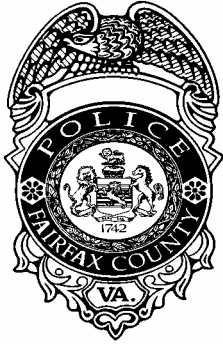

Section I: MAJOR INCIDENTS

COUNTYWIDE

FAIRFAX COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT RE-ACCREDITED

* The Fairfax County Police Department has undergone a rigorous assessment and earned the certificate of re-accreditation by the Virginia Law Enforcement Professional Standards Commission (VLEPSC). The Fairfax County Police Department is the first law enforcement agency in the Commonwealth of Virginia to have successfully completed a third assessment process, wherein records, policies and procedures are thoroughly examined by an independent team of sworn law enforcement peers from across the state. Assessors wrote that the Fairfax County Police Department "displays the invaluable characteristics of integrity and commitment to professionalism, from the newest officer through to those in the highest administrative ranks in particular to include Colonel David Rohrer and his command staff. This agency is well prepared to uphold order and fulfill its mission to the utmost. It is certain that the Fairfax County Police Department will do so with "heart" and with the highest degree of compassion. This belief is based upon contacts made with agency members working in the various functions of the Police Department as well as the team's observations of interactions with the citizens of Fairfax County." The comprehensive process involves thorough review of over 185 professional standards for efficient and effective agency operation. The agency was initially accredited in March 1995 and has undergone additional assessments in 2000 and 2005. UPDATE: HOMICIDE

Hummer Road

4100

*Detectives have released a photograph and video of a person and vehicle that may be related to the homicide that occurred on July 24 and they are asking for the public's assistance in identifying them. Officers were called to 4119 Hummer Road around 4:05 p.m. and found Chung A. Auh, 53, of the same address, deceased inside. The person in the photograph and video is thought to be male, wearing light, tan pants and possibly a green shirt. The vehicle is believed to be an Infiniti FX35 or FX45, 2003 to 2008, dark, possibly black. A video captured the vehicle pulling up to the victim's driveway and a person getting out of the passenger side and walking toward the victim's place of business. DON'T LEAVE PETS IN VEHICLES ON A HOT DAY

* As we're experiencing the dog days of summer, Fairfax County's Animal Shelter cautions pet owners not to leave their dogs in vehicles. After just a few minutes on a hot day, the temperature in a stationary vehicle can easily rise to 120 degrees, harming an animal if left inside. These

temperatures can cause heat stroke and even death among pets left in cars exposed to the heat. "Pets in a car have no way to escape the heat," says Animal Shelter Director Dr. Karen Diviney. "Even with the window cracked open, temperatures can soar leaving pets vulnerable and in a life-threatening situation." Even running a quick errand into the grocery or a convenience store could pose a risk to pets. The Fairfax County Animal Shelter asks residents to leave pets at home during hot summer months. People who leave a pet in a car on a hot day could be prosecuted for a class 1 misdemeanor for animal cruelty under the Code of Virginia §3.1-796.122.

BURGLARY

Reston, Fair Oaks, Sully and McLean Police Districts

* Fairfax County Police detectives have discovered that 16 out of 21 recent burglaries appear to be linked. The burglaries have occurred primarily in the western portion of the county and investigators believe they began in January, with the most recent occurring on Tuesday, July 28. Detectives believe thieves may be targeting neighborhoods with a significant population of Middle Eastern and Asian residents. Jewelry, electronics and passports are the most commonly stolen items. Nearly all of the burglaries occurred during daytime hours while the victims were away. In several burglaries, the victims had religious ornaments displayed outside or around their homes. Police detectives believe these decorations may be a contributing factor in the selection of homes to burglarize. Here is a breakdown of reported burglaries by police district:

ROBBERY

Pelham Place

11100

A 15-year-old boy was robbed on Thursday, August 6. The victim was outside a home in the 11100 block of Pelham Place around 2:59 a.m. when someone struck him in the head with a glass object. He fell to the ground and two suspects took his cellular phone and wallet and fled. A family member drove the victim to Inova Emergency Care Center where he was treated for non life-threatening injuries. There is no suspect information available at this time.

