. The victim got back into his car as a third suspect tried to grab him; the victim fled in his car. The suspects fled on foot. They were described as Hispanic, in their 20s. They were between 5 feet 9 inches and 6 feet 2 inches tall and 170 to 180 pounds. They all wore Dickie's brand khaki pants and black hoodies. The victim declined medical attention.

ANIMAL CONTROL DIVISION
