Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****BURGLARY OF AN OCCUPIED DWELLING WHILE ARMED/ BRANDISHING A WEAPON/ ARREST**

Airline Parkway

4200

A man was arrested after he unlawfully entered the home of a woman he knew in the 4200 block of Airline Parkway on Saturday, July 4 around 12:30 a.m. The man confronted the victim, 28, who repeatedly told the suspect to leave. Before he fled, he reportedly brandished a gun at her. Police responded and located the suspect at his home. Frank Howe, 30, of 4619 Fillingame Drive, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with burglary of an occupied dwelling while armed and brandishing a weapon. The victim did not require medical treatment.

MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)**ROBBERY/ARREST**

Corcoran Street/Ashboro Drive

A man was arrested for robbing a 29-year-old Alexandria woman on Friday, July 3 around 4:20 a.m. She was walking with a man she knew in the area of Corcoran Street near Ashboro Drive. He allegedly displayed a knife and demanded money from her. He took a small amount of cash from her purse and fled. Police responded and located the suspect nearby. Robert A. Funderburk, 43, of 5903 Mount Eagle Drive #1010 in Alexandria, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with robbery. The victim did not require medical attention.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING/MOB ASSAULT/ROBBERY/ARREST

Frye Road

8200

A man and a woman were arrested after an altercation on Sunday, July 5. Police were called to a home in the 8700 block of Lea Lane around 11:08 p.m. for an assault. An investigation determined two 20-year-old men and a 21-year-old woman were sitting in the backyard of a home in the 8200 block of Frye Road when they were approached by a large group of people. Several suspects assaulted and robbed the three victims, then fled. Police located two suspects at a nearby home. Samantha Guthrie, 20, and Enrique Vanterpool, 19, both of 4318 Granada Street in Alexandria, were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Both suspects were charged with malicious wounding, assault by mob and robbery. The victims were treated at the scene for their non life-threatening injuries.

INDECENT LIBERTIES/INDECENT EXPOSURE/OBSCENE SEXUAL DISPLAY/ARREST

Boulevard View

6600

A man was arrested on Wednesday, July 8 after exposing himself to two women, 24 and 34, and a 12-year-old girl. At approximately 2:30 p.m., the suspect was sitting in a playground in the 6600 block of Boulevard View when the victims saw the suspect expose and touch himself inappropriately. Officers responded and arrested Merritt A. Purol, 18, of no fixed address. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with indecent liberties, indecent exposure, and obscene sexual display.

MCLEAN DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 3)BANK ROBBERY/ARREST

Greensboro Drive

8200

*A 24-year-old woman was arrested after a bank robbery on Wednesday, July 1. Around 4:05 p.m. a woman entered the Cardinal Bank, located at 8270 Greensboro Drive, and approached two female tellers, 20 and 42 years old, at the counter. She reportedly brandished a handgun and demanded money from the victims. They complied and the suspect fled from the bank. No one required medical assistance. Detectives investigating the bank robbery developed a suspect and in the early morning hours of Thursday, July 2, they arrested Stephanie Marie Nightingale, 24, of 4497 Holly Avenue in Fairfax. Further investigation determined she was reportedly responsible for an additional bank robbery on Friday, June 5 at the M&T Bank, located at 11721 Lee Highway in the Fairfax area. Nightingale was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with two counts of robbery and two counts of the use of a firearm in the commission of a felony.

SPEED TO ELUDE/RECKLESS DRIVING/DRIVING OUTSIDE OF LISTED DRIVER'S LICENSE RESTRICTIONS/ARREST

I-66/Cedar Lane

A man was arrested for reckless driving on Monday, July 6. Around 2:22 a.m., an officer attempted to stop a vehicle for traffic charges near Interstate 66 and Cedar Lane. The vehicle appeared to accelerate away from the officer and a traffic pursuit was initiated. The officer lost sight of the vehicle and the pursuit ended. A short time later, another officer located the suspect driving near I-66 and Arlington Boulevard. An investigation determined the suspect allegedly consumed alcohol prior to driving. Frederick Lamont Hazel, 33, of Richmond, VA, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with speed to elude, reckless driving, and driving outside of his listed driver's license restrictions.

MASON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 4)**DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED/FELONY SPEED TO ELUDE/ARREST**

Little River Turnpike/Annandale Road

A man was arrested after a brief traffic pursuit on Friday, July 3. An officer stopped the vehicle for traffic charges around midnight near the intersection of Little River Turnpike and Annandale Road. As the officer walked up to the vehicle, the suspect allegedly drove off. The officer gave chase until the suspect crashed on Interstate 495 near Arlington Boulevard. Romer Ortuno-Rioja, of 6207 Zekan Lane in Springfield, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with driving while intoxicated and felony speed to elude. A passenger in the fleeing vehicle, a 19-year-old woman, was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital and treated for non life-threatening injuries.

