Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS**COUNTYWIDE****UPDATE: FATAL CRASH**

Fairfax County Parkway/Rolling Road

* Crash Reconstruction detectives are seeking any witnesses to the fatal crash that took two lives on October 24 around 5 p.m. A sign board will be placed on the Fairfax County Parkway in the area of the crash, which will ask witnesses to call Detective Keevill at 703-280-0581. A man and a woman died after a four-vehicle crash on the Fairfax County Parkway just prior to Rolling Road in the Pohick area. An investigation determined that a 2005 Toyota Corolla was headed northbound on the Fairfax County Parkway when the driver lost control and struck a 2004 Honda Pilot also headed north. Both vehicles crossed over the median into the southbound lanes and struck two vehicles headed south, a 1997 Toyota Tacoma and a 2000 BMW 528i. Three vehicles came to rest along the guardrail of the southbound lanes and one vehicle stopped in the median.

There were two adults and three young girls inside the Honda Pilot; the adults, Michael K. Merrill, 47, and Jeanne M. Merrill, 42, of 7404 Rocky Ravine Drive in Fairfax Station, were pronounced dead at the scene. The three children, 13 years old, 3 years old and 1 year old, were transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. The girls were later released to family members. The driver of the Toyota pickup truck was also transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with non life-threatening injuries. No one else involved in the crash required medical attention. This was the 26th fatal crash in Fairfax County. Last year at that time, there were 19 fatal crashes.

SULLY DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 1)**UPDATE: BURGLARY/ARREST**

Moore Road/Clifton Road

* Three suspects have been charged in connection with a series of burglaries targeting gold jewelry held primarily by South Asian families in Fairfax County. U.S. Marshalls working with the police burglary task force spotted a sport utility vehicle with two men and a woman inside who fit the description of suspects in the burglaries. They stopped the vehicle at Moore Road and Clifton Road about 1:30 p.m. Tuesday, November 10, 2009. Subsequent investigation by members of the burglary task force led to nine felony charges against Francisco Gray, 39, of Nassau County, New York; Dagoberto Soto-Ramirez, 27, and his wife, Melinda Soto, 33, both of Queens, New York. Each is charged with four counts of burglary; four counts of grand larceny; and one count of conspiracy to commit burglary. They are being held without bond in the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

Fairfax County police executed a search warrant and searched the sport utility vehicle the three suspects were in when they were stopped. Investigators found a lap top computer, a GPS unit, and a police scanner tuned to Fairfax County police radio channels. The arrests mark the beginning of a new phase of the investigation that is expected to include multiple jurisdictions in

ROBBERY

Lockheed Boulevard

3300

Police responded to a robbery in the 3300 block of Lockheed Boulevard on Thursday, November 12. The victim, a 35-year-old man, was in his car in a parking lot around 8:05 p.m. when another man approached him and asked if he smoked and wanted to buy marijuana. The victim declined and the suspect pointed a small pistol at him and demanded money. The victim removed an undisclosed amount of cash from his wallet and handed it to the suspect. The victim was ordered to drive away and the suspect fled on foot. He was described as black, about 20 years old. He was about 6 feet tall and 160 pounds, with black hair. He wore a black, hooded coat and blue jeans.

POLICE-INVOLVED SHOOTING

Richmond Highway

8800

* A thorough and professional investigation is underway into the officer-involved shooting on November 13, 2009. On Friday, November 13 shortly after 1 p.m., officers were dispatched to the report of a larceny in progress at a business in the 8800 block of Richmond Highway. Prior to their arrival, the suspect fled. An officer spotted the suspect vehicle in the area of Richmond Highway and Shields Avenue. He called for assistance and additional patrol units responded. A traffic stop was attempted, but the suspect did not stop until he encountered heavy traffic. During the subsequent traffic stop the suspect was shot in the upper body by an officer. The suspect vehicle continued a short distance until it struck another motorist's vehicle near Richmond Highway and Fort Hunt Road. The driver of that vehicle did not require medical transport. Officers immediately began CPR on the suspect while waiting for rescue to arrive.

The suspect was transported to Inova Mount Vernon Hospital and pronounced dead a short time later. He has been identified as David Alan Masters, 52, of 1536 Jefferson Davis Highway in Fredericksburg, Virginia. Crime scene technicians responded to process the scene, along with detectives from homicide and internal affairs.

An investigation of this nature typically requires interviewing large numbers of witnesses, collecting and processing forensic evidence, and conducting lab tests and this case is no exception. Preliminary results, however, indicate no gun was found inside Master's car. All three of the primary officers involved in this incident have been interviewed as part of the criminal investigation.

