**Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS****COUNTYWIDE****SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)****DISORDERLY CONDUCT/ARREST**

Chantilly Shopping Center

Police responded to a fight at a Taco Bell located at 4418 Chantilly Shopping Center around 10:35 p.m. When officers arrived, they observed approximately 30 to 40 teenaged boys fighting inside. They broke up the fight and one of the boys, a 16-year-old, allegedly continued to resist and disobey police commands. Officers detained him and called his parents. The suspect was released to them and petitions for disorderly conduct will be obtained.

**MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)****DISORDERLY CONDUCT/BIAS CRIME**

Old Mount Vernon Road/Mount Vernon Memorial Highway

On Sunday, October 3 around 10 a.m., a man was driving on Old Mount Vernon Road near Mount Vernon Memorial Highway when a 2002 Chevrolet van started tailgating him. The driver of the Chevrolet reportedly made an aggressive hand gesture at him. The victim pulled over to the side of the road. The driver of the Chevrolet also pulled over, exited his vehicle and made derogatory statements toward the victim. Police are conducting an investigation to identify the driver of the Chevrolet. The Fairfax County Police Department recognizes the potential harm that bias crimes and incidents can have in a community, and strongly encourages people to report them. All bias crimes and incidents are investigated thoroughly.

**UPDATE: BANK ROBBERY/ARREST**

Richmond Highway

\* Detectives have obtained a robbery warrant for Quenten Sims, 43, of no fixed address. The investigation revealed he is suspected of robbing the TD Bank in the Beacon Hill area on October 10 shortly after 1030 a.m. Police are asking the public's assistance in locating Sims. An investigation determined he entered the TD Bank located at 6615 Richmond Highway and allegedly passed a note demanding money to a 21-year-old woman working behind the counter. The victim handed over an undisclosed amount of cash and was not injured. The suspect left the bank and was last seen headed north on Richmond Highway in a dark-colored SUV. ROBBERY/SHOT PERSON

Arlington Drive

\* A 21-year-old Dumfries man was robbed and shot around 4:30 p.m. Wednesday, October 21. Three men were visiting together at an apartment building in the 2700 block of Arlington Drive when an altercation erupted. Two of the men allegedly assaulted, shot and robbed the other man, then fled. The victim sustained a gunshot wound to the lower body and was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The victim was unable to identify the suspects, despite being mildly acquainted with one of them. The suspects were described as black, between 18 and 22 years old, around 5 feet 9 inches tall and wore black jeans and jackets.

FORGING A BANK NOTE/ARREST

Richmond Highway

A man was arrested for attempting to pass counterfeit bills on Saturday, October 24 around 1:30 a.m. The man was going into Fast Eddies billiards and gave security personnel a \$20 bill. Inspection of the bill revealed that it was counterfeit and security summoned police. Officers arrived and an investigation revealed the suspect possessed additional counterfeit bills. Thomas McGuigan, 23, of 4812 Backlick Road in Annandale, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with forging a bank note.

UPDATE: SEXUAL ASSAULT/ATTEMPTED ROBBERY/ARREST

Richmond Highway

\*A 17-year-old Woodbridge boy has been charged with a sexual assault that occurred on Tuesday, October 13 and an attempted robbery that happened on Wednesday, October 14. Police officers in the Mount Vernon area saw the suspect walking in the 7700 block of Richmond Highway on Tuesday, October 27 around 9:30 a.m. It was determined that he was wanted on unrelated charges and an investigation led to the suspect's arrest. Further investigation determined he is allegedly responsible for grabbing and touching a 17-year-old girl inappropriately on Tuesday, October 13 around 8:35 a.m. in the 7700 block of Richmond Highway and for grabbing a 27-year-old woman and reportedly rummaging through her belongings in the 7800 block of Parrot Place around 1 p.m. on Wednesday, October 14.

The teenager was transported to the Fairfax County Juvenile Detention Center and charged with sexual battery, attempted robbery and abduction with the intent to defile. Chain Bridge Road

1900

\*Police have released video of the robbery that occurred on Monday, October 19 at the Movado store at Tysons Corner Center, located at 1961 Chain Bridge Road. The suspects entered the Movado store on Monday, October 19 around 8:20 p.m., displayed a crowbar, pushed store employees out of the way and smashed a glass case. They grabbed fistfuls of diamond jewelry, stuffed them in a bag and fled through the Mall. One store employee was treated on scene for non life-threatening injuries. Suspects were both described as black, around 5 feet 11 inches tall, and 230 pounds. They wore blue, hooded jackets and ball caps. One suspect wore tan boots and the other had a mustache. **GRAND LARCENY/LARCENY WITH THE INTENT TO SELL/POSSESSION OF COCAINE/ARREST**

