**Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS****UPDATE: HOMICIDE**

Kerrybrooke Drive

4500

\* The Fairfax County Commonwealth's Attorney determined the homicide that occurred on Monday, January 19 to be a justifiable homicide. An investigation determined that Kyle Pforr was in the 4500 block of Kerrybrooke Drive around 11:37 p.m. and attempted to rob another man. The man, 20, from the Rose Hill area, stabbed Pforr in self-defense.

**PEDESTRIAN SAFETY CAMPAIGN**

\*Beginning Monday, March 23, police officers are conducting increased enforcement of pedestrian safety laws at locations across Fairfax County. Enhanced enforcement coincides with the 2009 regional StreetSmart campaign, an annual public education and awareness effort that targets pedestrian and bicycle safety and begins this week. A 58-year-old Springfield woman, attempting to cross Old Keene Mill Road around 8 p.m. Saturday, March 21, was the third pedestrian fatality in Fairfax County in 2009. Attempting to encourage safe walking and bicycling, officers will issue warnings and citations for the following infractions:

- Failure to yield right of way to pedestrians in crosswalks
- Improper turns into crosswalks
- Failure to obey "No turn on red" while pedestrians are present
- Running red lights and stop signs
- Failure to obey pedestrian control signals

Highlights of the Fairfax campaign include targeting crosswalk/trail intersections in the Reston area. With over 55 miles of pathways, enjoyed by joggers, bikers and walkers each day, trail safety is a priority for police. Statistical crash analysis from 2007-2008 indicates that there were 24 bicycle and pedestrian crashes in the Reston Police District. Of those, 16 were attributed to the cyclist or pedestrian (10 involved a bicycle, six involved a pedestrian), rather than a motor vehicle. The highest concentration of crashes occurred along Reston Parkway between Sunrise Valley Drive and Wiehle Avenue, on Centreville Road between Coppermine Drive and Parcher Avenue and on Parcher Avenue. ## Beacon Hill area

\* Two men have been charged and a third man is wanted for alleged involvement in a series of burglaries. Fairfax County Crime Solvers is asking for the public's assistance in locating that man. Since December 2008, investigators received 12 burglary reports from residents in and around the Bucknell Manor neighborhood in the Beacon Hill area. Investigations into these burglaries led to several suspects. On Friday, March 13, Reginald Carter, 49, of 6801 Derrell Court in Alexandria, was arrested and charged with burglary, grand larceny, possession of cocaine and driving on a revoked license. These charges stem from a burglary on Thursday, March 12 in the 6800 block of Kenyan Drive.

On Tuesday, March 17, Thomas Monroe, 40, of 2241 Sweetbriar Drive in Alexandria, was arrested and charged with three counts of burglary, two counts of larceny with the intent to sell and three counts of grand larceny. These charges stem from three burglaries on Tuesday, December 23, 2008; Wednesday, December 24, 2008; and Tuesday, March 17. Further charges are possible. Warrants are outstanding on Michael Carter, 44, also of 6801 Derrell Court in Alexandria. He is currently wanted on five counts of burglary, three counts of grand larceny and one count of larceny with intent to sell. These charges stem from the following burglaries:

December 23, 2008 – 6700 block of Oak Drive  
December 25, 2008 – 2600 block of Beacon Hill Road  
February 23 – 2200 block of Roanoke Drive  
March 10 – 2600 block of Beacon Hill Road  
March 12 – 6800 block of Kenyon Drive

Michael Carter is black, 5 feet 11 inches tall and weighs about 170 pounds. He is known to frequent the Beacon Hill area and may be soliciting lawn and tree work at homes in the area. Investigators have determined that in four of the reported burglaries, the suspects had previously done lawn and tree maintenance at the homes. Detectives would like to speak with anyone who may have been the victim of a burglary in that area and not yet reported the incident. Three boys were apprehended after they allegedly entered railroad property unlawfully. On Sunday, March 21 at 4:55 p.m., a railroad engineer observed the suspects at 9920 Richmond Highway and called police. The suspects were located and taken into custody after a short foot chase. The three suspects ages 12, 14 and 16, from Lorton, were returned to their homes and charged with unlawful entry.

ABDUCTION/ARREST

Moon Place

\*A 22-year-old Alexandria-area woman called police to report she had just escaped from her home where she was being held against her will by an ex-boyfriend. On Sunday, March 22, just after 11 a.m. police responded to the 6300 block of Moon Place. The victim reported the suspect had entered her home through a broken window and held a kitchen knife to her throat. The victim attempted to escape but the suspect stopped and assaulted her. The victim later escaped and was chased by the suspect who pointed a gun at her. The victim was not injured. Police observed the suspect's vehicle leaving the scene and stopped him. Ryan T. Allen, 21, of Fort Washington, Maryland was taken into custody and a BB gun was located inside the vehicle. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where he was charged with burglary, abduction, assault and brandishing a firearm.