Two officers spoke to investigators on Friday and the third spoke to investigators on Tuesday. Two officers have returned to normal duties. The third officer will be on restricted or administrative duties when he returns to work next week. No further release of information about

this incident is anticipated until after completion of the criminal and internal investigations. CREDIT CARD FRAUD/IDENTITY THEFT/CREDIT CARD FORGERY/CONSPIRING TO COMMIT CREDIT CARD FRAUD/ARREST

Leesburg Pike

7500

* A woman was charged in connection with credit card theft and fraud on Tuesday, October 27. On Saturday, September 5, police responded to a Whole Foods grocery store, located at 7511 Leesburg Pike, for a larceny report. The victim, a 51-year-old woman, was shopping inside the store between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. when she noticed her wallet was missing. An investigation revealed that a ruse was employed to distract the victim. The suspect, a young female dressed in shorts and flip flops, approached her in one of the shopping aisles and asked if she could assist in selecting a specific type of food item for her mother. When the victim put her purse down to search for the item, a second suspect allegedly took her wallet. The victim located the food item and passed it to the first suspect, who expressed her appreciation and walked away. The suspect reportedly used the victim's credit cards to make fraudulent purchases at a nearby mall.

An officer spent nearly two months investigating the case and on October 27, obtained 26 warrants on three suspects. Nakiara Ridby, 23, of 1623 West Lexington Street in Baltimore, MD, was arrested on Thursday, November 5 and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. She was charged with one count each of credit card fraud and identity theft, three counts of conspiring to commit credit card fraud and three counts of credit card forgery. Ticia Wright, 22, is being held in the Baltimore County Detention Center and Landrie Miller, 24, is being held in the Anne Arundel County Detention Facility. Fairfax County Police do not believe this an isolated incident and that other similar cases have occurred around the region. As holiday shopping increases, police encourage everyone to be aware of these types of potential scams.

ROBBERY

Gallows Road

2700

A 57-year-old man was robbed on Friday, November 13. The victim was walking in the 2700 block of Gallows Road from a metro station around 10:39 p.m. Two teenaged boys approached him and demanded money. They took the victim's wallet and fled on foot on Prosperity Avenue. They were described as black, between 16 and 18 years old. They were between 5 feet 7 and 5 feet 10 inches tall and between 140 to 170 pounds. One suspect wore a green shirt, jeans and a green or blue hat. The victim was not injured.

DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY/VEHICLE TAMPERING/ARREST

Tysons Landing Court

Two 14-year-olds were charged with allegedly smashing windows from seven cars parked in the 1900 block of Tysons Landing Court and the area of Holly Ridge Drive and Kennedy Drive on Sunday, November 15. Police responded to the area around 9:48 p.m. and located the two boys running from a 1991 Ford Econoline van. They stopped the suspects and an investigation determined that between 9 p.m. and about 9:30 p.m., they had broken windows on the van in addition to smashing windows on a 1993 Ford RV camper, a 1979 Mercedes-Benz sedan, a 1993 Buick sedan, a 1997 Chevrolet Monte Carlo, a 1996 Saturn, and a 1995 Ford van. They were released to their parents and petitions for destruction of property will be obtained.

Police charged a man with grand larceny after responding to a report of two men breaking into a car in the 3100 block of South Manchester Street on Friday, November 13 around 3:39 a.m. When officers arrived, they observed two men running from the area and stopped one of them. An investigation determined he had allegedly stolen parts from a 2005 Acura RSX. Officers arrested Dante Nizama Maldonado, 24, of 2701 First Street South in Arlington, and transported him to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with grand larceny.

FELONY ELUDING THE POLICE/RESISTING ARREST/DRIVING WHILE INTOXICATED/NO VALID DRIVER'S LICENSE/REFUSAL TO TAKE A BLOOD-ALCOHOL BREATH TEST/FORGERY OF A PUBLIC DOCUMENT/IDENTITY FRAUD/ARREST

Little River Turnpike/Southland Avenue

A man was arrested after a brief traffic pursuit on Sunday, November 15. An officer on patrol attempted to stop a 1995 Subaru on traffic charges around 2:35 a.m. in the area of Little River Turnpike and Logsdon Drive. The driver of the vehicle pulled over near Old Columbia Pike but as the officer approached, the driver allegedly sped off. A traffic pursuit began and ended near Southland Avenue when the suspect reportedly fled on foot from his car. The officer gave chase, caught up with the suspect and the two struggled for several minutes. Officers were able to take Juan Ramos-Gonzales, 21, of 3544 Coker Place, into custody. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with felony eluding the police, resisting arrest, driving while intoxicated, no valid driver's license, and refusal to take a blood-alcohol breath test. He was additionally charged with forgery of a public document and identity fraud for providing false information to law enforcement. The victim and officer received minor injuries, but both declined medical treatment.