Chain Bridge Road

1900

Officers apprehended and charged two men for stealing electronic items from the Apple Computer Store, located inside Tysons Corner Center at 1961 Chain Bridge Road, on Saturday, October 24. The two men entered the store around 5:15 p.m. and allegedly concealed various merchandise inside their clothing. After one of the suspects exited the store, officers stopped him and arrested him. They located the second suspect still inside the Apple store and also arrested him. Andre Hodges, 42, of Capitol Heights, MD, and Roger Davis, 53, of Washington, D.C., were transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. Hodges was charged with grand larceny, larceny with the intent to sell and possession of cocaine. Davis was charged with felony concealment of merchandise.

**MASON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 4)****FATAL CRASH**

Little River Turnpike/Braddock Road

\* A 78-year-old woman died after a crash that occurred on Thursday, October 22 around 3:30 p.m. A 1992 Oldsmobile Eighty-Eight was headed eastbound on Little River Turnpike. The driver, an 81-year-old woman, was making a left turn onto Braddock Road when a 2007 Ford Expedition, headed westbound on Little River Turnpike, struck her car. Both drivers were transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. Betty Gail Elliott, of 4800 Fillmore Street #956 in Alexandria, a passenger in the rear seat of the Oldsmobile, was also transported to the hospital where she was pronounced dead. Crash Reconstruction detectives continue to investigate. This is the 26th crash fatality this year in Fairfax County. Last year at this time, there were 19 fatalities.

MALICIOUS WOUNDING/CHILD NEGLECT/ARREST

Seminary Road

5500

On Thursday, October 22, a man was arrested for assaulting his wife. The man and woman were inside an apartment in the 5500 block of Seminary Road around 7:30 p.m. and had been arguing. The man approached the victim, 27, allegedly struck her in the face and kicked her several times. The victim fled the apartment and summoned police. Officers responded and discovered that the suspect was no longer in the apartment; he fled, leaving his 16-month-old son in the residence alone. The suspect returned several hours later and was arrested. Alden Alexander, 23, of the 5500 block of Seminary Road in Falls Church, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with malicious wounding and child neglect.

The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors recognizes that domestic violence is a serious issue in our community. Services for victims of domestic violence are offered through Domestic and Sexual Violence Services, which are part of the Office for Women & Domestic and Sexual Violence Services. These programs provide victims of sexual and domestic violence with safe shelter, counseling, support groups, and 24-hour hotlines through Artemis House and the Victim Assistance Network. MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ARREST

Woodburn Road

3300

Police charged an 18-year-old man for stabbing a 19-year-old man on Saturday, October 24. The victim was returning to a home in the 3300 block of Woodburn Road around 9:17 p.m. and saw the other man waiting in front of a house. The man confronted the victim and they began fighting. During the fight, the suspect allegedly pulled a knife and stabbed the victim multiple times in the upper body and fled. The victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. An investigation led to the suspect's arrest. Santos Romero, of 3127 Westley Road in Falls Church, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with one count of malicious wounding.

DISCHARGE OF A FIREARM INTO AN OCCUPIED DWELLING/ARREST

Robey Avenue

Police arrested a man for firing a gun inside a home in the 8200 block of Robey Avenue on Saturday, October 24. The man was with a small group of people in the home and around 10:23 p.m., one of them decided to leave. The man became upset and began to fight with another resident. The suspect proceeded to break a window and walked into a bedroom where he allegedly pulled out a gun and fired off one round. The other man fled to another part of the house. Officers responded and located the suspect coming out of the home. Christopher Weber, 24, of 8232 Robey Avenue in Annandale, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with discharging a firearm in an occupied dwelling. No one was injured during this incident.

ROBBERY

Vista Drive

6000

Two men attempted to steal another man's bicycle on Sunday, October 25 in the 6000 block of Vista Drive. The victim, 39, was riding his bike down the street around 1 a.m. when he saw the two men standing nearby. As he rode past, one of the suspects demanded his bike and pulled him off it. The second suspect grabbed the victim and held him as the first suspect started to walk away with the bicycle. The victim broke free, confronted the first suspect and grabbed his bike. After a brief struggle, the suspect released the bicycle and both suspects fled on foot. The victim was not injured.