RECKLESS ENDANGERMENT OF A CHILD/ASSAULT ON A FAMILY MEMBER/ARREST

Strasburg Drive/Saint Germain Drive

Police charged a man for assaulting a woman and endangering two children, a 5-year-old boy and a month-old boy, on Sunday, August 9. An investigation determined that the man, 36-year-old woman and the two children were in a car, driving near the area of Strasburg Drive and Saint Germain Drive around 10:25 a.m. The man stopped the car on the road, exited the vehicle and allegedly pulled the older boy out of the car. Next, he reportedly grabbed the woman and tried to force her out of the car as well. The woman started screaming and the suspect got back into the car and reportedly drove away, leaving the child in the street. The suspect stopped again and allegedly threw a child safety seat containing the baby out of the car; he reportedly proceeded to punch the woman, pull her out of the car and drove off. The three victims were transported to Inova Fair Oaks Hospital with minor injuries. The suspect was arrested on Sunday, August 9. Jose Dominquez, 29, of no fixed address, was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with assault on a family member and two counts of reckless endangerment of a child.

The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors recognizes that domestic violence is a serious issue in our community. Services for victims of domestic violence are offered through the Domestic Abuse and Sexual Assault Programs, which are part of the Office for Women. These programs provide victims of sexual and domestic violence with safe shelter, counseling, support groups, and 24-hour hotlines through the Fairfax Women's Shelter and the Victim Assistance Network. MOUNT VERNON DISTRICT STATION (DISTRICT 2)**ASSAULT ON A POLICE OFFICER**

Lockheed Boulevard

3700

An officer was patrolling through Huntley Meadows Park, located at 3701 Lockheed Boulevard, around 4:28 a.m. on Saturday, August 8 and observed a silver, four-door Honda Civic parked in the parking lot. He went to investigate and noticed a man and woman inside the car. As the officer attempted to exit his vehicle, the man jumped into the driver's seat of the Honda, started the car and struck the officer's vehicle. The suspect then reversed his car into the police car, striking it a second time. The officer shouted commands at the suspect to stop but the suspect struck the officer's vehicle a third time before fleeing the area. The officer's vehicle was disabled so he could not pursue the suspect. The male and female suspects were described as black. The male was between 18 and 22 years old, about 135 pounds. He had short, black hair, brown eyes and wore a white tank top. The female was about 20 to 25 years old and 170 pounds. She had short, red hair and brown eyes.

FATAL CRASH

Sherwood Hall Lane/Evening Lane

* A 27-year-old man died in a single-vehicle crash on Sunday, August 9. Police were called to the area of Sherwood Hall Lane and Evening Lane around 7:30 a.m. They located a 2003 Ford Explorer and its sole occupant on the side of the road. An investigation determined the driver, Travis L. Harris, was driving west on Sherwood Hall Lane when he drifted toward the shoulder and jumped the curb. His SUV left the road and struck a tree. Harris was transported to Inova Mount Vernon Hospital; he died a short time later. Alcohol was not a factor in the crash.

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

Lockheed Boulevard

3300

Two men attempted to rob a 56-year-old man on Wednesday, August 12. The victim was walking in the 3300 block of Lockheed Boulevard around 12:15 a.m. when two men approached him and demanded money. The victim refused and the suspects assaulted the victim, knocked him to the ground and fled. They were described as black, in their mid-20s. They were between 5 feet 6 inches and 5 feet 7 inches tall and 145 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes. One suspect had long hair and the other had short hair. They both wore white T-shirts and jeans. The victim declined medical attention.

* Silvestre Lara-Bulana, 29, of no fixed address, was arrested on Monday, August 10 for allegedly burglarizing an apartment in the 2000 block of Peach Orchard Drive on Monday,

August 3. Police were called around 3:36 a.m. and determined three 25-year-old women and a 14-year-old girl were asleep inside the apartment. The 14-year-old, who was asleep on the couch, awoke to a man standing above her holding her arms down. The victim screamed and the suspect let go. He fled out the front door and the victim ran to a roommate for help. She did not require medical attention. Lara-Bulana was transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center and charged with burglary and abduction.