Creekside Court

A 64-year-old Front Royal man suffered serious injuries when a stump removal machine he was using lurched forward causing him to get caught underneath. On Sunday, March 22, at 1 p.m. police were called to the 1400 block of Creekside Court for a report of a construction accident. The victim was contracted to remove several stumps and was operating the grinding machine by remote control. The victim had finished the job when the machine unexpectedly lurched forward in his direction drawing him into the blades. The homeowner witnessed the accident and quickly pulled the victim out from underneath the machine. The victim was taken to Inova Fairfax Hospital where he underwent surgery for an amputated hand, and injuries to his leg and groin. The victim's injuries were not life threatening and upon arrival at the hospital he was reported to have been in stable condition.

The female suspect is described as white, in her mid 30s. She was about 5 feet 3 inches tall and 140 pounds, with black, long, wavy hair and brown eyes. She wore jeans and a black jacket. The man was described as Hispanic, in his mid 40s. He was about 5 feet tall and 240 pounds, with black, straight, short hair and brown eyes. He wore black pants and a dark sweater.

Two men confronted the victim while he walked through an apartment courtyard. One man attacked the victim from behind. The second man punched the victim in the face and removed his wallet. Both suspects fled the area on foot. The victim did not require any medical attention. ### BANK ROBBERY

Reston District

\* Fairfax County Robbery Detectives are asking for the public's help in identifying a serial bank robber. They believe this suspect is involved in several robberies that have occurred since November 2008, most of which took place in Reston. The most recent robbery occurred on Monday, March 23 around 9:44 a.m. in the Fair Oaks Police District. An employee of the United Bank, located at 13060 Fair Lakes Boulevard, was working behind the counter when a man armed with a gun entered the bank, jumped the counter and demanded money. The suspect locked the bank employees inside a vault, took an undisclosed amount of cash and fled on foot. The victim, a 35-year-old Falls Church man, was not injured. The suspect was described as black, about 30 years old. He was approximately 5 feet 5 inches to 5 feet 6 inches tall and 180 pounds. He wore a dark-colored hoodie, a mask, jeans and tennis shoes.

An officer stopped a vehicle for traffic charges on Saturday, March 21 around 1:06 a.m. and detected the odor of alcohol and marijuana. An investigation determined that the driver was apparently intoxicated and a search of the vehicle uncovered marijuana and drug paraphernalia. \*A pizza delivery man was robbed after he made a delivery in the 7800 block of Lewis Chapel Road on Saturday, March 14. Around 9:15 p.m., the victim, a 39-year-old Oxon Hill, Maryland man, returned to his car when a teenage boy approached, punched him and demanded money. A brief struggle occurred and the suspect pulled out a gun. He pointed it at the victim, who relinquished an undisclosed amount of cash; the suspect fled on foot. A few hours later, officers stopped a boy who matched the suspect's description. An investigation determined the 16-year-old Woodbridge boy was involved and petitions for robbery were later obtained.

\*Police charged Elmer Midence-Merlo with felony murder on Friday, March 20. Midence-Merlo, 38, of 7427 Bath Street, Springfield was charged after officials responded to a 9-1-1 call around 1:50 p.m. for a report of an infant in distress. The 8-month-old boy, Albert Midence, was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital with life-threatening injuries and was pronounced dead Wednesday, March 18. Midence-Merlo remains in the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

SEXUAL ASSAULT/ARREST

\*On Friday, March 20, police were contacted to investigate an alleged sexual assault that occurred sometime between Sunday, February 1 and Saturday, February 14. The victim, a female student at Gunston Elementary School was reportedly touched inappropriately by an adult man in her home. The suspect was providing tutoring lessons to the student when the reported assault took place. The victim did not require medical treatment. The suspect, Rodney Bower, 54, of 2429 Temple Court in Alexandria, is a teacher at Gunston Elementary School. He turned himself in to detectives on Monday, March 23. He was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with aggravated sexual battery. The investigation is ongoing.

### PEDESTRIAN FATALITY

\* Shortly after 8 p.m. on Saturday, March 21, a pedestrian was struck near the intersection of Old Keene Mill Road and Millwood Drive. The pedestrian, a 58-year-old, Springfield woman, was attempting to cross the westbound lanes of Old Keene Mill Road. A 2007 Nissan Murano, driven by a 56-year-old Springfield man, was traveling westbound on Old Keene Mill Road. The initial investigation indicated that the pedestrian stepped in front of the Nissan and was hit. The pedestrian was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital and was pronounced dead a short time later. She has been identified as Catherine W. Rogers, 58, of 6383 English Ivy Way in Springfield. The driver of the Nissan was also transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital in non life-threatening condition. Neither speed nor alcohol appear to be factors in the crash. This is the eighth fatal crash in Fairfax County this year; the third involving a pedestrian. Pedestrian safety is a high priority of the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors.