ROBBERY

Little River Turnpike

6100

Police responded to a robbery in the 6100 block of Little River Turnpike on Sunday, November 15. An investigation determined around 5:55 p.m., two 15-year-old boys were walking in the area when they noticed two teenaged boys following them. The victim and his friend walked into a parking garage in attempt to elude the other boys. They were confronted by the suspects who announced a robbery; one suspect implied a weapon and the other displayed a knife. One of the victims handed over his cell phone and both suspects fled the scene. They were described as black, about 17 years old. They were about 5 feet 10 inches tall and 160 pounds, with black, braided, medium-length hair. One wore a black hoodie and black pants and the other wore a red and white top, skinny jeans and a backpack. Neither victim required medical attention.

BIAS INCIDENT

Little River Turnpike

A man walked out to his mailbox on Monday, November 16 and found papers containing racially biased information wedged between the mailbox and the flag of the mailbox. An investigation determined that the papers were placed there between noon and 6:10 p.m. that day. The Fairfax County Police Department recognizes the potential harm that bias crimes and incidents can have in a community, and strongly encourages people to report them. All bias crimes and incidents are investigated thoroughly.

Police apprehended a man for burglarizing an Alcoholic Beverage Control store, located at 11160A South Lakes Drive, on Monday, November 16. Officers responded to a burglar alarm around 3:20 a.m. and discovered the business had been broken into. The police helicopter responded and located the suspect attempting to flee in a canoe. After he reached the shore, officers located him hiding near Turtle Pond Drive and Purple Beech Drive. Andrew Wren, 20, of 2053 Eakins Court in Reston, was arrested and transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. He was charged with burglary, possession of burglarious tools and grand larceny.

Flanders Street

5900

* Police charged four teenaged boys with robbery and mob assault after investigating a series of incidents that occurred on November 11 and 12. High school boys were victimized in two of the incidents. In one on November 12 around 3 p.m., thieves knocked a 14-year-old to the ground and stole his insulin pump in the 5900 block of Flanders Street. The victim suffered non life-

threatening injuries after three suspects allegedly assaulted him, rifled through his pockets and stole the medical device.

Other incidents, on November 11, included a 17-year-old who was struck in the head, knocked to the ground and punched by a group of teenagers while walking to a friend's home around 3:45 p.m. near the intersection of Lynbrook and Augusta Drive. Another involved a 25-year-old Springfield resident, who was walking on Essex Avenue toward Clearbook Drive around 6 p.m. when he was approached by a group of teens who surrounded and grabbed him. Suspects allegedly ordered the victim to give them his belongings. The victim complied, was not injured and the suspects fled. Following an extensive investigation involving Franconia patrol officers, detectives and school resource officers, police charged a 15-year-old, a 16-year-old and a 17-year-old each with two counts of robbery and mob assault and one 16-year-old with one count of robbery and mob assault on Tuesday, November 17.

DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY/BIAS CRIME

Beverly Street

Police responded to a report of graffiti in the 7300 block of Beverly Street on Tuesday, November 17. An investigation determined that some time between Friday, November 13 and Sunday, November 15, racially biased symbols were spray painted on a light post, a mailbox and a small sign. Three men attempted to rob another man on Saturday, November 14. The 39-year-old victim was driving through an apartment complex in the 7200 block of Commerce Street around 2:30 a.m. The three men approached him; one of them displayed a knife, approached the driver's window and demanded he exit the vehicle; the other suspect stood behind the car. The victim quickly drove away and called police.

ROBBERY

Amelia Street

5900

* Fairfax County Police are seeking the public's help in identifying numerous suspects in a series of robberies that took place within a mile of each other around 7 p.m. on Monday, November 16. In the first case, four men wearing masks attempted to rob four men, ages 25, 29, 31 and 41, who were talking outside a home in the 5900 block of Amelia Street. They approached the victims, one brandishing a handgun, and demanded money. Two victims struggled with two of the suspects; one victim suffered a gunshot wound to the head and the other victim was injured, but not shot. The suspects fled toward Floyd Avenue. The shot victim was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital and the other victim was transported to Inova Healthplex Franconia-Springfield, both with non life-threatening injuries. The other two victims fled and were not injured.

Moments later, two additional robberies were reported in the 7000 block of Rhoden Court. In one case, two men, 24 and 25, relinquished their wallets to three suspects, one of whom brandished a gun and demanded money. In the other, a 39-year-old woman was exiting her car when a man walked up, pointed a gun at her and demanded her purse. He grabbed it and fled in a vehicle waiting nearby. The suspects in the Rhoden Court cases were described as black, between 19 and 25 years old. They were about 5 feet 10 inches tall and 165 pounds, with brown eyes and black hair. One had an afro hair style and two had short, curly hair. He was charged with use of a communication device to facilitate a sex act with a minor and attempted indecent liberties with a minor.