RESTON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 5)FATAL CRASH

North Village Road/Baron Cameron Avenue

\*One week after a crash in the Reston area, a 79-year-old woman has died. On Wednesday, October 14, Mary Stack-Dunne was driving a 1996 Pontiac Sunfire south on North Village Road around 7:25 p.m. She did not stop for the stop sign and pulled into the path of a 46-year-old woman in a 2000 Lincoln Navigator, who was driving west on Baron Cameron Avenue. The impact caused severe injuries to Stack-Dunne and she was medevaced to Inova Fairfax Hospital where she died on Wednesday, October 21. She lived at 1536 Twisted Oak Drive in Reston. Speed and alcohol were not factors. This is the 24th fatal crash in Fairfax County. Last year at this time, there were 19 fatal crashes.

OBTAINING MONEY BY FALSE PRETENSES/GRAND LARCENY WITH THE INTENT TO SELL/ARREST

Reston Parkway

1600

A woman was charged on Friday, October 23 in connection with stealing items from The Home Depot, located at 1651 Reston Parkway, returning the merchandise for store credit, and then selling the store credit cards. Around 8:54 a.m., the woman entered the store with a 42-year-old man; each picked up several plumbing items and allegedly returned the items for store credit. The suspects reportedly sold one of the store credit cards to a 45-year-old man outside the store. Police responded and took the woman into custody; the man could not be located. Anna Simmons, 38, of 1823 Gilson Street in Falls Church, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. She was charged with three counts of obtaining money by false pretenses and three counts of grand larceny with the intent to sell. Charges are pending against the second suspect.

SUSPICIOUS DEATH

Winterthur Lane

\* Police are investigating the death of a 42-year-old woman. On Saturday, October 24, officers were called to an apartment in the 11900 block of Winterthur Lane around 3:40 p.m. to check on the welfare of an adult man. They located Ronald Robertson sitting inside. The body of a woman

was also found inside the apartment. An investigation determined the victim, Karen Deck, of 1599 Inlet Court in Reston, suffered a gunshot wound to the upper body. No charges have been placed at this time for the victim's death; however, Robertson, 45, of 11900 Winterthur Lane #PH3 in Reston, was charged on Wednesday, October 28 with possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Homicide detectives are still investigating.

A man robbed an employee of the Interfuel gas station, located at 7102 Fullerton Road, on Monday, October 26. The man entered the store around 10:54 a.m., picked up a bottle of water and went to the register. He produced a knife, pointed it at the cashier, a 22-year-old woman, and demanded money. The victim gave him an undisclosed amount of cash and the suspect fled in a dark-colored four-door sedan. He was described as white, in his 20s. He was between 5 feet 6 inches and 5 feet 9 inches tall, with a thin build, dark, crew cut hair and hazel eyes. He wore a yellow, multi-colored hoodie. The victim did not require medical attention.

### ABDUCTION/MALICIOUS WOUNDING/ARREST

Furnace Road/Lorton Road

\*Police have charged a 40-year-old man with abduction and malicious wounding as a result of an incident that took place on a path near Furnace Road and Lorton Road on Monday, October 26. Shortly after 11 a.m., a 52-year-old woman was walking on a trail on the grounds behind the former Lorton Prison, now owned by Fairfax County. A man approached her from behind, allegedly forced her to the ground, and then punched her numerous times in the head and face. The victim struggled and eventually fended off her attacker. She sustained non life-threatening injuries. The subsequent investigation led to the identification and arrest of Milan Boda, of 8238 Burning Forest Court in Springfield. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention

Center and charged with abduction and malicious wounding. Detectives would like to hear from anyone who might have witnessed this attack, or from anyone who might have been the victim of a similar attack in the same area. ### FATAL CRASH

#### Fairfax County Parkway/Rolling Road

\*A man and a woman died after a four-vehicle crash on Saturday, October 24 on the Fairfax County Parkway in the Pohick area. An investigation determined that a 2005 Toyota Corolla was headed northbound on the Fairfax County Parkway just prior to Rolling Road around 5 p.m. when the driver lost control and struck a 2004 Honda Pilot also headed north. Both vehicles crossed over the median into the southbound lanes and struck two vehicles headed south—a 1997 Toyota Tacoma and a 2000 BMW 528i. Three vehicles came to rest along the guardrail of the southbound lanes and one vehicle stopped in the median. There were two adults and three young girls inside the Honda Pilot; the adults, Michael K. Merrill, 47, and Jeanne M. Merrill, 42, of 7404 Rocky Ravine Drive in Fairfax Station, were pronounced dead at the scene. The three children, 13 years old, 3 years old and 1 year old, were transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The girls were later released to family members. The driver of the Toyota pickup truck was also transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. No one else involved in the crash required medical attention. Crash Reconstruction detectives continue to investigate. Speed and alcohol do not appear to be factors in the crash, but detectives are investigating the possibility that weather conditions may have played a role. This is the 27th fatal crash in Fairfax County. Last year at this time, there were 19 fatal crashes.
