## **Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**

### **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH**

\*In honor of National Domestic Violence Awareness Month, Fairfax County Police Department's Victim Services Section is again sponsoring a K-9 Krawl; a 5K walk created for you and your dog. ### **HALLOWEEN SAFETY**

\*Halloween is quickly approaching and many youngsters will be out and about during dark hours crossing the streets. Many cars frequently use residential streets as a cut-through during high volume traffic hours. Fairfax County Police will be enforcing violations involving stop signs, speeding, and pedestrian cross walks. For the past two weeks, message boards in the Sully police district were announcing the upcoming campaign and reminding motorists to drive safely. Officers from the motor squad and Sully district station will be aggressively enforcing traffic laws the last two weeks of October. In the West Springfield district, crossing guards, crime prevention officers, neighborhood patrol units, and auxiliary officers will be educating the public by distributing safety flyers and handing out treat bags for children. DWI directed patrols will be occurring in the Franconia district. All other district stations will also have officers out in numbers to make sure trick-or-treaters have a safe Halloween night. Here are a few safety tips to remember when walking along streets during nighttime hours:

- \* Always use crosswalks and sidewalks
- \* Carry a flashlight
- \* Wear reflective stickers on costumes
- \* Use face paint rather than full-face masks that block your view
- \* Only trick-or-treat at houses you know
- \* Travel in groups with an adult
- \* Notify police about any suspicious person or activity
- \* Inspect candy before children eat it

**SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****BURGLARY OF OCCUPIED DWELLING**

\*Residents at a home in the 4400 block of Fallen Oak Drive, Chantilly were awakened Thursday, October 15 shortly before 1 a.m. and saw a man rummaging through their bedroom. One of the victims spoke to the intruder who immediately fled down the stairs and out the door. No one was injured. Police believe the suspect looked through several rooms in the house and stole personal items. The suspect apparently entered the home through a ground-level window, after breaking a hole through it and unlocking it. The suspect is described as around 25 years old, 5 feet 8 inches tall and weighed around 210 pounds. He had straight dark hair, dark clothes, a protruding stomach, and black material covering most of his face. **FATAL CRASH**

\*A 21-year-old Alexandria man died Tuesday, October 20 around 2:39 a.m. after running off the road in the 11900 block of Henderson Road in the Clifton area. Kyle J. Sullivan, of 5317 Lake Cove Court, was driving a 2000 Volkswagen hatchback when he drove off the left side of the road, struck a tree and was ejected. He died on scene. Crash Reconstruction Unit detectives are continuing to investigate to determine the cause of the crash. There were no passengers in the vehicle and no other vehicles involved.

\*A 21-year-old Dumfries man was robbed and shot around 4:30 p.m. Wednesday, October 21. Three men were visiting together at an apartment building in the 2700 block of Arlington Drive when an altercation erupted. Two of the men allegedly assaulted, shot and robbed the other man, then fled. The victim sustained a gunshot wound to the lower body and was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The victim was unable to identify the suspects, despite being mildly acquainted with one of them. The suspects were described as black, between 18 and 22 years old, around 5 feet 9 inches tall and wore black jeans and jackets. ## SEXUAL ASSAULT

Richmond Highway/Arlington Drive

\*A 33-year-old woman was attacked as she walked on a path adjacent to the Mount Vernon Square shopping center, near the intersection of Richmond Highway and Arlington Drive on Tuesday, October 20 shortly after 7:30 a.m. A man approached her from behind, threw her to the ground, pulled down her clothing, and touched her inappropriately. The victim struggled and the suspect fled. The victim sustained non life-threatening injuries. The suspect was described as black, in his 30s, about 5 feet 10 inches tall, weighing approximately 170 pounds. He was wearing a blue and gray, hooded sweat shirt. ## ROBBERY/ARREST

Janna Lee Avenue/Woodhue Place

A 21-year-old man was robbed by three suspects on Saturday, October 17. He was walking home from the store around 11:45 p.m. and noticed two men and a woman standing by the bus stop near Janna Lee Avenue and Woodhue Place. After he passed the three, he was struck from behind and repeatedly hit until he fell to the ground. While one suspect was striking the victim, another grabbed a case of beer from his hands. The suspects attempted to reach into the victim's pockets but fled with only the beer. Officers stopped a person matching the description on Capistrano Place. Following an investigation, Nehemiah Coleman, 20, of 8324 Richmond Highway #53 in Alexandria was arrested. He was taken to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with robbery. The investigation is ongoing. The remaining suspects were described as black, in their early 20s. The female was about 5 feet 2 inches tall and 160 pounds. She wore a gray sweat suit. The male was 5 feet 9 inches tall and wore a black coat, a black knit cap, and jeans.

## ROBBERY

Arlington Drive

On Sunday, October 18 at 9:30 p.m., a pizza delivery man was robbed. The 21-year-old male victim was returning to his car after making a delivery in the 2600 block of Arlington Drive when four men approached. The victim was treated for minor injuries.

Ingrid Herrera is accused of dousing her boyfriend with rubbing alcohol and setting him afire at around 2:45 a.m. Sunday, October 18. A 24-year-old woman, who lived in the home, heard screaming and attempted to contact police but the suspect allegedly grabbed the cell phone and pushed her in an attempt to thwart the call for help. The victim, a 29-year-old Falls Church man, suffered burns to the upper half of his body and was transported to Washington Hospital Center with non-life threatening injuries.
