Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS

COUNTY WIDE

CRIME SOLVERS TIPS CLOSE CASES

* A tip received through Crime Solvers led to the arrests of two men for several unsolved crimes. In late May a tipster identified the suspects in several outstanding cases to include robberies and a burglary. Detectives followed up on the tip and determined the information was accurate. In late May and June the suspects were charged in the following cases:

- A commercial robbery on Monday, May 4 at the 7-Eleven store, located at 11714 Sunset Hills Road in the Reston area.
- The robbery of a person on Saturday, May 16 in the 2200 block of Colts Neck Road in the Reston area.
- A burglary on Wednesday, May 24 at a home in the 14400 block of Woodmere Court in the Centreville area.

Donnell Foster, 18, of no fixed address, was charged with robbery and the use of a firearm in the commission of a felony in the May 4 robbery. He was charged with burglary for the May 24 incident. John Mack Stewart, 18, of 1603 Becontree Lane #1C in Reston, was charged with robbery and the use of a firearm in the commission of a felony in the May 4 robbery. He was also charged with robbery in the May 16 incident. Joshua Campbell, 25, of no fixed address, had an outstanding warrant for robbery in the May 16 incident. He was arrested in a nearby jurisdiction for unrelated charges on June 18 and is awaiting extradition back to Fairfax County. Detectives continue to investigate several other robberies and further charges are possible. NEW DRIVING LAW

*The Fairfax County Police Department urges motorists to pay full time and attention when driving and reminds them that a new law prohibiting texting while driving goes into effect on Wednesday, July 1. The new law prohibits drivers from sending or reading text messages and is punishable by a fine of \$20.00 for the first offense and \$50.00 for additional infractions. Virginia is the ninth state in the nation to ban text messaging while driving. Commander of the Traffic Division, Captain Susan Culin, stresses that "the primary responsibility of a driver is to operate a motor vehicle safely. Driving requires one's full attention and focus." There were 14,078 traffic crashes in Fairfax County in 2008. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, driver distraction (from all sources) contributes to 25 percent of all police-reported crashes. In the past, without a specific law pertaining to text messaging behind the wheel, officers charged violators with failure to pay full time and attention, a problem that is

clearly on the rise. In 2008, Fairfax County Police officers charged 4,303 drivers, an increase from 3,317 arrests in 2007. National Distracted Driving Week, led by the National Safety Council, runs June 22 - 28, 2009 and police join them in reminding motorists of the importance of educating and influencing people on how to help prevent accidental injury and death. SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)

SOBRIETY CHECKPOINT

Sully Road/Walney Road

* Fairfax County police officers from around the county conducted a sobriety checkpoint to deter and apprehend intoxicated drivers on Saturday, June 20 from midnight until 3 a.m. Sunday. All motorists were stopped and drivers were checked to assure that their abilities to drive had not been impaired by alcohol or drugs. Approximately 1,067 motorists passed through the checkpoint in the northbound lanes of Rt28 at the intersection of Walney Road. Eight arrests were made for DWI. Five minors were charged with illegal possession of alcohol. One additional criminal arrest was made and 15 summonses were issued for miscellaneous traffic offenses. Nine Fairfax County officers, 11 Virginia State troopers and 11 auxiliary police officers participated in the checkpoint.

Through April 2008, officers arrested 850 people for driving while intoxicated. During the same time period in 2009, 1002 DWI arrests were made—an increase of 18 percent. Five people have lost their lives in alcohol-related crashes so far this year, compared to three for the same period last year in Fairfax County. Based on the increase in the number of alcohol-related fatal crashes, and the police department's desire to increase awareness, police are stepping up impaired driving enforcement, in an effort to reverse the trend. The High Impact DWI Enforcement initiative combines enforcement and education and is geared toward raising public awareness of drunk driving and the serious consequences it can have for all involved.

VEHICLE TAMPERING/BIAS CRIME

Belcher Farm Drive

5800

Several cars were parked in the 5800 block of Belcher Farm Drive on Monday, June 22. Some time between 6 p.m. and 6:45 p.m., someone scratched the paint of at least five cars. Two of them had racial slurs scratched into the paint. No suspect information is available at this time. The Fairfax County Police Department recognizes the potential harm that bias crimes and incidents can have in a community, and strongly encourages people to report them. All bias crimes and incidents are investigated thoroughly.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)**ROBBERY**