ROBBERY

Westmoreland Road/ Manor Drive

A 57-year-old man was robbed near the intersection of Westmoreland Road and Manor Drive on Friday, July 3. The victim was walking home from work around 12:30 a.m. when two men approached and demanded the victim's property. The victim complied and one suspect cut his wrist with a knife. The suspects took the victim's wallet and other items before they fled. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The suspects were described as Hispanic, with black hair and brown eyes. One suspect was 5 feet 11 inches tall and 220 pounds. He was dressed in black clothing. The other suspect was about 5 feet 7 inches tall and 160 pounds. He was wearing a white T-shirt.

BRANDISHING A FIREARM/ ARREST

King Louis Drive/ Rouge Court

A man was arrested on Friday, July 3 for brandishing a gun. Police responded to the area of King Louis Drive and Rouge Court around 8 p.m. An investigation revealed that a 32-year-old woman saw the suspect allegedly pull the gun out of a holster while walking. Officers located the suspect nearby and arrested him. Jose R. Ocampo Castaneda, 30, of 6301 King Louis Drive #303, in Alexandria, was charged with brandishing and released on a summons. No one required medical attention.

Coppermine Road

*Police are investigating a bank robbery at the PNC Bank, located at 13490 Coppermine Road. Around 2:47 p.m. on Wednesday, July 1, a man reportedly entered the bank with a handgun, approached two tellers and announced the robbery. The two women complied and gave the suspect an undisclosed amount of money. He fled from the bank in a newer-model, silver or gray Nissan sedan. The victims did not require medical treatment. The suspect was described as 20 to 30 years old. He was approximately 5 feet 8 inches to 6 feet tall. He was wearing a blue hoodie

with light-colored sleeves, dark-colored pants and a camouflage hat. He had a clear, plastic mask over his face. BURGLARY/ARREST

Becontree Lane

Police responded to a burglar alarm activation at Forest Edge Elementary, located at 1501 Becontree Lane, on Saturday, July 4 around 11 p.m. As officers arrived, a group of 20 to 25 teenagers standing outside the school fled on foot. Officers apprehended six of them: three 14-year-old boys, a 13-year-old boy, a 16-year-old boy and a 17-year-old girl. An investigation determined that two or three of the other teenagers reportedly broke into a school trailer and stole some items. The teenagers were released to their parents and charges are pending. Some of the stolen items were recovered at the scene.

ROBBERY

Huston Place

On Sunday, July 5 around 3 a.m., police responded to a robbery that occurred in the 2200 block of Huston Place. A 28-year-old man was walking home when a man and woman walked past him. They allegedly struck the victim in the back of the head, knocking him to the ground. He awoke several minutes later and the suspects were gone. The victim was missing his cellular phone and a small amount of cash. The male suspect was described as black, about 6 feet tall and 185 pounds. He was bald and wore a dark shirt and jeans. The female suspect was described as black, about 5 feet 5 inches tall, and 180 pounds. The victim was transported to Reston Hospital Center where he was treated for non-life-threatening injuries.

SPEED TO ELUDE/DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED/DRIVING ON A REVOKED LICENSE/REFUSAL TO TAKE THE BLOOD-ALCOHOL TEST/RESISTING ARREST/RECKLESS DRIVING/ARREST

Dulles Toll Road/Fairfax County Parkway

A 38-year-old man was arrested on Tuesday, July 7 after a brief traffic pursuit with the police. An officer attempted to stop a vehicle for traffic charges around 12:15 a.m. near the area of the Dulles Toll Road and the Fairfax County Parkway. The driver allegedly did not stop for the officer and a traffic pursuit was initiated. The pursuit ended when the suspect lost control of his vehicle and struck a tree on North Shore Drive near Sunder Court. The suspect attempted to flee on foot, but officers were able to subdue him after a brief struggle. James Wallace, of 1905 North Culpepper Street #4 in Arlington was transported to the Reston Hospital Center for non life-threatening injuries prior to being taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with speed to elude, driving while intoxicated, driving on a revoked license, refusal to take the blood-alcohol test, resisting arrest and reckless driving.

The suspect appeared to signal to a second suspect further down the street. The victim screamed and was able to break free. She ran to an adult for help. Both suspects fled. The first suspect was described as black, 40 to 50 years old, about 5 feet 10 inches tall. He had a chubby build, a gray mustache, and was missing a tooth. He was wearing a dark blue, short-sleeved, collared shirt with a name tag, blue jeans and white sneakers. The second suspect was described as black, 20 to 35 years old. He was wearing a shirt similar to the first suspect and dark pants. The victim did not require medical attention.