ROBBERY

Patterson Road

7400

Police responded to a robbery in the 7400 block of Patterson Road on Monday, August 10. An investigation determined around 2:30 a.m., a 21-year-old man was walking in the area when three men struck up a conversation with him. Moments later, they began to assault the victim, took his backpack and fled on foot. The victim attempted to chase the suspects to no avail. Two of the suspects were described as black. They were between 5 feet 10 inches and 5 feet 11 inches tall and 160 pounds. One of them had long dreadlocks and wore a blue T-shirt and white shorts. The other had short, black hair and a tattoo on his left arm. He wore long shorts and a white sleeveless T-shirt. The third suspect was described as Hispanic. He was about 5 feet 5 inches tall, 140 pounds and wore a white T-shirt and dark skull cap. The victim declined medical attention.

Pinecrest Court

* Jose Luis Cruz has been charged with the murder of his estranged wife, 57-year-old, Matilde A. Cruz. On Thursday, December 20, 2007, police were called to the 6500 block of Pinecrest Court and found the woman dead in her car shortly after 3 p.m. She apparently suffered stab wounds to the upper body. On September 19, 2008, Jose Luis Cruz was apprehended by Mexican authorities with the assistance of U.S. Marshals in Cholula, Puebla, Mexico. Having completed the extradition process, Cruz was transported to Fairfax County and incarcerated in the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center on August 6.

ROBBERY

Wadsworth Court

4800

A 20-year-old man was robbed of his cellular phone on Thursday, August 6 around midnight. The victim was outside in the 4800 block of Wadsworth Court when two men approached and asked to borrow his phone. The victim complied while one of the men pushed him to the ground. Both suspects fled into a tan Honda Accord sitting nearby. The suspects were described as black. One was between 20 and 30 years old, about 6 feet 3 inches tall and 150 pounds, with black hair and brown eyes. He had on a black hat, white shirt and white pajama pants. The other suspect was between 25 and 35 years old, about 5 feet 10 inches tall and 200 pounds. He had medium-length black hair pulled into a pony tail and brown eyes. He wore a black hat, black shirt and jeans. He had a tattoo on both upper arms.

CHILD NEGLECT/CONTRIBUTING TO THE DELINQUENCY OF A MINOR/ARREST

Lee Highway

Police charged a man and woman on Saturday, August 8 for allegedly neglecting and leaving their child unattended. The previous day around 4:40 p.m., officers were called to an apartment in the 9400 block of Lee Highway for a child reportedly left unsupervised inside an apartment. Upon arrival, officers located an 8-month-old girl alone inside along with a caged dog. The child's father was located on the lobby level of the building. An investigation determined that he had been there for over an hour. While police were on scene, the child's mother returned home. The child was transported to Inova Fairfax Hospital to be checked out and Animal Control responded to the apartment and transported the dog to the animal shelter. On August 8, Seth Comstock, 26, of the 9400 block of Lee Highway, was charged with child negelect and Stefanie Hunter, 20, of the same address, was charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor. They were both transported to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center.

A 19-year-old woman was accosted by a coworker while working on Saturday, August 1. The victim reported the incident on Saturday, August 8 and an investigation determined the victim was working in the DSW Warehouse store, located at 6444 Loisdale Road, around 8:30 p.m. when the suspect allegedly grabbed her from behind, picked her up and carried her into a closet. CARNAL KNOWLEDGE OF A CHILD BETWEEN 13 AND 15 YEARS OLD/USE OF A COMMUNICATION DEVICE TO SOLICIT A MINOR/ARREST

* A man was arrested after he allegedly picked up a 14-year-old girl he met online and had sex with her. The police investigation determined the victim and 23-year-old man met online. After conversing online for about a week, they agreed to meet in person. On Tuesday, July 28, around 2 a.m., the suspect allegedly picked her up from her home in Montgomery County, Maryland, and drove her to his residence in Springfield, Virginia, where they reportedly engaged in sexual acts. The victim's mother woke up to find her daughter missing and phoned local police to report it. Several hours later, the suspect allegedly returned the victim to her home. Montgomery County Police notified the Fairfax County Police Department and Fairfax County detectives took over the investigation. On Wednesday, August 5, Stephann Kamau, of 8362 Luce Court, was arrested and charged with carnal knowledge of a child between 13 and 15 years old and use of a communication device to solicit a minor. Kamau was additionally charged with failure to appear in court for an unrelated offense. Detectives ask anyone who may have had similar contact with Kamau to report it to the police.
