\*A 30-year-old man has been arrested in connection with a robbery of an 84-year-old man. The robbery occurred on Wednesday, September 16 around 10:30 a.m., in the parking lot of the Shopper's Food Warehouse, located at 7660 Richmond Highway. The victim had just finished putting his groceries in the car and was sitting in the driver's seat when a man entered the rear door of his car. The suspect grabbed the victim around the neck and demanded money. The victim bit the suspect. The suspect punched the victim several times in the face then fled. The victim was not treated for his injuries. Later that night the suspect turned himself into police. Isaac Gray, of 7205 Harrison Lane #103 in Alexandria, was arrested and charged with malicious wounding and robbery. He was taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

They fled on foot but left the wallet behind without taking anything. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The suspects were described as Hispanic.

Two men were arrested for attempting to extort money from a 33-year-old woman on Tuesday, September 8 in the 3000 block of Patrick Henry Drive. The victim was walking outside around 1:30 a.m. when the two men approached and allegedly demanded money for her protection. As the suspects watched, the victim walked to a nearby store to an ATM. She was able to use a phone and call police. The victim did not approach officers because the suspects were watching but the suspects walked away when officers arrived and the victim went home. On Monday, September 14, the victim saw the suspects in the same area and reported it to police patrolling the area. An investigation led to their arrest. Carlos Portillo-Hernandez, 20, of 6156 Wilson Drive #102 in Falls Church, and Juan Blanco, 25, of 2924 Patrick Henry Drive #101 in Falls Church, were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with attempt to extort money and gang participation.

ATTEMPTED MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ARREST

\*A 40-year-old mailman was walking in the 6000 block of Bellview Drive on Wednesday, September 16. Around 1 p.m. the mailman had several shots fired at him from a nearby building. He was able to take cover and summon police. The victim was not injured. Several police units responded to include a K-9 officer and the helicopter. After establishing a perimeter around the area, police located two suspects inside the apartment where the shots were allegedly fired from. A BB gun was also recovered. Arrested was Horace Jones, 18, of 6027 Bellview Drive, and Shawn Jones, 18, of 9800 Hummingbird Lane, in Upper Marlboro, Maryland. Both suspects were charged with attempted malicious wounding. Since a Postal Service letter carrier was the victim, the United States Postal Inspection Service assisted in the investigation.

FRANCONIA DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 6)CONTRIBUTING TO THE DELINQUENCY OF A MINOR/DRUNK IN PUBLIC/ARREST

\*A 27-year-old woman was charged with contributing to the delinquency of a 15-year-old boy on Sunday, September 20. Around 1:50 a.m., a patrol officer saw the two in a 2008 Mitsubishi Lancer parked in the 7900 block of Gunston Hill Lane. An investigation determined the juvenile left home without his parent's knowledge. She is employed as a Fairfax County school teacher and met the victim earlier this year. The victim is not a student at the school where the suspect is employed. BURGLARY WITH THE INTENT TO COMMIT ASSAULT/ARREST

A man was arrested for burglarizing a home in the 6000 block of Frederick Street on Wednesday, September 23. A man and woman, 38 and 46, inside the home heard a noise coming from the kitchen around 1:30 a.m. She went to investigate and saw a man reportedly standing inside the house. The suspect walked past the woman, allegedly confronted the man, whom he knew, and a fight began between them. The victim subdued the suspect until police arrived. Officers arrested Cesar Gutierrez Perez, 26, of 6972 Buckman Road in Alexandria, and transported him to Inova Franconia Springfield-Healthplex for non life-threatening injuries, then took him to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with burglary with the intent to commit assault. The victim did not require medical attention.

**WEST SPRINGFIELD DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 7)****FATAL CRASH**

Rolling Road/Forrester Boulevard

\*Police were called to the area of Rolling Road and Hillside Road for a fatal traffic crash that occurred on Friday, September 18. An investigation determined around 7:57 p.m., a Toyota Avalon was headed southbound on Rolling Road. The driver, a 20-year-old woman, was making a left turn onto Forrester Boulevard when a motorcyclist, headed northbound on Rolling Road, struck her car. The motorcyclist was ejected from his 2007 Kawasaki ZX-6R and landed on the pavement nearby. Ever Misael Velasquez-Canales, 22, of 9318 Kite Street in Burke, was pronounced dead at the scene. The driver of the Toyota, a 20-year-old woman, was not injured. Crash Reconstruction detectives continue to investigate. This is the 22nd fatal crash this year in Fairfax County. Last year at this time, there were 15 fatal crashes.

\*On Monday, September 21, Michael Thomas, 27, of 5213 Newton Street, Bladensburg, Maryland, was arrested and charged with murder. Thomas agreed to meet with detectives at the Mason District Police Station, where he was taken into custody. On Tuesday, September 22, Marcus Williams, 28, was taken into custody in Sterling Heights, Michigan, and charged with

murder. Williams was apprehended with the assistance of the U.S. Marshals Task Force (Detroit Fugitive Apprehension Team).

Police were called to 2320 Dulles Station Boulevard on Monday, November 17 shortly after 9 a.m. to investigate suspicious circumstances. The property manager of Camden Dulles Station reported finding what appeared to be a trail of blood leading from the parking lot to a dumpster. An alert patrol officer located Ericka Yancey's vehicle around 2 a.m. on Wednesday, November 19, in the 13000 block of Sunrise Valley Drive. The body of a deceased adult female was inside and an autopsy confirmed the woman died from stab wounds to her upper body. She was identified as Erika Yancey, 22, of 2320 Dulles Station Boulevard #1132 in Herndon.
