Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**COUNTY WIDE****CITIZENS POLICE ACADEMY AWARDED**

* The Fairfax County Police Citizens Police Academy was awarded "Agency of The Year" by the National Neighborhood Citizens Police Academy Association at their annual meeting held in Anchorage, Alaska recently. The goal of the program is to open the lines of communication between the community and the police department by offering residents a firsthand look at the many specialty units within the law enforcement agency and to share the rules, regulations and policies officers are required to follow. A combination of classroom lectures, tours, and hands-on activities, the program encompasses a wide variety of activities. Additionally, the "Glimpse Behind the Badge" program engages residents as they investigate mock crime scenes, step inside the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and have an opportunity to ride along with an on-duty officer. The FCPD hosted its first academy in spring of 2002 and has been reaching out to welcome hundreds of diverse Fairfax County residents into their courses ever since. Largely comprised of a staff of dedicated volunteers, the classes are popular with the community and typically have an enrollment waiting list. Fordson Road/Fordson Court

Two men were arrested for stealing a car on Thursday, June 25. The victim, 37, was inside his home near Fordson Road and Fordson Court around 12:25 a.m. He looked out a window and saw someone drive his 1996 Honda sedan away. The victim and his friend followed the Honda to the 7900 block of Andrus Court where the suspect fled from the car. Officers located two men nearby and stopped them. An investigation determined Chante A. Jones, 19, of 7256 Jon Paul Drive in Alexandria, allegedly stole the victim's car. Further investigation revealed that the other man, Demetrius Q. Winbush, 19, of 8553 South Lawn Court in Alexandria, reportedly had several stolen items in his possession from another vehicle. Both men were arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. They were charged with grand larceny, attempted grand larceny and petit larceny. Winbush was additionally charged with possession of marijuana.

A man and a teenage boy were arrested on Friday, June 26 for allegedly stealing a 1995 Jeep Cherokee from the 3200 block of Piper Lane. Daniels was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with grand larceny. The teenager was released to his parents and a petition for grand larceny will be obtained.

* An argument escalated into a physical altercation between two groups of young adults on a bike path in the 11900 block of Winterthur Lane on Wednesday, June 24 around 9:20 p.m. Two Reston men, 29 and 32, were medevaced to Inova Fairfax Hospital. Their injuries were determined to be non life-threatening. Detectives are investigating the possibility that this case involved members or associates of a criminal street gang. The suspects were described as black, in their 20s. They were all approximately 6 feet tall and 180 pounds wearing white T-shirts and dark jeans. UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A VEHICLE/ASSAULT ON A POLICE OFFICER/RESISTING ARREST/POSSESSION OF STOLEN PROPERTY/ARREST

Reston Parkway/South Lakes Drive

Three men were arrested on Wednesday, July 1 after one of them fought with an officer. The officer was driving in the area of Reston Parkway and South Lakes Drive around 3:55 a.m. when she saw the men pushing a car off the roadway. She pulled up behind them and got out of the car to assist. One man allegedly pushed the officer and a struggle began; the other two men were not involved. She was able to subdue and detain the suspect. An investigation determined the car was taken without permission from a neighboring jurisdiction. All three suspects were arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Joseph Schrotz, 18, of Aldie, Virginia, was charged with unauthorized use of a vehicle, assault on a police officer and resisting arrest. Marshall Harrison, 22, of 42579 Good Hope Lane in Ashburn, and Lavonte France, 19, of 7820 Belvedere Drive in Alexandria, were charged with felony possession of stolen property. No one required medical attention.

UPDATE: BANK ROBBERY

Brandon Avenue

* Detectives from Fairfax and Arlington Counties have established a probable link between a bank robbery that occurred in Fairfax County on Thursday, January 15 and one that occurred in Arlington County on Thursday, January 29, 2009. The robbery in Arlington occurred at the Navy Federal Credit Union, 2400 Crystal Drive in the Crystal City area. In Fairfax County, a 25-year-old man from Woodbridge was working as a teller at the Navy Federal Credit Union, located at 6225 Brandon Avenue when a man approached him shortly before 1 p.m. The suspect handed the teller a note announcing a robbery and implied that he had a gun. The teller handed over an undisclosed amount of cash and was not injured. The suspect fled on foot. Detectives believe that the same subject committed both crimes. He is described as black, 30 to 40 years old, with a medium complexion. He is between 5 feet 10 inches and 6 feet 2 inches tall, with a medium build. He was wearing dark clothing and passed a similar note in both cases. * An employee of the Wachovia Bank, located at 8994 Lorton Station Boulevard, was robbed Thursday, June 25. Around 2:10 p.m. a woman entered the bank and approached the bank teller,

a 22-year-old man, at the counter. She passed a note, implied a weapon and demanded money. The victim complied and gave the suspect an undisclosed amount of cash. *Police responded to the home at 5422 Crossrail Drive in Burke on Tuesday, June 30 shortly after 5:30 p.m. for the report of an accidental shooting. Officers arrived, talked two people out of the home, and then entered and searched the home. Inside, they found the body of 23-year-old Powell Beck, with an apparent gunshot wound to the upper body. Crime Scene and Criminal Investigation Bureau detectives responded to the scene. Preliminary information indicates that this incident was domestic in nature and there was no threat to public safety. No charges have been placed at this time. An autopsy is being performed today to determine the exact cause and manner of death.

* Police are investigating a burglary of an occupied dwelling that occurred on Thursday, June 25 in the 5100 block of Whisper Willow Drive around 11 a.m. A 21-year-old woman was brushing her teeth when she heard knocking on the front door. She looked out a window and observed a woman walking away from her home and get into a white Jeep Cherokee. After resuming her activities, she heard footsteps on the stairs and saw a man walking up them, carrying a tool. She yelled and startled the intruder, who turned around and fled. A third suspect, who had been

standing on the main level of the home, also ran away. The victim attempted to call police but discovered that her phone lines had been cut. She called police on her cell phone. Police investigation revealed that the intruders may have entered the home through a locked, basement door. Nothing was taken from the home. The suspect on the stairs was white and in his late 20s to early 30s. He had a shaved head and a short goatee and wore a dark blue, short-sleeved jumpsuit with a matching baseball cap. He was around 5 feet 8 inches tall and weighed between 200 and 210 pounds. The second suspect, waiting on the main level, was dressed similarly. The woman who originally knocked on the door, was Hispanic with dark skin and long, curly, black hair with a red tint. She wore a purple tank top and white Capri pants. She was around 5 feet 5 inches tall and weighed around 170 pounds. FATAL CRASH

Lees Corner Road/Centreville Road

* A 56-year-old man was operating a 2007 Ford Taurus east on Lees Corner Road near Centreville Road at around 4:30 p.m. on Monday, June 29. He allegedly became distracted while looking at directions, drifted off the road and struck a tree head-on. The 51-year-old passenger was not wearing a seat belt. Both occupants were transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital. The passenger, Robin Adnamateros, of 415 Picket Lane in Herndon was pronounced dead a short time later. The driver's condition remains non life-threatening. Detectives from the Crash Reconstruction Unit were on scene and the investigation continues. Charges are pending. Neither speed nor alcohol is believed to be a factor in this crash. This is the 16th fatal crash in Fairfax County this year. At this time last year, there had been nine fatal crashes reported in the county.