Audubon Avenue

7900

A 24-year-old man was the victim of an attempted robbery on Tuesday, June 23. The victim was walking in the 7900 block of Audubon Avenue around 10:23 p.m. when a group of men approached and demanded money from him. When the victim refused, the men assaulted him and fled. Nothing was taken from the victim. The suspects were described as black and one Hispanic, between 20 and 21 years old. The Hispanic suspect was about 5 feet 8 inches tall and 170 pounds, with long, black hair pulled back in a pony tail. He wore a gray T-shirt and dark denim shorts. The other suspects were about 6 feet tall and 160 pounds, with short, black hair and brown eyes. They all wore dark-colored shorts. Three of them had on a white T-shirt and two of them had on a blue or black T-shirt. One of the suspects had a white scarf wrapped around his hand.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

Venoy Court

8600

Police responded to a robbery in the 8600 block of Venoy Court on Thursday, June 25. Around 1:50 a.m., the 21-year-old victim was approached by another man who invited him to walk and meet another person. The victim agreed and they went to an open area nearby. A man whose face was covered pointed a gun at the victim and demanded money. The victim did not comply and the armed suspect struck him several times in the upper body. Both suspects fled on foot. They were described as black, about 22 years old. They were about 5 feet 11 inches tall and 170 pounds, with short, black hair and brown eyes. One suspect wore blue jeans, a white tank top and a red hat. The other wore a blue and white striped shirt, blue jeans and a hat. The victim was transported to Inova Mount Vernon Hospital with non life-threatening injuries.

Leesburg Pike

* On Wednesday, June 17 around 6:40 p.m. a 27-year-old woman approached a patrol officer to report she was assaulted by a man on Monday, June 15. Officers determined the woman was walking on the 6000 block of Leesburg Pike between 11 p.m. and midnight. The victim was reportedly grabbed from behind by a man. He pulled her into a grassy area and the two struggled, causing both of them to fall to the ground. The victim agreed to walk with the suspect to a different location; he took her to the 3300 block of Glenmore Drive. The suspect left the victim alone momentarily and she fled on foot. She did not require medical attention. The suspect was described as white, in his 20s. He was about 5 feet 3 inches tall and 145 pounds with black hair and brown eyes. MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ABDUCTION WITH INTENT TO DEFILE/ARREST

Seminary Road

5700

A man was arrested after he stabbed two 17-year-old girls with a pocket knife on Tuesday, June 23. The man and both victims had been hanging out inside an apartment in the 5700 block of Seminary Road with a few friends the night of June 22. Around 4:40 the next morning, the man allegedly propositioned the girls and touched one of them inappropriately. They refused the suspect who reportedly pulled a small knife and stabbed one of the victims in the leg and the other in the upper body. The victims fled the apartment and called police. Officers located and arrested Abdoulaye Camara, 34, of 5716 Seminary Road #5 in Falls Church. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with two counts each of malicious wounding and abduction with intent to defile. Both victims were transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries.

ROBBERY

Patrick Henry Drive

2900

A 43-year-old man was robbed in the 2900 block of Patrick Henry Drive on Wednesday, June 24. The victim was walking through a shopping center when another man approached and asked him for money. The victim was getting money out of his wallet when a second man struck him from behind. The first suspect grabbed the victim's money and both suspects fled. They were described as Hispanic, in their 30s. They were between 5 feet 7 inches and 5 feet 8 inches tall and 160 to 175 pounds. They both had short, black hair, brown eyes and a moustache. Both suspects wore a white T-shirt and black pants.

Northgate Square

Police arrested a man for assault on a police officer on Monday, June 22. Officers were called to the 1500 block of Northgate Square around 1:27 a.m. for a noise complaint. As they attempted to talk to the man, he was not cooperative and allegedly assaulted one of the officers. The officers struggled with the suspect and were able to take him into custody. * A man was arrested on Thursday, June 18 for acting disorderly at the Lee District RECenter, located at 6601 Telegraph Road. The man was in the pool area around 2:30 p.m. talking with two children, a 7-year-old girl and an 8-year-old boy. He reportedly knelt down between them to chat and had his arms around their sides while he was talking. A staff member, who had warned the man before, confronted the man a second time and escorted him out. Once in the parking lot, the man reached into his backpack and removed a pistol, but dropped it. A retired police officer, who was nearby, saw this and confronted the suspect. With the help of park staff, they subdued and detained him until police arrived. Officers arrested Vondale Wright, 25, of 9546 Hagel Circle in Lorton, and transported him to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, removing the serial numbers from a firearm, carrying a concealed weapon and disorderly conduct.

UNDERAGE POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL/CONTRIBUTING TO THE DELINQUENCY OF A MINOR/ARREST

Fenwood Drive

*Police responded to complaints of a noisy party around 12:30 a.m. Saturday, June 20 in the 8400 block of Fenwood Drive. Upon arrival, officers saw over a hundred teens and young people in the home, yard and surrounding area and began their investigation. Officers placed charges of underage possession of alcohol against 41 young people. Wilder Arias, 27, of Springfield, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with malicious wounding. The victim declined medical attention.
